AN ORDINANCE **OF-287**

Amending Rule 39 of an Ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, which became effective on the 24th day of December, 1921, entitled "An Ordinance regulating traffic on the streets, plazas and public places of the City of San Antonio."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: It shall be unlawful for any vehicle, except vehicles used by doctors in emergency calls to park for a longer period than one hour, between the hours of eight A. M. and seven P. M., on certain streets within the business district of the City of San Antonio, as follows:
On Avenue D, between Houston and Travis Streets; on Avenue C between Houston and Third Streets; on Jefferson Street between Houston and Travis Streets; On Losoya Street between Commerce and Houston Streets; on Navarro Street between Market and Travis Streets; on St. Mary's Street between Market and Travis Streets; on Soledad Street between Commerce and Travis Streets; on Main Avenue between Commerce and Travis Streets; on Presa Street, between Market and Houston Streets; on North Alamo Street, between Commerce Street and Alamo Plaza, on the west side of Alamo Plaza, and on the east side of Alamo Plaza between the north line of Blum Street and the south line of the Alamo property.

AN ORDINANCE **OF-288**

Granting permit to H. E. Dickinson construct a sanitary sewer on Arlington Ct.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. That permission is hereby granted H. E. Dickinson to construct a Public Sanitary Sewer (8") on Arlington Court beginning at South Cherry St. and extending to Devoto St. (One Block) according to plat, line and grade made by the City Engineer hereto attached; the cost of said sewer being estimated about Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) to be paid by the said H. E. Dickinson. The final actual cost to be filed with the City Engineer within ten days after the completion of the sewer.

SECTION 2. The said sewer to be constructed to the City's line and grade and in accordance with City's standard specification for the construction of sewers in all particulars, and to maintain the sewer in the street for a period of 1 year after the date of the acceptance of the sewer by the City Engineer.

SECTION 3. "Conditioned" that no sewer service connections to this sewer shall be made until it has been completed and properly connected to the City's main, and duly accepted by the City.

SECTION 4. Said sewer, when completed to become the property of the City of San Antonio and part of its public sewer system.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom and the same shall take effect at once on the above mentioned condition.
