

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HELD IN  
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON  
THURSDAY, MARCH 28, 1985.

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The meeting was called to order at 1:00 P.M. by the presiding officer, Mayor Henry Cisneros, with the following members present: BERRIOZABAL, WEBB, DUTMER, WING, EURESTE, THOMPSON, ALDERETE, HARRINGTON, ARCHER, HASSLOCHER, CISNEROS.

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85-23 The invocation was given by Reverend Forrest Fitzhugh.

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85-23 The City Council and the audience joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States.

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85-23 JAMES M. CAVENDER, JR.

Mayor Cisneros spoke of the recent passing of Mr. James M. Cavender, Jr., a noted community leader, and asked the family to come forward to hear and receive the following Resolution of Respect:

A RESOLUTION NO. 85-23-39

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of San Antonio has learned of the passing of one of its leading citizens, Mr. James M. Cavender, Jr., and

WHEREAS, Mr. Cavender was a dedicated and highly respected businessman who contributed immensely to the economic well-being of our City, and

WHEREAS, as founder of Cavender Oldsmobile since 1938, he was considered a pioneer in the automobile industry and in 1975 he was presented with Time Magazine's Quality Merit Award, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Cavender served the community in various capacities, including membership in the Texas Cavaliers where he was honored as a 50-year member, the San Antonio German Club, he also served as member and deacon of the First Presbyterian Church for more than 30 years; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. that the Mayor and members of the City Council hereby join with his family and friends in their sorrow over his death and extends its sincerest sympathy to those who were near him.

SECTION 2. and it is hereby directed that a copy of this Resolution be spread upon the minutes of this meeting and a copy thereof presented to his family as a token of our deepest sympathy.

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Mr. Webb made a motion to approve the Resolution. Mr. Hasslocher seconded the motion.

Mayor Cisneros and members of the City Council presented the Resolution of Respect to Mrs. Cavender and spoke of the many years of community work performed by her late husband.

Mr. James M. Cavender III, speaking on behalf of the family, thanked the Mayor and Council for the honor.

CAROL BURNETT

Mayor Cisneros noted the presence in the audience today of Ms. Carol Burnett, noted international celebrity and comedienne, and a native of San Antonio. He stated that she was in San Antonio in connection with the writing of a book of her life while in San Antonio. He spoke of her

being a native San Antonian who grew up on the west side of the City, and greeted her, welcoming her back to San Antonio.

Ms. Burnett thanked the Mayor and Council for the recognition, and spoke of her first years as a San Antonian, from birth to age seven, when she moved to California to live with a grandmother. She then spoke of some details of the book planned, noting that it was being written for her three daughters and would not contain any of her show business career.

Mayor Cisneros presented Ms. Burnett with a desk-sized limestone replica of the Alamo, in addition to a river print and official book on San Antonio. He then introduced Ms. Irene Davis, Ms. Lea Caldwell and Ms. Joan Rothwell, all cousins of Ms. Burnett from Texas, also present with her in San Antonio today. He then thanked Ms. Burnett for touching many thousands of persons around the world with her talent, both as a comedienne and as a serious actress. He further stated that San Antonio is proud that she has returned to San Antonio to work on a book concerning her younger years.

FAIRMOUNT HOTEL

Mayor Cisneros recognized representatives of the San Antonio Conservation Society and the Fairmount Group in the audience, and noted that they are present today to make presentations to members of the City Council. He spoke of their courage in undertaking such a venture as the moving of the large hotel from one spot to another, a feat never done before.

Ms. Bebe Inkley, President, San Antonio Conservation Society, displayed special plaque-mounted bricks from the Fairmount Hotel, and stated that each member of the Council is being given one as a memento of the event. She spoke to details of the history-making move of the hotel on Saturday, and thanked the City staff for its cooperation in the matter.

Ms. Virginia Van Steenberg thanked the City for its cooperation and help, and spoke of the courage of those who financed this effort, calling it a great thing for San Antonio, noting that the legacy of the Fairmount Hotel thus will remain with San Antonio.

Mr. Tom Wright spoke briefly of the hotel movement plans, and stated that the Council should be proud of the City staff, especially Mr. Frank Perry, for their tireless work in this matter.

A discussion then took place concerning the routing and details of the move of the Fairmount Hotel from East Commerce Street and Bowie Street to its new location at South Alamo Street and Nueva Street.

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Representatives of the Conservation Society and the Fairmount Group then presented each member of the City Council with a special mounted brick from the hotel as a memento.

Ms. Inkley outlined the various events that will be taking place as a result of the hotel move, including a workshop and a special breakfast.

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MR. PADDY COX

Police Chief Charles Rodriguez introduced Mr. Paddy Cox, a police officer of Halesworth, England, Subdivision Suffolk Constabulary, who is chairman of the "Friends of the 489th Bombardment Group" which served in the European Theater during World War II.

Mr. Cox stated that this was the first visit to the United States for himself and his wife, and spoke briefly to the history of Suffolk, which dates back to Roman times. He then spoke of having discovered part of the stone ruins of an old U.S. airbase, used during World War II, in his area and of how his investigation into its origins and history led to his appointment as chairman of the "Friends of the 489th Bombardment Group". He then spoke of the history of the old airbase and of having made a number of American friends as a result, including many who flew from the base. He spoke of the "Halesworth Stone", which he discovered in underbrush in an open field, and of its significance as an emblem of the some 6,200 Americans who died in air combat in Europe during World War II and of other Americans who responded to Great Britain's call for help when it was besieged by Nazi Germany before the outbreak of World War II.

Mayor Cisneros presented Mr. Cox with an official book on San Antonio.

Mr. Cox, in turn, presented Chief Rodriguez with a special badge of his constabulary, as an act of good will between our two communities.

Mayor Cisneros thanked Mr. Cox for coming to San Antonio, and welcomed him officially, on behalf of the City.

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FOURTH GRADERS FROM EDINBURG, TEXAS

Mayor Cisneros took note of the presence in the audience today of some four groups of fourth graders from Thomas Jefferson Elementary School in Edinburg, where Ms. Ruby Benedict is principal. He also noted that Ms. Benedict is a cousin of Councilwoman Maria Antonietta Berriozabal. He asked that the school children and their adult sponsors stand and be recognized.

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A representative of the group thanked the Mayor and Council for the recognition, noting that this was an educational trip for the groups.

Mayor Cisneros welcomed all to San Antonio and to City Hall, and stated that these young people and their talents are vital to the future success of the Rio Grande Valley and to Texas.

Ms. Berriozabal welcomed the group to San Antonio and City Hall.

Mr. Archer spoke to the condition of the area and recommended that the City consider removing all above-ground tombstones and erect one large monument with the names and other appropriate date of those entombed in the cemetery, thereby creating a large park area which is much easier to maintain than a cemetery with many tombstones.

Mr. Harrington voiced his concern that this action will adversely affect City budgets in the future.

Mr. Louis J. Fox, City Manager, stated that Mr. Archer's recommendation only asks the City Manager to look into the feasibility of such a move.

Mrs. Dutmer stated that Mr. Archer's idea is much like that involving Milam Park, and spoke in support of the idea, at least to the point of asking City staff to look into its feasibility.

Mr. Webb noted that the survivors of those persons interred in the old cemeteries, if any remain, apparently do not care about the gravesites as evidenced by their lack of care for a number of years. He spoke of the need to perhaps screen the cemeteries to make them esthetically-pleasing, then investigate the park idea.

Mrs. Dutmer spoke against erecting a wall around the cemeteries.

1984 ANNUAL REPORT BY THE FINE ARTS COMMISSION

Ms. Rebecca Quintanilla Cedillo, Assistant Director of Planning, introduced Mr. Fred Tidwell, Chairman of the Fine Arts Commission.

Mr. Tidwell briefly presented his commission's report, noting that they had reviewed some 43 projects, including seven major ones, and briefly described the seven major projects reviewed, including the International Airport Public Sculpture competition, The Tillett Stitchery, Brackenridge Park, Convention Center Facilities Expansion, Municipal Auditorium Renovation, the San Antonio Botanical Center Conservatory, and work with the North San Antonio Chamber of Commerce on acquisition and location of more public art for International Airport.

Mr. Tidwell then outlined the commission's proposed 1985 activities, including development of a Policy Manual, sponsoring of additional design competitions, funding for public art, donation of art to the city, creation of an art inventory involving City-owned art, and creation of an inventory of City-owned sites for potential location for art.

A copy of the Fine Arts Commission annual report for 1984 is made a part of the papers of this meeting.

Mr. Tidwell then spoke of City Council support for the Fine Arts Commission, stating his group's desire for San Antonio to become a model for the nation.

Mayor Cisneros lauded the work of the Fine Arts Commission, which seeks to create an arts activity in San Antonio. He asked the group to be particularly active as it relates to work on the Flag Plaza at

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International Airport, and asked the commission to look at public facilities in San Antonio and suggest ways to make them more attractive. He spoke specifically of such areas as the entrance to International Airport, including the possibility of using sculptured shrubbery to enhance the entrance looks; new City libraries; entrances to City parks, where the horticultural talents of the Parks and Recreation Department can be brought into play in imaginative ways; and the use of public art in San Antonio, generally.

Mr. Archer spoke of the Samuel Gompers statue near the Convention Center and of the proposed new contemporary sculpture outside the River Bend Garage involving a fountain using a red Volkswagen as part of the work.

Mr. Tidwell stated that this latter sculpture was the most imaginative of the three ideas presented to his group for decision. He then spoke of what he termed a misconception about the piece of sculpture.

Ms. Berriozabal spoke of the need for much work on public areas in downtown San Antonio as part of the Tri-Party Transportation Initiative, including possible pedestrian malls in the downtown area. She spoke of the need for design ideas in conjunction with the Fine Arts Commission, and asked the City Manager to work with the commission on this.

Mr. Fox agreed to do so.

A brief discussion followed concerning the use of public art in San Antonio.

Mayor Cisneros urged the Fine Arts Commission to consider developing fountains and other water-features in the city, noting his contention that 'water' should be a major feature of such development. He spoke of statuary in other major U.S. cities as being a statement of the community's history. He spoke of the need to commemorate famous people and their connection to San Antonio, and provided several examples. He also asked the commission to actively seek more corporate gifts for public art in San Antonio, and to aggressively seek these gifts. He noted that the commission might well have need of a special committee to seek corporate gifts.

Mr. Webb and Mr. Thompson thanked Mr. Tidwell for the report.

CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

DONALD MOYE

Mr. Donald Moye, representing the San Antonio Zulu Association, spoke of their planned activities for Fiesta Week to be held at St. Paul's Square, and asked that the City Council approve a waiver of the fees for the showmobiles they plan to lease from the City.

He expressed particular concern about funds which are spent by this program and the persons who are in charge of the daily operations. He stated his own mother's particular case.

Mr. Kevin Moriarty, Director of Human Resources, explained that the City does not have any problems with this agency and stated that Mr. Lee Sanders, Director of the Senior Community Services, is present in the audience to speak to the Council.
