

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WEDNESDAY, MAY 9TH, A.D. 1917 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Lambert and Garland.
Absent, Commissioner Uhr.

At this meeting of the Commissioners came on to be considered the returns of a regular election for Municipal officers held on the 8th day of May, 1917, and the Mayor, having appointed a special committee consisting of all the Commissioners present, with the Mayor as Chairman, to canvass the returns of said election and report thereon; and said Committee having canvassed said returns and made the following report, to-wit:

For complete returns see Record Book of Consolidated Returns of elections held in the city of San Antonio, pages 52 and 53.

And it appearing to the Commissioners that said election was held and conducted and returns and canvass thereof made as provided by law, and the Commissioners having canvassed said returns and said report and having found the same in all respects correct, said report was therefore adopted, and it was ordered and declared that the candidates receiving the highest number of votes for their respective offices as shown by the official canvass of returns made this day by the Commissioners, be and they are declared elected and that certificate of election be issued to each of them as by law provided.
