

A Management-Community Advisory committee was organized for Alazan-Apache Courts Housing Project at a meeting which was held in the Administration Building of the Alazan-Apache Project at 8:00 p.m. Friday, August 10, 1945.

The purpose of this Advisory Committee is to assist the Housing Manager in:

1. Planning the most effective and full time use of the community facilities of the Project.
2. Planning a program jointly in order to offer a high standard of education, recreation and health for all age groups in the project and the community adjacent.
3. Eliminating conflicting activities and duplication of effort in order that the community program can operate harmoniously and efficiently.
4. Assisting agencies and organizations in strengthening and/or expanding their programs in order to promote the health, civic consciousness and the social well-being of the individual and the community.
5. To integrate the community programs in Alazan-Apache Courts with those of the neighborhood adjacent.

Representation on the committee was made up of tenant groups and agencies who are providing activities in the project at

This is done for the sole purpose of reclassifying any tenant who through their earnings or dependents may be entitled for a change in classification.

In the near future three Investigators from the Housing Authority will go from house to house gathering this information.

Please prepare and have ready for the Investigators the following information:

1. (a) A list of the names of all persons who live in the apartment
(b) their relationship
(c) their age and sex
2. (a) A list of those who are employed
(b) where they work
(c) the dates of their employment
(d) the rate of pay
(e) the amount earned during the past year
(f) any other income of any member of the family, from whatever source.
3. (a) A list of the deductions for Social Security
(b) unemployment compensation
(c) union dues
(d) compulsory uniforms. No deductions will be allowed for Income Taxes or War Bonds.

Your cooperation in this re-examination will be greatly appreciated by the Management.
