

AN ORDINANCE 2013-09-12-0631

ESTABLISHING NEW FEES AND AMENDING FEES AS INCLUDED WITHIN THE FISCAL YEAR 2014 BUDGET WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND AND WITHIN THE RESTRICTED FUNDS OF AIRPORT OPERATING & MAINTENANCE; CARVER SPECIAL REVENUE; DEVELOPMENT SERVICES; CONVENTION AND SPORTS FACILITIES FUND; CONVENTION VISITORS BUREAU FUND; PARKING; AND SOLID WASTE OPERATING & MAINTENANCE; AMENDING THE CITY CODE OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS (CITY CODE) TO REFLECT SUCH CHANGES; AND AMENDING CHAPTER 14 OF THE CITY CODE TO EXPAND USES OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES FEE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. Fees. Fees within the General Fund and within the Restricted Funds of Airport, Carver, Development Services, Hotel Occupancy Tax, Parking, and Solid Waste are hereby established and/or amended as provided for in Attachments A through P, inclusive, as follows:



**SECTION 3. **SECTION 5. Effective Date.** Unless specifically provided for otherwise, this Ordinance shall take effect October 1, 2013.







**GENERAL FUND**  
**ANIMAL CARE SERVICES**

**SECTION 1. Cat Combo Testing Fee.** A cat combo testing fee of \$15.00 is established to recover the cost of customer requested testing of cats for feline leukemia and feline aids disease prior to adoption.

Cat Combo Testing Fee: \$15.00 per animal

**SECTION 2. Micro-Chip Registration Fee.** A micro-chip registration fee of \$10.00 is established to recover the cost of the micro-chip registration procedure.

Micro-Chip Registration Fee: \$10.00 per animal

**SECTION 3. Non-City Processing (including owner surrender).** The Non-City Processing Fee (including owner surrender) is hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4.** Ordinance No. 2010-06-17-0555 is hereby amended to reflect the changes set forth above. The Fee Schedule attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein for all purposes shall replace and supersede Attachment I in Ordinance No. 2010-06-17-0555.

**ATTACHMENT D**  
**GENERAL FUND**  
**FIRE DEPARTMENT**

**SECTION 1. EMS Fees.** Subsection 15-3(a) of the City Code is hereby amended, in its entirety, as follows:

The fee for the transportation (transport) of patients requiring basic life support emergency medical services is \$800.00 per patient plus \$12.00 per mile. The fee for the transportation (transport) of patients requiring advanced life support level I emergency medical services is \$800.00 per patient plus \$12.00 per mile. The fee for the transportation (transport) of patients requiring advanced life support level II emergency medical services is \$800.00 per patient plus \$12.00 per mile. In addition to the transportation fee, a surcharge of \$100.00 is assessed to each nonresident patient who is transported for emergency medical services. A nonresident is any person who does not permanently reside within the territorial limits of the city or who resides within the territorial limits of an adjoining incorporated city which does not have a contract with the city to provide emergency medical services.

**SECTION 2. EMS Fees.** Subsection 15-3(b) of the City Code is hereby amended, in its entirety, as follows:

The fee for an emergency medical services call which does not require transportation (non-transport) is \$100.00 per patient.

**SECTION 3. Fire Prevention Fees.** Subsection 11-16(k) of the City Code is hereby amended, in its entirety, as follows:

(1) If special circumstances warrant, the chief may allow an inspector to conduct an inspection or test after normal working hours when a request is made by a contractor or owner's representative. The cost for each service is \$80.00 per man-hour with a minimum of two (2) hours. Payment shall be remitted at the fire marshal's office prior to the inspection.

(2) If special circumstances warrant, the use of a fire watch, the cost for each fire department employee engaged in the fire watch is \$80.00 per man-hour with a minimum of two (2) hours. Included as part of the \$80.00 fee is a fire watch administrative fee of \$2.50 per man-hour to cover the cost of administering the fire watch service.

**SECTION 4. Fire Prevention Fees.** Subsection 11-16(a)(23) is hereby established in the City Code and it shall provide as follows:

Mobile food establishment Annual Inspection Fee: \$150.00

**SECTION 5. Hazmat Fees.** Subsection 16-3(a) of the City Code is hereby amended, in its entirety, as follows:

An annual permit fee is hereby imposed on every person or corporation that owns, operates, or acts as the agent for any business location where one or more hazardous materials are used,

stored, transported, manufactured, generated, disposed or sold within the city, in the fee amounts and for the types of businesses or activities and for the quantities of chemical listed in table I.

**SECTION 6. Hazmat Fees.** Subsection 16-3(c) of the City Code is hereby amended, in its entirety, as follows:

The annual permit fees listed in table I shall be applied based upon the maximum quantity of a hazardous material present at any one time during the preceding year, except that each service station engaged in retail sales of fuel shall pay a flat fee of \$600.00 per location.

**SECTION 7. Hazmat Fees.** Table I contained in Section 16-3 of the City Code is hereby amended, in its entirety, as follows:

**SECTION 8. Hazmat Fees.** Subsection 16-3(e) of the City Code is hereby amended, in its entirety, as follows:

A "hazardous material response fee" shall be paid to the city fire department by the person, corporation, or entity which created the hazard or which owned the materials or chemicals and said fee shall be determined by the time required at the scene of the hazardous incident at the rate of \$800.00 per hour per apparatus per incident, plus any applicable fire department personnel overtime costs. The hourly rate shall be prorated in 15-minute increments at the beginning of each increment. All expendable commodities used at the scene will be billed at cost to the person, corporation, or entity which created the hazard or which owned the hazardous materials or chemicals.

**SECTION 9. Full Force and Effect.** All other provisions of the City Code shall remain in full force and effect, unless expressly amended by this Attachment or other provisions of this Ordinance.

**ATTACHMENT E**  
**GENERAL FUND**  
**HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

**SECTION 1. Air Pollution License.** An air pollution license fee of \$200.00 per year is established for businesses with small source air pollution emissions. This fee is contingent upon City Council approval of an Ordinance pertaining to air quality control providing for the requirement of such license.

**SECTION 2. Rabies Fee for Outside Testing.** A rabies testing fee of \$40.00 per test is established for rabies testing by veterinarian clinics located outside of the city limits. Section 15-2 of the City Code is revised to add subsection (j) as follows:

(j) Veterinarian clinics located outside of the city limits shall be charged a rabies testing fee of forty dollars (\$40.00) per test by the health department.

**SECTION 3. Full Force and Effect.** All provisions of the City Code shall remain in full force and effect, unless expressly amended by this Attachment or other provisions of this Ordinance.

**PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT**

**SECTION 1.** Section 22-7 of the City Code, *Charges for use of baseball, softball diamonds, gymnasiums*, is hereby deleted.

**SECTION 2.** Section 22-8 of the City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

**22-8.** Clubhouse rental fees.

- (1) Olmos Clubhouse: Thirty dollars (\$30.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.
- (2) Woodlawn Lake Island House: Thirty dollars (\$30.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.
- (3) ~~Community event facility reservation fee: One hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for four (4) hours and thirty dollars (\$30.00) for each additional hour~~ Hillside Acres Clubhouse: Thirty dollars (\$30.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.
- (4) Roosevelt Clubhouse: Fifty dollars (\$50.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.
- (45) A damage/cleanup deposit of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) is hereby authorized to be collected at the time reservation for aforesaid facilities is made. Said damage/cleanup is refundable to the user in whole or in part based on the condition rented premises are in after a reserved event. The amount of damage/cleanup deposit refunded to the user shall be determined by the director of parks and recreation or his designee and shall be based on policies established for each facility.
- (56) Pursuant to Ordinance 63005, of June 4, 1986, the Woodlawn Lake Community Association and Church's Fried Chicken, Inc., may henceforth use the Woodlawn Lake Island House without payment of established use fees; such free use being limited to official association functions and official company-sponsored events.

**SECTION 3.** Section 22-10 of the City Code, *Fee for use of park pavilions*, is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (a) A reservation use fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum on Monday through Thursday; and thirty dollars (\$30.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and holidays for park pavilions is hereby authorized. Users may reschedule use of the pavilion one (1) time with no charge by giving a minimum of thirty (30) days notice. One-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the reservation use fee will be refunded if use of the pavilion is canceled prior to thirty (30) days of the scheduled use. No refunds will be made if less than thirty (30) days notice of cancellation is given.
- (b) Koehler picnic area and pavilion reservation fees are as follows:
  - (1) Monday through Thursday: Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.
  - (2) Friday through Sunday or holidays: Thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.
- (c) Graff Pavilion reservation fees are as follows:
  - (1) Monday through Thursday: Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.
  - (2) Friday through Sunday or holidays: Thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.

- (3) Additional per use fee of the kitchen area in connection with any reservation, anytime  
.....90.00
- (d) Cypress Pavilion reservation fees are as follows:
  - (1) Monday through Thursday: Fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.
  - (2) Friday through Sunday or holidays: Thirty dollars (\$30.00) per hour with a four-hour minimum.

**SECTION 4.** Section 22-13 (a) of the City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

**22-13. Aquatics fees.**

- (a) The parks and recreation department is hereby authorized to charge the fees set by the following schedule for admission to San Antonio Natatorium.
  - (1) Persons under the age of eighteen (18) years ...\$2.00
  - (2) Persons aged eighteen (18) to fifty-nine (59) years ...\$4.00
  - (3) Persons aged sixty (60) years and over. . . \$3.00
  - (4) Adults (age eighteen (18) to fifty-nine (59) years) may purchase an adult swim pass good for twenty (20) admissions to the San Antonio Natatorium for seventy dollars (\$70.00). The adult swim pass must be used within ninety (90) days of issuance and will expire ninety (90) days after the date of issuance regardless of the number of admissions utilized.
  - (5) Seniors (aged sixty (60) years and over) may purchase a senior swim pass good for twenty (20) admissions to the San Antonio Natatorium for fifty dollars (\$50.00). The senior swim pass must be used within ninety (90) days of issuance and will expire ninety (90) days after the date of issuance regardless of the number of admissions utilized.
  - (6) Individuals requiring swimming exercises as a part of a health care provider directed therapeutic program may apply for no charge admission to the San Antonio Natatorium. Said application must be accompanied by a written confirmation of the need for therapeutic swimming exercise, and the duration of this need, by the health care provider and be for a specifically named individual. Upon review of said application and documentation, city parks and recreation staff may issue a permit for no charge admission to the San Antonio Natatorium for the duration of the certified need. Admission will be for swim times open to the general public only, and the city shall provide no other services beyond admission to the San Antonio Natatorium.

**SECTION 5.** Section 22-13 (f) of the City Code is hereby deleted.

**SECTION 6.** Section 22-13 (g) of the City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (g) There is hereby established a rental fee for the private use of the city's indoor and outdoor swimming pools for private splash parties. Said rentals will only occur before or after normal operating hours when the pools are not open to the public and will be for two (2) hour period only. In addition to the rental fee indicated below, persons renting city pools shall be required to pay the city for the cost of providing life guards for the event. The number of lifeguards required for this use will be determined by parks and recreation department staff based on the number of individuals utilizing the facility and the pool being utilized. Rental fees for said use shall be as follows:

This fee would continue to be collected on the CPS Energy monthly bill as authorized by state law.

**SECTION 2.** The increase of one dollar per month and the expansion of the use of the current Environmental Services Fee is hereby approved to provide the Parks and Recreation Department a dedicated resource for providing environmental services within the City’s parks system. The Director of the Finance Department and the Director of the Management and Budget Department shall create and establish a dedicated and restricted Parks Environmental Fund for the deposit of the Parks and Recreation Department portion of the Environmental Fee.

**SECTION 3. Monthly Environmental Fee.** The City Code, Sections 14-30(a) and 14-30(b), are hereby amended to reflect an increase of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) for the Solid Waste Management Department, and an increase of one dollar (\$1.00) for the Parks and Recreation Department, in the monthly environmental fee.
