

AN ORDINANCE 2012-04-05-0246

AUTHORIZING THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF CERTAIN STREETS IN CONNECTION WITH THE 2012 FIESTA SAN ANTONIO CELEBRATION; APPROVING THE LOCATIONS, DATES AND TIMES FOR THE FIESTA CARNIVAL AND OFFICIAL FIESTA EVENTS, AND RELATED REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS; APPROVING THE FIESTA PARADE ROUTES.

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WHEREAS, San Antonio’s annual Fiesta San Antonio Celebration, through the dedicated efforts of many civic-minded persons and nonprofit organizations, has achieved state wide, national, and international recognition as one of the outstanding festival events in our nation; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2008-02-21-0125 of February 21, 2008, set the dates for Fiesta San Antonio for the years 2009 through 2018, designated the Fiesta San Antonio Commission as the planning and coordinating organization for the event, provided for and allocated financial support to Fiesta events, adopted regulations for Fiesta events, and made other provisions in connection with Fiesta; and

WHEREAS, planning is underway for the 2012 Fiesta San Antonio, and it is necessary to approve certain events, close streets to vehicular traffic in connection with certain events, approve the dates, times and locations for events, including the Fiesta Carnival, and declaring the rules, rates, regulations and conditions for staging these events; and also to approve the Fiesta Parade Routes and close streets to vehicular traffic in connection with the Fiesta Parades; and

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. In support of an initiative by the Texas Department of Transportation to inform and protect the interests of the citizens of San Antonio, all Fiesta San Antonio Commission participating member organizations are encouraged to place the slogan “Fiesta Safe, Drive Sober” on cups and other collateral material distributed during the 2012 Fiesta San Antonio. This is the 17th year the Texas Department of Transportation has sponsored this public information campaign highlighting the need to actively promote and provide public notice to celebrate responsibly during Fiesta 2012.

SECTION 2. The following Fiesta events are approved for the dates and times as set forth below. The listed public streets and ways shall be closed to vehicular traffic during the dates and times indicated to facilitate the events and their use of the public property. For the events listed in this section, no carnivals or games are permitted on public right-of-way. Additionally, other than City approved contractors, no use, including but not limited to, amplification and public demonstrations, will be allowed in public right of way in and around the Carnival and Alamodome area. At any time the City’s right-of-ways are closed or partially closed, all Official Fiesta Events are obligated to adhere to the City’s latest barricade standards and specifications.

1. **FIESTA FIESTA AT THE ALAMO (OPENING CEREMONY)**

THURSDAY, APRIL 19, 2012 NOON TO MIDNIGHT

Alamo Street between Commerce Street and Houston Street closed to all traffic.

Blum Street as a total street closure.

East Crockett between Bonham Street and Losoya Street closed to traffic.

THURSDAY, APRIL 19, 2012 5pm to MIDNIGHT

Houston Street between Alamo and 3rd Street closed to all traffic.

Avenue E Street between Houston Street and Third Street closed to all traffic.

2. **SOUTHWEST SCHOOL OF ART AND CRAFT FIESTA ARTS FAIR:**

FRIDAY, APRIL 20, 2012 8:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M. and

SUNDAY, APRIL 22, 2012 5:00 P.M. TO 10:00 P.M.

Augusta between Navarro and Giraud closed to through traffic.

Augusta between Giraud and Convent open to **one-way** traffic **southbound** to allow parking on the east side of Augusta.

Police officers stationed at all times at Augusta & Giraud and at Augusta & Convent.

SATURDAY, APRIL 21, 2012 9:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M. and

SUNDAY, APRIL 22, 2012 10:00 A.M. TO 5:00 P.M.

Augusta between Navarro and Giraud closed to ALL traffic.

Augusta between Giraud and Convent open to **two-way** traffic.

Police officers stationed at all times at Augusta & Navarro and at Augusta & Giraud.

Off-duty officers will be required to direct vehicular and pedestrian traffic, and must be at their posted locations throughout the entire duration of the requested street closures. The daily placement and daily removal of all traffic control devices shall only be done by the certified barricade company, at the expense of the event sponsor. Augusta Street from Convent to Navarro shall be open to two-way traffic during non-event hours.

3. **NIGHT IN OLD SAN ANTONIO:**

Presa St. The following streets will be closed beginning Saturday, April 21, 2012 at 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 29, 2012; South Presa Street from Market Street to Nueva Street. South Presa Street from Nueva St. to Arciniega St will be made a one-way southbound during event hours only (3:30 p.m. until 12:00 midnight- April 24, 2012 through April 27, 2012). Access to Villita Assembly Hall will be maintained for participants in the "Patriotic and Historic Ball" on Saturday evening April 21, 2012.

Alamo St. The following streets will be closed beginning Sunday, April 22, 2012 at 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon on Saturday, April 28, 2012; A total closure of southbound Alamo Street between Villita and Nueva Street. The southbound lanes of Alamo St. between Market and Villita will remain open to thru traffic to access the Hilton Hotel.

The northbound curb lane of Alamo Street next to the median between Villita and Nueva will also be closed for storage trailers.

The northbound lanes of Alamo St. between Market and Cesar Chavez Streets shall be closed to thru traffic April 24, 2012 to April 27, 2012 between the hours of 3:30 p.m. and 12:00 midnight. Access to the Alamo Lot will be allowed at Arciniega at Alamo Street. Parking passes for north curb lane between Nueva Street and Cesar Chavez Street can be obtained from SAPD Traffic.

Nueva St. The following streets will be closed beginning Saturday, April 21, 2012 at 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 29, 2012: the median and west bound lanes of Nueva Street from South Alamo Street to 235 feet west of South Presa Street; The east bound lanes of Nueva St. from Presa St. to Alamo St. shall be closed to thru traffic from April 24, 2012 to April 27, 2012 between the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight. The inside eastbound lane of Nueva will be closed from Presa St. to 107' feet east of Navarro St., Tuesday, April 24, 2012 thru Friday, April 27, 2012 between the hours of 4 p.m. to midnight. The outer eastbound lane of Nueva will be available for vehicular access to the Fairmont Hotel and St. John's Lutheran Church shall remain open.

Market St. VIA will use the south curb lane of Market Street between Alamo and Convention Way to drop off Park-n-Ride riders. VIA will provide their own security for their buses and drop off area.

River Walk Areas: NIOSA is approved to expand the controlled area during event hours only (3:30 p.m. until 10:30 p.m.- April 24, 2012 through April 27, 2012), to include the Bombach walkway in-between the Little Rhein Steakhouse and the Hilton Palacio Hotel leading from S. Alamo street walkway down to the river walk area. NIOSA may also erect two (2) gate locations beginning at 3:30 p.m. until 10:30 p.m. each event night along the south bank of the river walk at (1) the Hilton/Little Rhein sidewalk landing, and (2) at a point approximately fifty (50) feet west of the Arneson River Theater Iron Gate, also on the south bank of the San Antonio river.

4. **FIESTA DE LOS REYES AT MARKET SQUARE:** Beginning at 12:00 p.m. (noon) on Monday, April 16, 2012, the east lane of San Saba (between Dolorosa and Commerce) and west side sidewalk on San Saba will be closed for booth setup; one traffic lane will remain open in middle of San Saba, east side sidewalk shall remain open, and pedestrian access will be maintained in front of closed sidewalk on west side of San Saba (between Dolorosa and Commerce). San Saba Street from Dolorosa to West Commerce Street closed entirely to include sidewalks and the roadway from 11:00 p.m. on April 18, 2012 through 5:00 p.m. on Monday April 30, 2012.

During the closure of San Saba St. between Dolorosa and W. Commerce St. a certified peace officer will be required to man the traffic barricades during the following dates and times:
Thursday, April 19, 2012 from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
Friday, April 20, 2012 to Monday, April 30, 2012 from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m., each day.

NO SIDEWALKS OR TRAFFIC LANES SHALL BE CLOSED AT ANY OTHER PERIOD OTHER THAN THE DATE AND TIME INDICATED BY THIS ORDINANCE.

Fiesta De Los Reyes at Market Square Approved Event Hours of Operation (Reference City Ordinance 2010-12-09-1035):

April 20-27, 2012: 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight
April 28, 2012: 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.
April 29, 2012: 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight

Pecos Street: The area from the "Tour Bus Loading Zone" to the temporary fence erected under IH-35 ramp shall be used for parking *by permit only* as issued by the City of San Antonio Public Works Traffic Engineering Division, for Market Square vehicles relating to the Reyes at Market Square event. A band stage and a large trailer for the speaker system can

be provided, but the semi-tractor rig and other associated non-conforming vehicles must be elsewhere. Parking on City sidewalks and Gateway Plaza and other Plaza pedestrian walkways **WILL NOT BE AUTHORIZED AND STRICTLY ENFORCED BY SAPD AND DOWNTOWN OPERATIONS PARKING ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL.**

Santa Rosa St. Center Median: a fence will be erected to prevent pedestrians from crossing Santa Rosa mid-block between Commerce and Dolorosa.

Approved Vendor Service Vehicle Parking: Commercial vendor's service vehicles with a valid affixed commercial placard and displayed valid parking permit (parking meter bag) issued by the City of San Antonio (Public Works Traffic Engineering) will be authorized to park at the following locations:

On the west bound, south curb lane of W. Commerce between Santa Rosa and San Saba Streets (6 band vehicles or trucks)

On the west bound, south curb lane of W. Commerce between Pecos and Leona Streets (2 trucks). Any item put on the street that is not considered a motor vehicle must be approved by SAPD, Downtown Operations, and Public Works Traffic Engineering. Proper barricading must be afforded any item placed on the street using the TMUTC as a guide.

On the north bound, east curb lane of San Saba just north of Dolorosa (1-trailer)

On the west curb lane of San Saba between Commerce and Houston (1-trailer, 2-vehicles)

On north side of Dolorosa between San Saba and Santa Rosa (1-trailer, 2-trucks)

On north side of Dolorosa from San Saba to Santa Rosa between the hours of 7:00 am to 3:00 pm on weekdays and 7:00 am to 9:00 am weekends.

On the west curb lane of San Saba between Dolorosa and Nueva. (Band vehicles only)

The serving, loading and/or unloading of any parked trailers on Dolorosa Street during event operations will be hereby prohibited and violators will be towed at owner's expense.

The parking on the south side of Dolorosa St. shall be restricted between San Saba and Santa Rosa streets. Strict enforcement will begin at 3:00 p.m. on weekdays and 9:00 a.m. on weekends. **Absolutely no beer trucks or trailers will be permitted to park on the south curb at any time.**

5. **ST. MARY'S OYSTER BAKE:**

The following streets shall be closed on Friday, April 20, 2012 from 3:30 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. and on Saturday, April 21, 2012 from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Marquette Street from 36th Street to Camino Santa Maria

- Overhill Street from 36th Street to Camino Santa Maria
- Camino Santa Maria from Colgate to Wake Forest (westside curb only for VIA bus parking, twelve foot (12') width, from face of curb)
- Overhill, from Hillcrest to 36th Street
- Marquette, from Hillcrest to 36th Street
- Riverdale, from Hillcrest to 36th Street
- Bangor, from Hillcrest to 36th Street
- Globe, from Hillcrest to 36th Street
- Continental, from Hillcrest to 36th Street
- Lark, from Hillcrest to 36th Street

- Brandywine, from Hillcrest to 36th Street
- Belfair from Woodlawn Ave. to Overhill Dr.
- Overhill Drive from Camino Santa Maria St. to Duke Ave.
- Marquette Dr. from Camino Santa Maria St. to Duke Ave.

All traffic control devices will be the responsibility of St. Mary's University.

6. **PILGRIMAGE TO THE ALAMO:** Auditorium Circle and Alamo Plaza from East Houston Street to Crockett Street. Parkway will be restricted or prohibited on Martin Street from Jefferson Street to Navarro Street and Jefferson Street to Commerce Street. The streets will be closed on Monday, April 23, 2012 from 3:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m.

7. **PARADES: BATTLE OF FLOWERS AND FIESTA FLAMBEAU:** Both parades will follow this route: assemble at E. Grayson to Broadway, south on Broadway, east on 3rd Street, south on Alamo Street, west on Commerce, north on Santa Rosa to Martin, disband on Martin.

Broadway from Newell Avenue to Jones Avenue will be closed on Saturday, April 28, 2012 from 11:00 p.m. until Sunday, April 29, 2012 at 2:00 a.m. for bleacher removal.

Broadway from Jones Avenue to 10th Street, one lane on the northbound east side (curb lane) will be closed on Monday, April 16, 2012 from 9:00 a.m. until Thursday, April 26, 2012 at 12:00 midnight.

Broadway from Newell Avenue to Roy Smith Street, two lanes on the southbound west side will be closed on Wednesday, April 25, 2012 from 9:00 a.m. until Saturday, April 28, 2012 at 12:00 midnight.

Forming Area: Access to forming area shall be limited to parade participants, parade organizers, residents and business employees living or working within the formation area and emergency personnel – This includes **both** vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

- Ave A between San Antonio River and Josephine Street

Disbanding Area: Access to the Disbanding area shall be limited to parade participants, parade organizers, residents and business employees living or working within the disbanding area and emergency personnel – This includes **both** vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

Martin between IH-35 and Flores Street
Cameron between IH 35 and Travis Streets
Salinas between Flores and Cameron Streets
San Saba between Houston and Martin Streets
Columbus between Martin and Cameron Streets
Kingsbury between Cameron and Flores Streets
Quincy between Martin and Cameron Streets

Forming and Disbanding Area access restrictions for the Battle of Flowers parade begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at the conclusion of the parade on Friday, April 27, 2012. Access restrictions for the Fiesta Flambeau parade begin at 3:30 p.m. and ends at the conclusion of the parade on Saturday, April 28, 2012.

No parade street chair vendors, chair suppliers or individuals will be allowed to place or store Parade Street Chairs on the City's right of way (City sidewalks) on or before Thursday, April 26, 2012 at 3:00 p.m. A further limitation is placed on Santa Rosa Street between West Commerce and Martin Street (either side). Placement or storage of chairs will not be allowed in this location prior to Friday, April 27, 2012 at 1:00 a.m. The San Antonio Police Department will be enforcing this restriction. Any chairs placed or stored earlier than these specified times will be subject to impoundment. **The City's right of way, including all sidewalks, along Santa Rosa Street between Commerce Street and Martin Street has been designated as a Free Zone for parade viewing. No individuals will be permitted to sell seating in this area.**

In 2010, the City along with the Fiesta Commission established a pilot Tobacco & Alcohol Free Zone (TAF Zone) where alcohol and tobacco were prohibited along the parade route. In 2011 the zones were extended to two locations with 1,820 seats. The TAF Zones have been successful and are recommended again this year. The TAF Zone located at 100 W. Commerce has 393 seats sold by Urban Management Assistants of South Texas, a local non-profit for government employees. The second TAF Zone is located on N. Alamo from Travis to Houston where 1,427 seats are sold by Trinity Baptist Church and the parade organizations (Battle of Flowers Association and Flambeau Association).

On January 19, 2012, the City Council authorized prohibiting smoking within the public right of way, and in any seats within the public right of way or on city property, along the Texas Cavaliers' River Parade, the Fiesta Battle of Flowers Parade, and the Fiesta Flambeau Parade routes, with the exception of leased patio space along the River Parade route. The City has coordinated with the Fiesta Commission on public outreach efforts. In addition, Solid Waste Management Department staff is working with the Fiesta Commission's Fiesta Verde Committee to improve trash collection and recycling efforts along the parade routes.

8. KING WILLIAM FAIR:

A 20-foot fire lane will be maintained on all closed streets. By noon on Thursday, April 26, 2012, "no parking" signs will be installed on those streets to be closed that are north and west of Alamo Street. The following streets will be closed to thru traffic at 7:00 a.m. on Friday, April 27, 2012, until 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 28, 2012.

East Guenther from South Alamo to South Main
King William from East Guenther to South St. Mary's
Madison from East Guenther to South St. Mary's
Washington from Arsenal to Turner
East Johnson from South Main to South Alamo
East Sheridan from the San Antonio River to South Alamo
Beauregard from Washington to South Alamo
Turner from Washington to South Alamo
Pancoast from Washington to Cesar Chavez
Arsenal from South Main Street to Washington

Any item put on the street that is not considered a motor vehicle must be approved by SAPD, Downtown Operations, and Public Works Traffic Engineering. Proper barricading must be afforded any item placed on the street using the TMUTC as a guide.

The following streets will be closed to thru traffic from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon (or until the conclusion of the King William Fair parade) on Saturday, April 28, 2012:

Eagleland from South St. Mary's to East Guenther
East Guenther from Eagleland to South Alamo
Wickes from Eagleland to South Alamo
South Alamo St. from Probandt to Pereida Street
Adams from Eagleland to Barbe

By Friday night, April 27, 2012, "no parking" signs will be installed on those streets south and east of Alamo Street that will have limited parking effective the following day. In addition to the 100 block of Mission Street, which currently prohibits parking on both sides of the street; parking on both sides of the 100 block of Wickes and the 100 block of Adams will be prohibited on Saturday, April 28, 2012. Parking on the following streets will be permitted on the west (river) side of the street on Saturday, April 28, 2012 (meaning that "no parking" signs will be installed on the east (non-river) side of the streets:

East Guenther (subject to the street opening after the parade concludes)
Wickes (after the 100 block)
Mission (after the 100 block)
Cedar (after the 100 block)

Parking on the following streets will be permitted to the south side of the street (facing Brackenridge High School on Eagleland Street) on Saturday, April 28, 2012 (meaning that "no parking" signs will be installed on the north (non-high) school) side of the street:

No carnival rides or games shall be located on Main Ave. or within Main Plaza Park or other public rights of way. Any item put on the street that is not considered a motor vehicle must be approved by SAPD, Downtown Operations, and Public Works Traffic Engineering. Proper barricading must be afforded any item placed on the street using the TMUTC as a guide.

10. FIESTA FUNDAY SUNDAY PARADE: Two lanes of DeZavala Road from the west school driveway at the traffic light to Brandeis Street. The event will be held on the campus of Clark High School, 5150 DeZavala Road. Parade begins at 1:00 p.m. and ends at 1:30 p.m. Sunday, April 22, 2012.

11. 10TH STREET RIVER FEST – SAM HOUSTON VFW POST 76: 10th street from Gate entrance of VFW Post 76 to Avenue B, Thursday, April 26, 2012 thru Sunday, April 29, 2012 from 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. each day. No carnival rides or games shall be located on Ave B or other public right of way.

12. EARTH DAY AT WOODLAWN LAKE: Event will be held at Woodlawn Lake Park on Saturday, April 21, 2012 from 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

13. FIESTA WEBB PARTY: Willow Street from E. Grayson Street to Quitman Street, Friday April 20, 2012 from 12:00 p.m. till Saturday April 21, 2012 1:30 a.m.

14. SAN JOSE MISSION FEST: San Jose Drive between E. Pyron and Roosevelt Street, Sunday April 29, 2012, 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

SECTION 3. The 2012 Carnival shall conform to the following schedule and requirements. The Fiesta Commission must enforce these schedules and requirements through its contract for the carnival concession. A copy of the approved Carnival layout is attached hereto and incorporated herein as **Attachment 1**.

2. The plan for placement of carnival booths, stands, and carnival rides must be received by the Downtown Operations Department by Monday, April 2, 2012. The plan must have approval of the Police Department. The Police shall be provided Police Command Posts at the carnival location as requested by the Police Department and include utility services as necessary.
3. The Carnival Concessionaire shall provide sight triangles at street intersections that are not closed to traffic according to City standards.
4. The Carnival Concessionaire shall maintain chemical toilets with large banners above the area and security lighting. The location and number of toilets shall be as required by the Director of Health. All chemical toilets shall be serviced a minimum of every four hours during the hours that the carnival is open to the public and once after the carnival closes. If a chemical toilet overflows, the area shall be cleaned immediately.
5. The Carnival Concessionaire shall use a barricade company approved by the City to provide the traffic control devices needed to properly barricade the carnival both during operating and non-operating hours. The Carnival Concessionaire must adhere to the traffic notes in the Annual Fiesta Ordinance plus the traffic notes and details on the existing traffic control plan.
6. The Carnival Concessionaire shall provide and pay for supplementary twenty-four (24) hour security (City of San Antonio Police Officers) as determined necessary by the City.
7. The Carnival Concessionaire shall provide and pay for one (1) on call fire inspector for the carnival site from one (1) hour prior to the carnival beginning to carnival closing, each day from April 18, 2012 to April 29, 2012. The fire inspector shall be paid at the rate of time consistent with the Fire Collective Bargaining Agreement. All such City documented inspection costs shall be paid in full to the City of San Antonio no later than seven (7) days after receipt of the final invoices from the Fire Department.
8. The Carnival Concessionaire agrees to comply with all other conditions set by the City Manager’s Office necessary to insure the public health, safety and welfare.
9. All sidewalks located next to or in the carnival area must remain open to full width during non-carnival operating hours. No encroaching of any sort will be allowed during non-carnival operating hours.

10. The Carnival Concessionaire agrees to comply with all City, State and Federal laws, statutes and ordinances for the operation of this event. This includes, but is not limited to, the application and payment of all licenses and permits required for the inspection and operation of rides, equipment, food, drink, and novelty booths.
11. Beverage Container Regulations:
 - (a) *Prohibited.* It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly possess a beverage in the area of the Fiesta Carnival, Market Square and La Villita unless such beverage is in a plastic or paper container. For purposes of this section, the contents of the container, other than paper or plastic, shall be presumed to be the beverage its' label indicates. No ice chests will be allowed in any of the above mentioned areas.
 - (b) *Exceptions.* The provisions of this section shall not apply to restaurants or other establishments located in the area of the Fiesta Carnival, Market Square and La Villita where beverages in bottles, cans or glasses are served in the regular course of business; however, possession of beverages in such containers shall be restricted to the immediate area of the establishment's leased premises.
 - (c) *Penalty.* Any person violating the terms of this section shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

SECTION 4. The parade route, as **Attachment 2**, for the 2012 Fiesta Parades: the Battle of Flowers, and the Fiesta Flambeau, scheduled for Friday, April 27, 2012 and Saturday, April 28, 2012 is hereby approved. The public streets and right-of-ways indicated on the 2012 Fiesta Parade Route shall be closed to vehicular traffic during the aforementioned dates, at times specified by the Chief of Police, to facilitate the event and its use of the public property. A copy of the approved parade food and beverage booth locations is hereby approved in **Attachment 3**.

SECTION 5. Bleacher placement along the parade route, in accordance with the diagram is attached hereto as **Attachment 4** and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes, is hereby approved. The agreement with the U.S. General Services Administration permitting placement of bleachers along the west side of the Federal Building on Alamo Plaza without blocking the letter collection boxes and the entrance to the ramp on the west side of the Federal Building is approved. The agreement is attached hereto as **Attachment 5** and incorporated by reference herein for all purposes.

SECTION 6. The Fiesta San Antonio Commission agrees to place chemical toilets at designated locations for parade days of April 27 and 28, 2012, lists attached hereto as **Attachment 6**.

SECTION 7. TXDOT Road Closure. The City Manager, or her designee, or the Director of the Downtown Operations Department or his designee, is authorized to execute a five year agreement for the temporary closure of State Right of Way with TXDOT to allow for the Fiesta parades attached hereto as **Attachment 7**.

SECTION 8. Sunken Garden Theater Fiesta 2012 Rental Rates. The San Antonio Zulu Association is hereby granted the use of the Sunken Garden Theater as an official Fiesta event on the following dates and the listed rental rates. This organization shall also be required to use the SAWS parking garage and shall reimburse the City for the actual costs for administration, insurance, security and site cleanup for each event date. The organization shall also comply with the attendance

limits of not more than 6,000 persons at any one time and sound level limits as approved and applicable to the Sunken Garden Theater. Set up shall take place April 17 through April 19, 2012 and take down shall take place on April 23, 2012.

SECTION 9. Except for changes made in this Ordinance, the 2012 Fiesta San Antonio celebration shall be conducted in accordance with Ordinance No. 2008-02-0125 of February 21, 2008. All terms, conditions, requirements and restrictions contained within the Fiesta San Antonio Commission Contract shall continue to govern the Fiesta and all Fiesta events unless specifically amended or rescinded herein.


SECTION 10. A violation of any provision of this Ordinance or Ordinance No. 2008-02-0125 shall be punished by a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200.00). Each day's violation of any of the aforementioned provision shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 11. This ordinance is effective immediately upon the receipt of eight affirmative votes; otherwise, it is effective ten days after passage.







**AGREEMENT FOR THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE
OF STATE RIGHT OF WAY – MULTI-YEAR AGREEMENT**

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the State of Texas, acting by and through the Texas Department of Transportation, hereinafter called the "State," and the City of San Antonio, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its duly authorized officers, hereinafter called the "local government."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the State owns and operates a system of highways for public use and benefit, including Loop 368, IH 35 and US 281, in Bexar, County; and

WHEREAS, the local government has requested the temporary closure of Loop 368, IH 35 and US 281 for the purpose of Battle of Flowers Parade, Fiesta Fandango Run, and the Fiesta Flambeau Night Parade, from April 27, 2012 to April 28, 2012 as described in the attached "**Exhibit A**," hereinafter identified as the "**Event**;" and

WHEREAS, the Event will be located within the local government's incorporated area; and

WHEREAS, the State, in recognition of the public purpose of the Event, wishes to cooperate with the City so long as the safety and convenience of the traveling public is ensured and that the closure of the State's right of way will be performed within the State's requirements; and

WHEREAS, on the _____ day of _____, 2012, the San Antonio City Council passed Resolution / Ordinance No. _____, attached hereto and identified as "**Exhibit B**," establishing that the Event serves a public purpose and authorizing the local government to enter into this agreement with the State; and

WHEREAS, 43 TAC, Section 22.12 establishes the rules and procedures for the temporary closure of a segment of the State highway system; and

WHEREAS, this agreement has been developed in accordance with the rules and procedures of 43 TAC, Section 22.12;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them respectively kept and performed as hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

Article 1. CONTRACT PERIOD

This agreement becomes effective upon final execution by the State and the maximum duration of this agreement shall not exceed five years unless terminated or modified as hereinafter provided.

Article 2. EVENT DESCRIPTION

*{Give a physical description of the annual event and when it will be held, the limits of the Event, including county names and highway numbers, the number of lanes the highway has and the number of lanes to be used, the proposed schedule of start and stop times and dates at each location, a brief description of the proposed activities involved, approximate number of people attending the Event, number and type of animals and equipment, planned physical modifications of any man-made or natural features in or adjacent to the right of way involved shall be attached hereto along with a **location map** and identified as "Exhibit C."}*

Article 3. OPERATIONS OF THE EVENT

A. The local government shall assume all costs for the operations associated with the Event, to include but not limited to, plan development, materials, labor, public notification, providing protective barriers and barricades, protection of highway traffic and highway facilities, and all traffic control and temporary signing.

B. The local government shall submit to the State for review and approval the construction plans, if construction or modifications to the State's right of way is required, the traffic control and signing plans, traffic enforcement plans, and all other plans deemed necessary by the State. The State may require that any traffic control plans of sufficient complexity be signed, sealed and dated by a registered professional engineer. The traffic control plan shall be in accordance with the latest edition of the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. All temporary traffic control devices used on state highway right of way must be included in the State's Compliant Work Zone Traffic Control Devices List. The State reserves the right to inspect the implementation of the traffic control plan and if it is found to be inadequate, the local government will bring the traffic control into compliance with the originally submitted plan, upon written notice from the State noting the required changes, prior to the event. The State may request changes to the traffic control plan in order to ensure public safety due to changing or unforeseen circumstances regarding the closure.

C. The local government will ensure that the appropriate law enforcement agency has reviewed the traffic control for the closures and that the agency has deemed them to be adequate. If the law enforcement agency is unsure as to the adequacy of the traffic control, it will contact the State for consultation no less than 10 workdays prior to the closure.

D. The local government will complete all revisions to the traffic control plan as requested by the State within the required timeframe or that the agreement will be terminated upon written notice from the State to the local government. The local government hereby agrees that any failure to cooperate with the State may constitute reckless endangerment of the public and that the Texas Department of Public Safety may be notified of the situation as soon as possible for the appropriate action, and failing to follow the traffic control plan or State instructions may result in a denial of future use of the right of way for three years.

E. The local government will not initiate closure prior to 24 hours before the scheduled Event and all barriers and barricades will be removed and the highway reopened to traffic within 24 hours after the completion of the Event.

F. The local government will provide adequate enforcement personnel to prevent vehicles

from stopping and parking along the main lanes of highway right of way and otherwise prevent interference with the main lane traffic by both vehicles and pedestrians. The local government will prepare a traffic enforcement plan, to be approved by the State in writing at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled Event. Additionally, the local government shall provide to the State a letter of certification from the law enforcement agency that will be providing traffic control for the Event, certifying that they agree with the enforcement plan and will be able to meet its requirements.

G. The local government hereby assures the State that there will be appropriate passage allowance for emergency vehicle travel and adequate access for abutting property owners during construction and closure of the highway facility. These allowances and accesses will be included in the local government's traffic control plan.

H. The local government will avoid or minimize damage, and will, at its own expense, restore or repair damage occurring outside the State's right of way and restore or repair the State's right of way, including, but not limited to, roadway and drainage structures, signs, overhead signs, pavement markings, traffic signals, power poles and pavement, etc. to a condition equal to that existing before the closure, and, to the extent practicable, restore the natural and cultural environment in accordance with federal and state law, including landscape and historical features.

Article 4. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Upon completion or termination of this agreement, all documents prepared by the local government will remain the property of the local government. All data prepared under this agreement shall be made available to the State without restriction or limitation on their further use. At the request of the State, the Local Government shall submit any information required by the State in the format directed by the State.

Article 5. TERMINATION

A. This agreement may be terminated by any of the following conditions:

- (1) By mutual written agreement and consent of both parties.
- (2) By the State upon determination that use of the State's right of way is not feasible or is not in the best interest of the State and the traveling public.
- (3) By either party, upon the failure of the other party to fulfill the obligations as set forth herein.
- (4) By satisfactory completion of all services and obligations as set forth herein.

B. The termination of this agreement shall extinguish all rights, duties, obligations, and liabilities of the State and local government under this agreement. If the potential termination of this agreement is due to the failure of the local government to fulfill its contractual obligations as set forth herein, the State will notify the local government that possible breach of contract has occurred. The local government must remedy the breach as outlined by the State within ten (10) days from receipt of the State's notification. In the event the local government does not remedy the breach to the satisfaction of the State, the local government shall be liable to the State for the costs of remedying the breach and any additional costs occasioned by the State.

Article 6. DISPUTES

Should disputes arise as to the parties' responsibilities or additional work under this agreement, the State's decision shall be final and binding.

Article 7. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

The State and the Local Government agree that neither party is an agent, servant, or employee of the other party and each party agrees it is responsible for its individual acts and deeds as well as the acts and deeds of its contractors, employees, representatives, and agents.

Article 8. INSURANCE

A. Prior to beginning any work upon the State's right of way, the local government and/or its contractors shall furnish to the State a completed "Certificate of Insurance" (TxDOT Form 1560, latest edition) and shall maintain the insurance in full force and effect during the period that the local government and/or its contractors are encroaching upon the State right of way.
B. In the event the local government is a self-insured entity, the local government shall provide the State proof of its self-insurance. The local government agrees to pay any and all claims and damages that may occur during the period of this closing of the highway in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

Article 9. AMENDMENTS

Any changes in the time frame, character, agreement provisions or obligations of the parties hereto shall be enacted by written amendment executed by both the local government and the State.

Article 10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The local government shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local environmental laws, regulations, ordinances and any conditions or restrictions required by the State to protect the natural environment and cultural resources of the State's right of way.

Article 11. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION

In case one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions hereof and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

The first Battle of Flowers® Parade took place in 1891 to honor the heroes of the Alamo and to commemorate the Battle of San Jacinto, April 21, 1836, where Texas won its independence from Mexico. 

Remembering the heroes of the Alamo has remained the focus of the parade, and participants are asked to bring a floral tribute to be placed on the lawn in front of the Alamo.

The theme of this year's Parade is "Battle of Flowers ... Where Fiesta Began!," a celebration of the Battle of Flowers. Today the Battle of Flowers Association celebrates Fiesta, whose foundation took place more than 120 years ago. Fiesta started with the Battle of Flowers!

R.O.T.C. units march in a Vanguard ahead of the parade and delight spectators with precision drills. The parade arrives with an explosion of color as splendid cavalcades and flying flags announce the festivities to come. Spectacular floats carrying costumed Fiesta royalty are interspersed with flower-bedecked antique cars and carriages. Giant helium balloons fly through the air, accompanied by the music of military and high school bands.
