

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, DECEMBER, 1ST, A. D. 1930, 10:00 A.M.

PRESENT: Honorable C. M. Chambers, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners, Bushick, Rubiola, Steffler, Wright.

On motion, of Commissioner Steffler, duly seconded and carried, the reading of the Minutes of the Minutes of the meeting of November 24th, was dispensed with, and ordered approved.

---MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

Four bids for the paving of Vance Street, and one bid for the paving of Becker Street, were opened and referred to City Engineer for tabulation.

1. 2. Each proposal must be accompanied by a Certified Check or a Cashier's Check in the sum of THREE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$300.00), payable unconditionally to the City of San Antonio.

3. The bids shall be opened on the 15th day of December, A. D. 1930, at 10:00 o'clock

A. M. in the City Council Chamber of the City Hall of the City of San Antonio.

4. The successful bidder shall enter into a contract for the construction of this building on the City Standard Form approved by the City Attorney.

5. Each bid must be accompanied by the "Instructions to Bidders for Public Work", with the "Information Blank" duly completed.

6. The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

7. Notice shall be given by the publication of a copy of this Resolution, as provided by law, in the San Antonio Evening News.
