

JANUARY 11TH, A.D.1918, 10.45 A.M.

At this hour, the Mayor and all of the Commissioners being present, after adjournment had on January 10th, at 4.30 p.m. the Clerk was directed to read aloud the resolution adopted January 3, 1918, constituting the charges against F.H. Lancaster, Chief of Police, whereupon Commissioner Heuermann moved that the charges therein set out be not sustained, and that F.H.Lancaster be reinstated as Chief of Police, which motion was carried on roll call by the following vote, to-wit: Ayes, Bell, Coy, Lambert, Heuermann and Lowther.

At 11 o'clock the Clerk was directed to read aloud a resolution adopted by the Commissioners on January 3, 1918, constituting the charges against J.Ed Wilkins, Judge of the Corporation Court, whereupon the taking of testimony in this case was begun and continued until 12 o'clock noon, when recess was taken until 2.30 o'clock p.m., at which hour the hearing was resumed, with the Mayor and all of the Commissioners present, until 3.45 o'clock p.m., when both counsel for defense and prosecution announced that the case had been fully presented.

The Board of Commissioners thereupon retired to take the case under consideration.


At 4 o'clock p.m. after the Clerk had again read aloud the resolution of January 3, 1918, constituting the charges against J.Ed Wilkins, Judge of the Corporation Court, Commissioner Heuermann moved that the charges against J.Ed Wilkins, Judge of the Corporation Court, be not sustained and that he be reinstated as Judge of the Corporation Court, was duly seconded, and carried upon roll call by the following vote, to-wit: Ayes, Bell, Coy, Lambert, Heuermann and Lowther.
