Mr. Gene Camargo, Planning Administrator, explained the proposed change which the Zoning Commission recommended be approved by the City Council. He also explained that there was 20% opposition, therefore nine votes were needed to approve this zoning change.

In response to Mr. Pyndus' question, Mr. Camargo stated that there was opposition present because of the specific use intended for the property in question.

Mr. Jess Wilson, representing the applicant, Mr. Roy E. Millican, Jr., stated that the proposed use of the property is for a water slide, 1/3 of the water slide is in San Antonio and 2/3's is in the Balcones Heights area.

After discussion, Mr. Alderete moved that the recommendation of the Zoning Commission be approved provided that the property is replatted, Mr. Eureste seconded the motion.

No citizen appeared to speak in opposition.

Dr. Cisneros stated that the organization was not ready for the April 19th Public Hearing. He asked staff to have this item on the agenda for next week to delay this hearing.

Council concurred to postpone this public hearing until further notice.

ROLAND ROAD

Mrs. Dutmer stated that since the City cannot afford to fix Roland Road, then perhaps this area could be deannexed in order that the County can take of this problem.

Mayor Cockrell asked staff to present a report to Council next week.

79-16 The meeting was recessed at 1:45 P.M. to allow the Council to go into Executive Session and the meeting reconvened at 4:00 P.M.

CITIZENS TO BE HEARDMR. JIM HOLLMON

Mr. Hollmon spoke about the computerization on the ticket service center at the Convention Center. He asked the City Council for an extension on the April 26th proposal deadline.

Mr. Steen stated that the City Council had not decided on putting up this project for bids but he asked Mr. Hollmon to be present at 5:00 P.M., April 25th, "B" Session, when Council considers this matter.

MR. E.L. RICHEY

Mr. E.L. Richey spoke regarding the article that appeared in the San Antonio Express on March 23, 1979 by Jack Anderson. He also spoke about American consumers paying on increased gas prices.

MR. KARL WURZ

Mr. Wurz spoke regarding the cost of turn-key nuclear plants that Commonwealth Edison owns and the increasing cost of nuclear plants. (A copy of his prepared statement is on file with the minutes of this meeting.)

MS. SYDNEY JANEK

Ms. Janek, representing the anti-nuclear protest group spoke on the increasing costs of nuclear plants. She thanked a few City Council members for their support.

MR. LOUIS CAMPOS

Mr. Campos, a member of Citizens Concerned about Nuclear Power, stated that he was involved in a legal proceeding regarding a public hearing to admit Citizens Concerned about Nuclear Power as a party to the hearing. He stated that lawyers are fighting to prevent a public hearing from being held to keep the citizens from participating. Mr. Campos read a statement from the newspaper concerning the 3-Mile Island Nuclear Plant incident. He asked that the City Council through the legal department, make a study of the liability of the Nuclear Plant.

Mayor Cockrell stated that she would get the information as to what is pending on the matter.

MRS. CORAL RYAN

Mrs. Ryan felt that the City Council should write a letter recommending that the citizens be allowed at this public hearing. She submitted a petition of 420 signatures requesting that a referendum be held before any more bonds are issued to pay for the South Texas Nuclear Project or before any rate increase by the City Public Service Board is approved. She requested that a public referendum be held before the monies are issued.

Mayor Cockrell stated that posting is needed to meet the requirements of the Open Meeting Law.

A few of the City Council members gave their opinion on the issue of the South Texas Nuclear Project.

MS. ANDREA DOORACK

Ms. Doorack presented a signed petition of 34 signatures, demanding an immediate halt to San Antonio's participation in the South Texas Nuclear Project until a referendum election is held. She urged other individuals, unions and organizations to join in the movement. She also spoke regarding the 3-Mile Island incident.

MR. RAY DESCH

Mr. Desch stated that he was still awaiting news from the City Staff as to whether or not they were able to find any available service for him.

Mr. Alex Briseno, Assistant City Manager, stated that different agencies had been contacted and they were unable to find anyone to provide the services for Mr. Desch. The offer Mrs. Walters had made would be pursued. He stated that he would contact Mrs. Walters and report back to Mr. Desch.

Mayor Cockrell explained the process by which Homemaker Services Program had lost their funding.

After discussion, Dr. Cisneros stated that he would handle the problem himself.

SISTER KATERI LARKIN

Sister Kateri Larkin spoke in support of the South Texas Nuclear Project stating that 12% of all energy used in the United States is Nuclear Energy and that this is the only source available.

SISTER MAUREEN LARKIN

Sister Maureen Larkin also spoke in support of the South Texas Nuclear Project. She made several references to quotations from Time Magazine, Literary Digest, Science Digest and many other sources. She urged all the citizens in American for Nuclear Energy, to bring out the true picture of the Nuclear Energy problem to the American people so that they will be correctly informed and will know how to face the wonder it has.

REVEREND CLIFTON BYRD

Reverend Byrd spoke in opposition to the South Texas Nuclear Project and San Antonio's participation in it. He stated that the majority of the City Council is denying the citizens an opportunity to make a decision on this matter.

MR. JERRY CLANCY

Mr. Clancy, President of the San Antonio Police Officer's Association, addressed a new proposed car-pool program which pertains to the parking lot west of the City Jail. He stated that seventy-five police officers are now utilizing that parking lot and it will be impossible for these policemen to carpool because of the shift change. He urged the City Council to allow parking spaces for these police officers.

After discussion, City Council concurred to give direction to staff to see if they can accommodate up to seventy-five slots and report back to Council.

79-16 Mayor Cockrell was obliged to leave the meeting, Mayor Pro-Tem Wing presided.

79-16 CITIZENS (Cont'd)

MR. CONCEPCION ELIZONDO

Mr. Elizondo, a resident of 943 San Angelo, stated that the San Antonio Country Club does not allow blacks, or spanish-surnamed Americans as members of their club. He asked whether the Mayor was a member of this organization.

MRS. ARMANDINA SALDIVAR

Mrs. Saldivar stated that her name, again, had been scratched out from the Citizens To Be Heard List and felt that she was being discriminated against.

Mrs. Saldivar asked about the "kick-backs" involving the City staff and the traffic ticket investigation.

In response to Mrs. Saldivar, Mr. Ortiz stated that the ticket situation was still being investigated and as far as the plumbing inspectors investigation, the case was not investigated thoroughly because the witnesses were afraid to become involved.

She also referred to some spanish lessons taken by the Mayor.

MR. DAVID WRIGHT

Mr. David Wright, a student of Trinity University, spoke in opposition to the South Texas Nuclear Project. He stated that there was an urgent need to look closer at this project and San Antonio's participation in it. He urged other citizens to come to the City Council and speak against the STNP.
