REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO
HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER OF THE CITY HALL, SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS,
ON AUGUST 12, 1943, at 10:00 O'CLOCK, A. M.

PRESENT: Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson.

The Minutes of the regular meeting of August 5th and the recessed meeting of August 7th were read by the Clerk. The Mayor requested that the words "any litigation" as read by the Clerk in reporting Mayor Mauermann's answer to Mr. W. W. McAllister be changed to read "pending litigation" and with this change, on motion by Commissioner Hein, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan and unanimously carried, the Minutes were approved.


On motion of Commissioner Hein, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan, and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned August 12th, 1943.
