

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

FRIDAY DECEMBER 24TH, A. D. 1915.

PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Steves.

Commissioners met, pursuant to the call of His Honor, the Mayor, to consider the following, to-wit:

December 23, 1915.

To the Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor,
And Board of Commissioners,
Of the City of San Antonio.

Gentlemen:-

I take pleasure in handing you herewith a deed to certain property adjoining Brackenridge Park or Water Works Park, which I hope you will accept as a Christmas gift to the City of San Antonio, to be used as a public park, subject to certain conditions and restrictions mentioned in said deed.

In presenting you this park I am carrying out not only my own wishes, but also those of my deceased husband, who very frequently expressed the intention of conveying this property to the City of San Antonio.

On motion of Commissioner Lambert, duly seconded and carried, the gift was accepted with a rising vote of thanks.

A certified copy of a resolution adopted by the Board of Directors of the San Antonio Water Supply Company on November 30th, 1915, declaring the intention to deed to the City the 25 foot strip reserved along part of the boundaries of Brackenridge Park, was read and ordered filed.

Upon motion, duly seconded and carried, the Mayor appointed Commissioners Lambert and Steves and Honorable George R. Gillette to draft a resolution thanking Mrs Koehler for the magnificent gift, on behalf of the City.
