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AN ORDINANCE (3688)

AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING MAYOR GUS B. MAUERMANN TO EXECUTE IN NAME OF AND FOR CITY OF SAN ANTONIO QUIT-CLAIM DEED CONVEYING LOT 8, BLOCK E $\frac{1}{2}$  OF 14, CB 611, TO CHARLES ALBIDRESS FOR CONSIDERATION OF \$5,500.

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The Clerk presented a letter from Mr. Fred F. Pflughaupt, Chairman, City Zoning Commission, with reference to the Petition of Bob Schaefer, and others, for re-zoning of certain lots on West Ave. between Solano St. and Olmos Drive. The letter stated the petition was heard by the Zoning Commission on June 24, 1946, adding that "the Zoning Commission recommends no re-zoning of the properties referred to."

On motion of Commissioner Callaghan, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the petition for re-zoning was ordered advertised for public hearing before the City Council and the necessary Resolution ordered drawn, as follows:

GIVING NOTICE OF A PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF THE ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ZONING REGULATIONS AND DISTRICTS, ETC., PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE THIRD DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1938.

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On motion of Commissioner Hein, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the meeting was recessed to 11:00 o'clock, A.M., Monday, July 15, 1946.

Commissioner Anderson stated he was voting "nay" because he did not think it a fundamental principle of sound government to go outside the City limits to do business of this kind.

Commissioner Hein replied that an ordinance to annex this territory had already been introduced and published.

AN ORDINANCE (3696)

GRANTING CONCESSIONS FOR SOUTH SAN ANTONIO RECREATION HALL, AND MAKING CONTRACT WITH CHAS. A McCOWN.

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Commissioner Hein introduced the following resolution, which was passed and approved by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson.

A RESOLUTION (3697)

DIRECTING ADVERTISEMENT TO SELL LOT 20, NEW CITY BLOCK 3699, IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

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Commissioner Hein brought up for discussion a letter he had received from Emmett B. Coker, attorney, concerning the disposition of Lot 4, Block 114, Alamo Heights. Commissioner Hein said he understood this lot was in the Olmos Basin and he believed the City should have bought it some years ago. He said there was about \$800 in taxes accumulated against the property. Mayor Mauermann said he believed this matter had been discussed previously by the Committee of the Whole. It was agreed to have the Clerk look up the record before further discussion.

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Commissioner Steffler introduced the following resolution, which was passed and approved by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson.

## A RESOLUTION (3698)

CALLING FOR BIDS FOR PAVING ON HERMINE BOULEVARD, LOVERA BOULEVARD AND MANDALAY DRIVE.

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Commissioner Steffler introduced the following annexation ordinance, which was ordered published, on motion of Commissioner Steffler, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson.

## AN ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TERRITORY ADJACENT TO THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY, TO INCLUDE BLOCK 188 AND BLOCK 196 IN COUNTY BLOCK 4060, LOS ANGELES HEIGHTS ADDITION TO THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

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On motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the Council authorized the City Attorney to prepare a Resolution to advertise for bids for the installation of gasoline equipment at Fire Stations No. 2 and No. 20.

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On recommendation and motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the Council granted the petition of the Texas Co. for permission to make gasoline installation at 618 N. St. Mary's St.

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## AN ORDINANCE (3701)

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE VENDOR'S LIEN NOTE, PAYABLE TO ALBERT HIRSCHFELD, AND DEED OF TRUST, TO ACQUIRE LAND FOR USE AS AN AIRPORT.

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H. L. Crittenden, Administrative Assistant of the Health Dept., addressed the Council in regard to a letter concerning the special polio fund. The letter stated: "It was the understanding of the Board of Health that a special appropriation of \$30,000 would be made to cover costs of special control of poliomyelitis." Crittenden asked that the \$30,000 fund be set up

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to include polio campaign expenses other than payrolls, as stated in his letter: "The Board of Health has authorized me to respectfully request that when the \$30,000 appropriation is set up, that it shall include not only payroll, but all expenses and purchases bearing directly on the polio campaign incurred from and after June 1, 1946."

Commissioner Hein moved that the Council concur in the request of the Health Board. After a second by Commissioner Anderson, the motion was carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson.

On motion of Commissioner Hein, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the meeting adjourned Thursday, July 15, 1946.
