PRESENT: Honorable Sam C. Bell, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Coy, Lambert, Heuermann, Wright.

--MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS--

Petition of Mackay Telegraph and Cable Co. for permit to extend int telegraph and long distance telephone service, was read and referred to City Attorney.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Streets and Public Imp; Petition for sewers in Providence Street.

S.A.Shoe Co. for permit to hang electric sign at 513 E.Houston St, was read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

No. 246 AN ORDINANCE MD-170

Appropriating \$102.60 to re-imbuse Incidental Expenditures Fund.

Appropriating \$58.33 to pay freight charges on street sweeper parts.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Fifty eight and 53/100 dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1919 General Fund to pay International and Great Northern Railway Company, freight charges on street sweeper parts shipped by Austin Western Machinery Co. from Harvey Ill. for use of street cleaning department.

No. 248 AN ORDINANCE -172

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$2500.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1919 General Fund to pay Jno. C. Thompson for services in connection with the \$3,950,000 bond issue, in accordance with the contract heretofore entered into by him and the City.
