

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 28th, A.D. 1939

PRESENT: Honorable Maury Maverick, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Davis, Hein, Steffler, and Lipscomb.

The Clerk read the following call, to-wit:

TO THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Gentlemen:

Under the authority vested in me as Mayor by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, I hereby call you into Special Session this 28th day of June, 1939, for the purpose of further hearing evidence for and against the repeal of a certain Ordinance passed and approved on the 17th day of May, 1920, prohibiting members of the Fire and Police Departments of the City of San Antonio from joining or affiliating with labor unions.

The Mayor called the Commission to order and asked Father Stanley Kusman of Saint Mary's University to lead the meeting in prayer.

J.W. Connaly, Secretary of the San Antonio Trades Council and James A. Petris, Vice-President of the International Association of Fire Fighters presented letters and testimonials in favor of the repeal of the ordinance.

J.B. Hunt, City Fireman; W.T. McCrabb, Secretary of Lodge No. 369, Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen; Fred Barr, Past Grand President of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and W.W. Goodell, City Fireman spoke in favor of the repeal of the Ordinance and of the benefits that would accrue to members of the Fire Department by its repeal.

The Mayor announced that action on the matter would be taken at some future date.
