AN ORDINANCE 98-46

AMENDING RULE 33, DIVISION VI, and RULE 39, DIVISION VII. OF THE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AS EMBRACED IN AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED ON DECEMBER 8, 1921, AND CERTAIN AMENDMENTS THERETO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That rule 33, Division VI, as contained in an ordinance passed and approved on December 8, 1921 and amended by an ordinance passed and approved August 6, 1923, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows, to-wit:

Rule 33. It shall be unlawful to back any vehicle to make a turn in any street, if by so doing it interferes with other vehicles, but such vehicles shall go around the block on to a street sufficiently wide within which to turn without blocking traffic; nor shall any vehicle make a loop turn at any intersection where a traffic policeman is stationed or an electric traffic signal unit is established; nor shall any vehicle make a left hand turn on Houston Street, between Avenue D and North Flores Street, both inclusive; nor on Commerce Street between Alamo Street and Soledad Street, both inclusive.

SECTION TWO: That rule 39, Division VII, as contained in an ordinance passed and approved on December 8, 1921, and as amended by an ordinance passed and approved on October 9, 1922, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows, to-wit:

Rule 39. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle, except such vehicle be then actually in use by a Doctor on an emergency call, and away from his office, to park for a longer period than one (1) hour, between the hours of eight (8) o'clock a. m. and seven (7) o'clock p. m., on certain streets within the business district of the City as follows, to-wit:

- On Avenue D, between Houston and Travis Streets;
- On Broadway, between Houston and Third Streets;
- On Jefferson Street, between Houston and Travis Streets;
- On Losoya Street, between Commerce and Houston Streets;
- On Navarro Street, between Market and Travis Streets;
- On St. Mary's Street, between Market and Pecan Streets;
- On Soledad Street, between Commerce and Travis Streets,
- On Main Avenue, between Commerce and Travis Streets;
- On Pecan Street, between Market and Houston Street;
- On the west side of Alamo Plaza between Houston and Commerce Street;

On the east side of Alamo Plaza between Blum and Crockett Streets;
 On South Alamo Street between Commerce and Market Streets;
 On Market Street between South Alamo Street and the east side of Main Plaza;
 On Casino Street, between Commerce and Market Streets;
 On Yturri Street, between Commerce and Market Streets;
 On Crockett Street between the west side of Alamo Plaza and St. Mary's Street;
 On College Street, between Losoya and St. Mary's Streets;
 On the east side of Main Plaza between Commerce and Dolorosa Streets;
 On Flores Street, between Commerce and Travis Streets;
 On Veramendi Street between Main Avenue and Soledad Streets;

And in the case of a vehicle then actually in use by a Doctor away from his office on an emergency call, said vehicle shall not remain parked within said limits for any longer time than same is actually in use by said Doctor upon such call,

AN ORDINANCE 02-47

Prohibiting persons from entering or being within buildings or rooms, or going to, visiting or being at places of seclusion within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of engaging in unlawful carnal intercourse; repealing all ordinances in conflict herewith and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any male person to enter or to be within any building or room within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of engaging in carnal intercourse with any female person who is not then the wife of such male person.

Section 2. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any female person to enter or to be within any building or room within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of engaging in carnal intercourse with any male person who is not then the husband of such female person.

Section 3. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any male person to visit, go to or to be at any place of seclusion within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of engaging in carnal intercourse with any female person who is not then the wife of such male person.

Section 4. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any female person to visit, go to or to be at any place of seclusion within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of engaging in carnal intercourse with any male person who is not then the husband of such female person.

Section 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Ten (\$10.00) nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

Section 7. This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom and shall take effect immediately after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE 02-48

ordering an election to be held in the City of San Antonio, B exar County, Texas, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified taxpaying electors of said City nine certain separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of said City, and to issue bonds of said City therefor, the proceeds from the sale of which shall be used in effecting and constructing the following permanent/^{public}improvements in and for said City, viz; (1) Bonds in the sum of \$2,800,000,00 for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening,^{deepening}altering, changing and daming the channels thereof, and by building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and water sheds and tributaries thereof, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect the public health and safety, (2) Bonds in the sum of \$200,000,00 for the purpose of constructing and completing a public auditorium building and acquiring a site therefor; (3) Bonds in the sum of \$100,000,00 for the purpose of constructing suitable buildings for the fire and police departments, and acquiring necessary sites therefor; (4) Bonds in the sum of \$100,000,00 for the purpose of constructing permanent improvements in the public parks and places of said City, (5) Bonds in the sum of \$250,000,00 for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and places; (6) Bonds in the sum of \$100,000,00 for the purpose of constructing bridges; (7) Bonds in the sum of \$450,000,00 for the purpose of paving and grading the public streets and public places of the City, and permanently making the same; (8) Bonds in the sum of \$250,000,00 for the purpose of constructing storm sewers and acquiring any lands necessary therefor; (9) Bonds in the sum of \$100,000,00⁰⁰ for the purpose of constructing sanitary sewers.

WHEREAS, the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio deem it necessary and advisable to issue bonds of said City for the respective purposes and the respective amounts hereinafter specified, and desire to submit said propositions to the taxpaying voters as required by law; Therefore;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That an election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in the City of San Antonio on the 4th day of December A. D. 1923, and the Mayor of said City be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his proclamation calling said election on said date, at which said election nine certain separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of said City for the purpose of effecting and constructing permanent public improvements within the limits of said City shall be submitted to the qualified tax-paying voters of said City as follows, to-wit:

1st. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow monry on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of TWO MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$2,800,000,00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000,00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz; To be payable serially in amounts of SEVENTY THOUSAND (\$70,000,00) DOLLARS, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of

said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature. Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming the channels thereof, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor; said improvements to be constructed being the widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming of the channels of the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in permanent manner and acquiring any lands and other property necessary therefor.

2nd, Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent ^{public} improvements, in the sum of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$200,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz; To be payable serially in amounts of FIVE THOUSAND (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS, each year, respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds as maturity, viz; as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing, erecting and completing a public auditorium building in the City of San Antonio, and acquiring a site therefor; said improvements to be constructed being the erecting, construction and completion of a permanent public building to be used as a public auditorium, and acquiring and completing the acquiring of a site therefor, within the corporate limits of said City.

3rd. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of five hundred (\$500.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz; To be payable serially in amounts of TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED (\$2,500.00) DOLLARS, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and service of the fire and police departments of said City by erecting suitable buildings therefor, and acquiring sites for same; said improvements to be constructed being permanent buildings for additional fire and police stations, and the acquisition of the necessary sites therefor. in the sum of

4th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of five hundred (\$500.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz; To be payable serially in amounts of TWO FIVE HUNDRED (\$2,500.00) DOLLARS, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds, to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz;- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing permanent improvements in the public parks and places belonging to said City; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent buildings, plumbing and other structures in the public parks and places belonging to the City of San Antonio necessary for the convenience of the public in the use and enjoyment of said public parks and places.

5th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz; To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz;- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the public convenience and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City by opening, widening and straightening public streets and places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed and effected being the permanent opening, widening and straightening of public streets and places in the several wards of said City.

6th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City, and issue bonds of said City therefor, for the permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of five hundred (\$500.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz; To be payable serially in amounts of TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED (\$2,500.00) DOLLARS, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets of said City by building bridges; said improvements to be constructed being the construction

of permanent bridges over streams crossing public streets in the several wards of said City.

7th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvement, in the sum of FOUR HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$450,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practical, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz:- as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loans being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of said City by paving and grading the same; and permanently marking the same, said public improvements to be constructed being the paving and grading and the erection of signs and markers, ^{in permanent manner,} all of the streets and public places, in the several wards of said City.

8th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of ONE THOUSAND (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places and the health and property of the people of said City by the laying and constructing of storm sewers and drains with mains and laterals, and acquiring any parcels of land necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the laying and constructing in permanent manner of such storm sewers with mains and laterals and drains in connection therewith, in the several wards of said City.

9th. Shall the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money on the credit of said City and issue bonds of said City therefor, for permanent public improvements, in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS; said bonds to be of the face denomination of five hundred (\$500.00) DOLLARS each, and to mature within a period of forty (40) years, viz: To be payable serially in amounts of TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED (\$2,500.00) DOLLARS, each year respectively, from one (1) to forty (40) years, both inclusive.

All of said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; said Commissioners being authorized to negotiate said bonds in lots as they may determine and direct, and to be authorized to levy and to assess and to collect annually, taxes sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as same become payable and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds at maturity, viz: as each of

said bonds and series of bonds, shall respectively mature.

Said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health of the people of the City by the construction of Sanitary sewers and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the laying and constructing of a system of permanent sanitary sewers, with mains and laterals in each of the several wards of said City, extending and supplementing the present sanitary sewer system of said City.

SECTION TWO: The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State regulating general elections, and by the provisions of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and the ordinance of the City of San Antonio for such cases lawfully made and provided; and as provided by law only those persons shall vote at said election who are qualified electors of said City and who pay taxes on property in said City; and the ballot to be used in said election shall be an "official ballot" arranged in such manner that persons qualified to vote at said election may vote either for or against any or all of said propositions.

SECTION THREE: That the form in which said nine several propositions shall be voted on respectively, shall be substantially as follows, to-wit:

1. That at said election all voters desiring to support the FIRST PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinafter in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$2,800,000,00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming the channels thereof, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor; said improvements to be constructed being the widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming of the channels of the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner and acquiring any lands and other property necessary therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$2,800,000,00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming the channels thereof, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner, so as to prevent or ameliorate flood conditions and protect the public health and safety, and to acquire any lands and other property necessary therefor; said improvements to be constructed being the widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming of the channels of the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters and the water sheds of said river and creeks and tributaries thereof, all in a permanent manner and acquiring any lands and other property necessary therefor."

2. That at said election all voters desiring to support the SECOND PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinafter in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$200,000,00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the ^{period of forty} period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing, erecting and completing a public

auditorium building in the City of San Antonio, and acquiring a site therefor; said improvements to be constructed being the erection, construction and completion of a permanent public building to be used as a public auditorium, and acquiring and completing the acquiring of a site therefor, within the corporate limits of said City."

And those opposed to said propositions to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$200,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing, erecting and completing a public auditorium building in the City of San Antonio, and acquiring a site therefor; said improvements to be constructed being the erection, construction and completion of a permanent public building to be used as a public auditorium, and acquiring and completing the acquiring and completing the acquiring of a site therefor, within the corporate limits of said City."

3. That at said election all voters desiring to support the THIRD PROPOSITION to issue bonds as herein before in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and service of the fire and police department of said City by erecting suitable buildings therefor, and acquiring sites for same; said improvements to be constructed being permanent buildings for additional fire and police stations, and the acquisition of the necessary sites therefor."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the facilities and service of the fire and police departments of said City by erecting suitable buildings therefor, and acquiring sites for same; said improvements to be constructed being permanent buildings for additional fire and police stations, and the acquisition of the necessary sites therefor."

4. That at said election all voters desiring to support the FORTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as herein before in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing permanent improvements in the public parks and places belonging to said City; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent buildings, plumbing and other structures in the public parks and places belonging to the City of San Antonio necessary for the convenience of the public in the use and enjoyment of said public parks and places."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of constructing permanent improvements in the public parks and places belonging to said City; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent buildings, plumbing and other structures in the public parks and places belonging to the City of San Antonio necessary for the convenience of the public in the use and enjoyment of said public parks and places."

5. That at said election all voters desiring to support the FIFTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as herein before in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, ⁱⁿ installments as nearly equal as practicable and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the public convenience and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City by opening, widening and straightening public streets and places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed and effected being the permanent opening, widening and straightening of public streets and places in the several wards of said City."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the public conveniences and traffic conditions of the public streets and public places of said City by opening, widening and straightening public streets and places, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed and effected being the permanent opening, widening and straightening of public streets and places in the several wards of said City."

6. That at said election all voters ^{desiring} to support the SIXTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds in hereinafore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loans being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets of said City by building bridges; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent bridges over streams crossing public streets in the several wards of said City."

And those opposed to said propositions to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets of said City by building bridges; said improvements to be constructed being the construction of permanent bridges over streams crossing public streets in the several wards of said City."

7. That at said election all voters desiring to support the SEVENTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as hereinbefore in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of FOUR HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$450,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of said City by paving and grading the same ^{and} permanently marking the same; said public improvements to be constructed being the paving and grading and the erection of signs and markers, all in a permanent manner, of the streets and public places, in the several wards of said City."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds to the City of San Antonio in the sum of FOUR HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$450,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places of said City by paving and grading the same and permanently marking the same; said public improvements to be constructed being the paving and grading and the erection of signs and markers, all in permanent manner, of the streets and public places, in the several wards of said City."

8. That at said election all voters desiring to support the EIGHT PROPOSITION to issue bonds as herein before in Section One, described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places and the health and property of the people of said City by the laying and constructing of storm sewers and drainage with mains and laterals, and acquiring any parcels of land necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the laying and constructing in permanent manner of such storm sewers, with mains and laterals, and drains in connection therewith, in the several wards of said City."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND (\$250,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of improving the condition of the public streets and public places and the health and property of the people of said City by the laying and constructing of storm sewers and drainage with mains and laterals, and acquiring any parcels of land necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the laying and constructing in permanent manner of such storm sewers, with mains and laterals, and drains in connection therewith, in the several wards of said City."

9. That at said election all voters desiring to support the NINTH PROPOSITION to issue bonds as herein before in Section One described, shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"For the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in equal yearly installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health of the people of the City by the construction of Sanitary Sewers, and acquiring any parcel of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the laying and constructing of a system of permanent sanitary sewers, with mains and laterals in each of the several wards of said City, extending and supplementing the present sanitary sewer system of said City."

And those opposed to said proposition to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words:

"Against the issuance of bonds of the City of San Antonio in the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, payable serially during the period of forty (40) years, in equal installments and bearing interest at the rate of five (5%) per centum per annum; said loan being desired for the purpose of protecting the health of the people of the City by the construction of Sanitary Sewers, and acquiring any parcels of land which may be necessary therefor; said public improvements to be constructed being the laying and constructing of a system of permanent sanitary sewers, with mains and laterals in each, of the several wards of said City, extending and supplementing the present sanitary sewer system of said City."

SECTION FOUR: That said election shall be held within the City of San Antonio, and in each and all of the various election precincts thereof variously located in each of the several wards of said City as said election precincts are now fixed and established, and being the same election precincts used in recent state and county elections; and said election herein ordered shall be held at the place in each such respective election precinct set opposite the number of such precinct in the following table, to-wit:

SECTION SIX: That a copy of this ordinance signed by the Mayor of the City of San Antonio shall constitute a proper order for said election, and, with such additions thereto as may be appropriate, shall be sufficient proclamation and notice of said election; and the Mayor is hereby directed to cause such notice to be published by posting one copy of such notice of in each of said election precincts at a public place, viz: at the respective voting places hereinbefore named at least thirty days before the date fixed for said election, and by causing such proclamation to be published in the official journal, viz: in the San Antonio Express a daily newspaper of general circulation, published in the City of San Antonio, at least once each week for and during the period of four weeks next preceeding said election.
