05-193 AN ORDINANCE (3042)

CREATING A CONTRACT FOR ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES IN CONNECTION WITH THE
BUILDING OF PROPOSED FIRE STATION TO BE LOCATED AT CORNER OF SOUTH NEW
BRAUNFELS AVENUE AND STEVES AVENUE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance creates and manifests a contract by and between the City of San Antonio, acting by and through its Mayor, Maury Maverick, duly authorized by this ordinance, hereinafter called "CITY", and Adams & Adams, hereinafter called "ARCHITECTS", in terms as set out below.
2. The parties to these presents, in consideration of mutual promises and covenants, do agree, for themselves and their successors, as follows, to-wit:-
3. Architects agree to design and plan a building known and to be used as a Fire Station, to be located on the corner of New Braunfels Avenue and Steves Avenue, to the satisfaction and approval of the Commissioner of Fire and Police of the City of San Antonio.
4. Architects' services shall consist of the preparation of the preliminary sketches, working drawings, special detailed drawings, engineering and architectural services, finished plans and specifications and all necessary conferences with the officers and officials of the City of San Antonio and all supervision necessary to the completion of the said Fire Station.
Architects shall deliver to the City copies of all drawings and specifications and other data and information created or collected as a result of operations under this contract in order that the Chief of the Fire Department and the City Engineer shall have in their custody complete detailed records of these improvements.
5. Architects shall give their personal attention to the performance of this contract, and shall employ competent and skillful assistants to aid them.
6. In consideration of the faithful performance of this contract and the completion and delivery of the necessary plans and specifications and their acceptance by the City, and the supervision of the contractor, or contractors, to the completion of the building, the City agrees and is hereby bound and obligated to pay Architects the following compensation, to-wit:-
 - 5 percent of the reasonable cost of said completed structure, excluding Architects' fees, payable as follows:-
 - 3½ percent of the estimated construction costs, to be paid upon acceptance of said plans and specifications;
 - 1½ per cent in partial payments made from time to time during the progress of actual construction, in accordance with the progress in building made by the contractor or contractors, and in accordance with the estimated issued and payments made to contractor or contractors.

It is understood that the total compensation shall not exceed, in any event, 5 per cent of the actual construction cost, same to be adjusted on the basis of the final actual construction cost, and regardless of the estimated cost.

Any element which may have been omitted in the description of the work of Architects but which is fairly implied, shall be deemed to be included in this contract and shall be done by the Architects as if the same had been specifically stated, without any additional charge to the City.

7. Architects shall perform their services, to the exclusive and arbitrary satisfaction of the City of San Antonio.

8. The acceptance of this contract shall be manifested by the signatures below.

AN ORDINANCE (3044)

ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE SECURITIES PLEDGED BY THE NATIONAL BANK OF COMMERCE OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, TO SECURE THE CITY FUNDS DEPOSITED AND TO BE DEPOSITED IN SAID BANK BY THE CITY DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1940, AND DIRECTING THE DEPOSITING OF SAID SECURITIES FOR SAFE KEEPING AND RELEASING THE SURETIES ON BONDS ON RECEIPT NO. 38, GIVEN BY SAID BANK AS CITY DEPOSITORY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the securities pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio by the National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas, as City Depository, to secure the fund of said City, deposited and to be deposited in said Bank during the Fiscal Year beginning June 1, 1940 and ending May 31, 1941, be and the same are hereby accepted and approved and that receipt signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, be given said Bank for securities pledged by it, which said securities are described as follows:

Securities pledged by the National Bank of Commerce are described in Receipt No. 34 attached to Ordinance dated December 5, 1940, Receipt No. 37 attached to Ordinance dated January 30, 1941, Receipt No. 39 attached to Ordinance dated March 6, 1941, and attached Receipts Nos. 40 to 43, inclusive, which are made a part of this Ordinance by references as fully as if they were specified herein.

The receipts given to said Bank for securities pledged by it shall recite, in substance, that the said securities have been duly pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio, Texas, by the National Bank of Commerce, San Antonio, Texas, as Depository of said City, for the purpose of securing the funds of said City deposited and to be deposited in said Bank during the Fiscal Year beginning June 1, 1940, upon the terms and conditions prescribed and provided by law.

It is directed that said securities be deposited by the Mayor, for safe keeping in a safety deposit box in the vaults of the National Bank of Commerce, rented by the City from said Bank.

That all securities on all bonds on Receipt No. 38, given to said City by said National Bank of Commerce, as City Depository, be and are hereby released from further liability as sureties on such bonds.

AN ORDINANCE (3064)

CREATING AND MANIFESTING A CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT
AS ARCHITECTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDINGS
AT THE NEW SAN ANTONIO MUNICIPAL AIRPORT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance creates and manifests a contract by and between the City of San Antonio, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its Mayor, duly authorized hereby, hereinafter termed "CITY", and Phelps & Dewees & Simmons, Atlee B. and Robert M. Ayres, Bartlett Coker and Marvin Eickenroht, hereinafter called "ARCHITECTS", which said agreement is in terms, conditions and provisions as follows:

2. The parties hereto each, in consideration of the agreements made herein, have mutually covenanted, and do hereby mutually agree and covenant, as follows:

3. Architects shall design and plan the construction of the airport buildings and/or such work in connection with site development, walks, landscaping, drives, etc., as required by the Mayor and Commissioners, at the San Antonio Municipal Airport, to be built upon those certain tracts or parcels of land in Bexar County, Texas, lying about four (4) miles north of the City of San Antonio which were recently purchased by said City for the erection of such Airport. Said designing and planning shall be done in accordance with the directions of the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, whose suggestions and directions shall be followed by Architects from time to time as such building progresses, and said designing and planning shall be subject to the approval of the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

4. The services of Architects shall consist of preliminary surveys, consist of preliminary surveys, consultations, designs, estimates, plans and specifications, working drawings, large scale and full size drawings, and the drafting of such other documents as may be necessary for the approval of the building by the Work Projects Administration and the City of San Antonio and such other governmental agencies as have, or may have, control of the work.

5. Architects shall give their personal attention to the execution of this contract and shall employ only competent and skillful assistants in the performance thereof. If, at any time, the City shall notify Architects, and furnish proof, that any person employed by them is incompetent and unskillful or disobedient, Architects shall forthwith discharge such person and such person shall not be re-employed on said buildings without the written consent of the City. The City's representative at the airport site shall determine the sufficiency of proof furnished hereunder.

6. Architects shall, from time to time, deliver to the proper or designated City Official all drawings, specifications, preliminary estimates and plans, including at least three sets of plans and specifications, all of which may be retained in the custody of the City. It is understood that drawings and specifications as instruments of service remain the property of the Architects, whether the work for which they are made is executed or not.

7. For the performance of the services above outlined, the City of San Antonio hereby agrees, promises, binds and obligates itself to pay to the Architects, out of the Airport Fund of 1941 of said City, a sum equal to three and one-half (3½%) per cent of the total actual construction cost of the buildings and other structures planned, excluding fees for architectural services as herein provided, to be paid at the times and in the manner as follows:

(a) Upon execution hereof and the adoption of this contract as an ordinance one (1%) per cent of the amount equal to the total approved estimated cost of the buildings and other structures on the field, all such amounts being fully set out and itemized in WPA Form 301 (revised August 15, 1938), dated February 15, 1941, executed by Maury Maverick, Mayor of the City of San Antonio, consisting of a proposal heretofore made by the City to Work Projects Administration for the construction of a complete Class 4 airport, and said proposal

is adopted as a part hereof for all purposes.

(b) Two and one-half ($2\frac{1}{2}\%$) per cent of the approved estimated cost of the buildings and other structures on the field, to be paid to Architects upon completion and approval of the working drawings, plans and specifications for the erection of said buildings.

No deductions shall be made from the Architects' fees on account of penalties, liquidated damages or other sums withheld from payments to contractors performing the actual construction work of said buildings.

8. Architects shall be entitled to compensation for major changes which add to the cost of the work or for work not included in the original plans and specifications approved by the City, on the same basis as above for any additional work ordered by the City to be done by Architects.

9. In addition to other services of Architects, as above outlined and specified, Architects agree to draft the necessary forms of proposals and contracts for the said buildings, and to keep the accounts for said buildings, to issue the necessary certificates of payment and to handle the general administration and supervision of the work, including all supervision necessary or proper to be done in and about the premises, and, from time to time, make such reports in connection with such supervision as the City may desire, and, for such supervisory services, the City of San Antonio further agrees to pay, and is hereby bound and obligated to pay, to the Architects, out of the same fund above specified, the sum of one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}\%$) per cent of the total actual construction cost of the buildings erected, in accordance with the plans and specifications furnished by said Architects, as the work progresses, such sums to be payable monthly to Architects and to be based upon the accounts and records of labor and material costs and any other costs as may be from time to time incurred and/or paid by the City or Work Projects Administration; save and except, however, that the City shall retain ten (10%) per cent of each of such monthly payments until the full and final completion of the airport and the acceptance of the entire project by the City, whereupon said accumulation of ten (10%) per cent of the monthly supervision fee shall be paid to Architects as a final fee, but it is agreed that such sum shall be subject to adjustments based upon the final construction cost of the buildings erected hereunder.

10. It is understood and agreed that the fees payable hereunder are to be divided between the Architects as follows:

One-third to Phelps & Dewees & Simmons; one-third to Ayres & Ayres; and one-sixth each to Bartlett Cocke and Marvin Eickenroht.

11. The City and the Architects each bind themselves, their partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns to each other and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns of each other in respect of all covenants of this agreement. Except as above, neither the City, nor the Architects shall assign, sublet or transfer his interests in this agreement without the written consent of the other.

12. It is understood and agreed that the Architects will fully comply with the rules and regulations of the Work Projects Administration as directed by the Acting State Director of said Administration.

W. Beretta Engineers, Inc., Matthews and Kenan, W. E. Simpson Company and H. R. F. Helland and Frank T. Drought, Associates, hereinafter called "Engineers", which said agreement is in terms, conditions and provisions, as follows:

2. The parties hereto, each in consideration of the agreements made herein, have mutually agreed and covenanted, and do hereby mutually agree and covenant, as follows:

3. Engineers shall design and plan the construction of the San Antonio Municipal Airport to be built upon those certain tracts or parcels of land in Bexar County, Texas, lying about four (4) miles north of the City of San Antonio which were recently purchased by said City for the erection of such Airport. Such designing and planning to be done in accordance with the directions of the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, whose suggestions and directions shall be followed by Engineers from time to time as such project progresses, and the decisions of the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio shall be final in this regard.

4. The services of Engineers shall consist of preliminary surveys, consultation, designs, estimates, specifications and such other documents necessary for the approval of the project by the Work Projects Administration and the City of San Antonio and such other governmental agencies as have, or may have, control of the work. Following the approval of the project by such agencies, further pre-construction services of Engineers will consist of final surveys, complete designs, detailed plans, specifications, estimates, contract documents,

consultation, coordination of the work and all other engineering services necessary for the actual beginning and carrying on of the engineering construction. Engineers shall also furnish soil studies with recommendations, surveys and topographic work including clearing, grading, drainage, general field layout, lighting, utilities, sanitary facilities, driveways, fencing and any such other engineering services as may be necessary in connection with the construction of such project, excluding engineering services in connection with the Administration Building and hangars and shops to be erected in connection with the project.

6. Engineers shall give their personal attention to the execution of this contract and shall employ only competent and skillful assistants in the performance thereof. If at any time the City shall notify Engineers and furnish proof that any person employed by them is incompetent, unskillful or disobedient, Engineers shall forthwith discharge such person and such person shall not be re-employed on said project without the written consent of the City. The Engineer of the City of San Antonio and the Manager of the Municipal Airport and two representatives of the Engineers shall determine the sufficiency of proof furnished hereunder.

7. Engineers shall, from time to time, deliver to the proper or designated city official all drawings, specifications, estimates and plans, and one reproduced copy in addition to the original plans, all of which may be retained in the custody of the City.

8. For the performance of the services above outline, the City of San Antonio hereby agrees, promises, binds and obligates itself, to pay to the Engineers out of the Airport Fund of 1941 of said City a sum of Money as Engineers' fees, equal to three and one-half (3½%) per cent of the amount obtained by deducting from the total actual cost of the project, as same is described, set out and itemized in the WPA Form 301 hereinafter referred to, the cost of the land, the cost of the Administration Building or buildings, hangars and shops, and the fees for engineering services as herein provided, to be paid at the times and in the manner as follows:

(a) Upon execution hereof and the adoption of this contract as an ordinance, one and one-half (1½%) per cent of the amount obtained by deducting from the total estimated cost of the project the cost of the land, the cost of the Administration Building or buildings, hangars and shops, and the engineering fees provided herein, all such amounts being fully set out and itemized in WPA Form 301 (revised August 16, 1938), dated February 15, 1941, executed by Maury Maverick, Mayor of the City of San Antonio, consisting of a proposal heretofore made by the City to Work Projects Administration for the construction of a complete Class 4 Airport and said proposal is adopted as a part hereof for all purposes.

(b) Two (2%) per cent of the estimated costs of each of the several divisions of the work, labor and materials of the airport project, to be paid to engineers as and when the estimated cost of such divisions of work, labor and materials as drainage, runways, fencing, etc., shall have been approved, two (2%) per cent of such approved costs on each such division shall then be due and paid to Engineers.

(c) Upon completion and acceptance of the project, proper adjustment of the fees provided in Subdivisions (a) and (b) above shall be made to the end that the City shall pay, and the Engineers shall receive, not to exceed three and one-half (3½%) per cent of the amount obtained by deducting from the total actual cost of the project, as same is described, set out and itemized in WPA Form 301 above referred to, the cost of the land, the cost of the Administration Building or buildings, hangars and shops, and the fees for engineering services as

herein provided.

9. The Engineers shall not be entitled to any compensation for work not included in plans and specifications approved by the City and the Work Projects Administration, but Engineers shall be paid for additional services on the same basis as above for any additional work ordered by the City to be done by Engineers.

10. Should the execution of any work designated and specified by the Engineers be abandoned by the City, Engineers shall be paid therefor only in the proportion that the abandoned work bears to the finished work, but the amount of such payment shall not exceed sixty (60%) per cent of the fee which would have been paid if the work had progressed to completion if such abandonment occurs before the acceptance of the plans and specifications by the City, nor shall the amount of such payment exceed seventy-five (75%) per cent of such fee if such abandonment occurs after the acceptance of such plans and specifications by the City.

11. In addition to all other services of Engineers as above outlined and specified Engineers agree to supervise all of the work done and materials furnished, including all supervision necessary or proper to be done in and about the premises, but excluding supervision of the Administration Building, hangars and shops, and from time to time make such reports in connection with such supervision as the City may desire. and for such supervision services the City of San Antonio further agrees to pay and is hereby bound and obligated to pay to the Engineers out of the same fund above specified the sum of one and one-half (1½%) per cent of the total actual construction cost as the work progresses, such sum to be payable monthly to Engineers and to be based upon the accounts and records of labor and material costs, and any other cost, as may be from time to time incurred and/or paid by the City or Work Projects Administration; save and except, however, that the City shall retain ten (10%) per cent of each of such monthly payments until the full and final completion of the Airport and the acceptance of the entire project by the City, whereupon said accumulation of ten (10%) per cent of the monthly supervision fee shall be paid to Engineers as a final fee, but it is agreed that such sum shall be subject to adjustments based upon the total actual construction cost of the project.

12. It is understood and agreed that the "total actual construction cost" mentioned in Section 11 hereof shall not include the cost of the land, the cost of the Administration Building or buildings, hangars and shops, and the engineering fees provided for in Section 8 through 11 hereof.

13. Neither the City nor the Engineers shall assign, sublet or transfer any interest in this agreement without the written consent of the other.

14. For convenience of operating hereunder, the Engineers designate J. W. Beretta Engineers, Inc., as Chief Engineer and as their agent and attorney-in-fact for the purpose of receiving any notice and demand from the City or any governmental agency in relation to the project and for the further purpose of receiving for their account all sums of money due and payable hereunder; and agree that any notice and/or payment to J. W. Beretta Engineers, Inc., shall be for their account and shall to such extent absolve the City of any obligation to them therefor.

AN ORDINANCE (3072)

AMENDING SECTION 2 OF AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ZONING REGULATIONS AND DISTRICTS, ETC.", PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO ON THE 3D DAY OF NOVEMBER, A. D. 1938, AS AMENDED, BY ADDING AFTER PARAGRAPH 3.5 OF SECTION 2 OF SAID ORDINANCE A NEW PARAGRAPH DESIGNATED 3.6; DECLARING THAT IF ANY SECTION, SUBSECTION, SENTENCE, CLAUSE OR PHRASE OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE HELD UNCONSTITUTIONAL OR INVALID, SUCH HOLDING OR DECISION SHALL NOT AFFECT THE VALIDITY OF THE REMAINING PORTIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That Section 2 of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ZONING REGULATIONS AND DISTRICTS, ETC." passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, on the 3d day of November, A. D. 1938, as amended, be and the same is hereby amended by adding after paragraph 3.5 of said Section 2, the following new paragraph, to be designated "3.6", as follows:

"3.6 On and after May 1, 1941, all of the property designated as follows, to-wit: All those certain parts of New City Blocks 3001, 2952, 1834, 1839, 1858, 1857, 1840, 1833, 1816 and 1815, abutting on San Pedro Avenue, between the center line of West Mulberry Avenue and the center line of West Craig Place, and to a depth of one hundred (100) feet east from the East line of San Pedro Avenue and to a depth of one hundred (100) feet west from the West line of San Pedro Avenue, classified as 'E Apartment District' on Map No. 10 of the maps mentioned in paragraph 3 next above, shall cease to be classified as 'E Apartment District' and shall thereafter be classified as 'F Local Retail District'.

Any stores erected in said 'F Local Retail District' shall face San Pedro Avenue".

2. If any section, sub-section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance shall for any reason be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such holding or decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

3. WHEREAS, considerable building is contemplated in the area above set out and lack of adequate ordinances and provisions controlling the construction and use of buildings and other structures within the City of San Antonio, the lack of regulations regulating the use to which lands and buildings of the City of San Antonio may be devoted, creates an urgency and emergency in behalf of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare necessitating that this ordinance become effective at once upon its passage by a four-fifths (4-5) majority of the Board of Commissioners; and it is so ordered.

AN ORDINANCE (3092)

ADOPTING THE PROVISIONS OF HOUSE BILL NO. 76, ACTS OF FORTY SEVENTH LEGISLATURE, REGULAR SESSION, AND AUTHORIZING THE TAX COLLECTOR TO BE GOVERNED THEREBY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. WHEREAS House Bill No. 76 was passed and enacted by the Forty Seventh Legislature of the State of Texas remitting penalties and interest on ad valorem taxes delinquent on or before July 1, 1940, provided said delinquent taxes are paid on or before November 1st, 1941, said House Bill No. 76 as approved by the Governor of the State of Texas and now on file with the Secretary of State, being hereby referred to for all purposes.

2. NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of San Antonio finds thatn an unusual and excessive default in the payment of ad valorem taxes has occurred, and that an extension of time for the payment of such delinquent ad valorem taxes will promote and accelerate the collection thereof and directs the City Clerk to record these findings and this Ordinance at once in the Ordinance Records; and that said House Bill No. 76 be and the same is hereby adopted by the City of San Antonio, according to all of its applicable provisions.

3. NOW, THEREFORE, the Tax Collector of the City of the City of San Antonio, in pursuance with the provisions of said House Bill 76, is authorized and directed to collect delinquent ad valorem taxes in accordance therewith:

4. And that all interest and penalties that have accrued on all ad valorem taxes of the City of San Antonio and of the San Antonio Independent School District that were delinquent on July 1st, 1940, are hereby released provided said ad valorem taxes are paid on or before November 1st, 1941; and providing further that ^ynone desiring to pay at one time all the delinquent taxes for only one year, wherein such taxes are delinquent for more than one year, shall have the right to pay same but without remission of penalties and interest; provided, however, that any person availing themselves of the benefits of this Act and Ordinance shall be required to pay all delinquent ad valorem taxes due the City of San Antonio and the San Antonio Dependent School District on any specific piéce of property on which such taxes are delinquent before the penalties and interest may be released as herein provided; conditioned that a 6% penalty on the total amount delinquent be paid on such property.

5. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to penalties and interest on taxes which have been reduced to final judgment.

AN ORDINANCE (3129)

PROVIDING FOR EXTENSION OF CERTAIN BOUNDARY LIMITS OF THE CITY
SAN ANTONIO AND THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TERRITORY
NORTH OF THE PRESENT CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the following described land and territory lying adjacent to the City of San Antonio be and the same is hereby added and annexed to the City of San Antonio and that said territory hereinafter described shall hereafter be included in the boundary limits of the City of San Antonio; and the present boundary limits of said City at the various points contiguous to the area hereinafter described are altered and amended so as to include said area within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, to-wit: In the County of Bexar and State of Texas, territory north of the present city limits, and being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

2. Beginning at the intersection of the west property line of West Avenue and the south property line of Alhambra Street, being a corner on the present north city limits line;

Thence eastward along the said north city limits line to an intersection with the east line of Buckeye Avenue;

Thence northward along said east line of Buckeye Avenue to an intersection with the north line of El Monte Street;

Thence westward along the north line of El Monte Street;

Thence westward along the north line of El Monte Street to an intersection with the west line of West Avenue;

Thence southward along the west line of West Avenue to the place of beginning.

(These metes and bounds are intended to include Blocks 174, 175, 184 and 185 of the Los Angeles Heights Addition, being a part of County Block 4060).

3. That the abovedescribed additional territory and area so annexed shall be a part of the City of San Antonio and the property so added therein shall bear its pro rata part of the taxes levied by the City of San Antonio, and the inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of all of the other citizens of the City of San Antonio and shall be bound by the acts, ordinances, resolutions and regulations of the City of San Antonio.

4. The City Engineer shall change the records of his office to conform to the new bounds and limits of the City of San Antonio.

5. The City Tax Assessor shall change the records of his office to conform to the new bounds and limits and shall proceed to assess taxes and collect taxes on the property included in the new bounds and limits as now provided by the Charter and ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

6. All ordinances of said City shall apply to the persons and property included within said annexed area to the City of San Antonio as hereinabove specified.

7. That this ordinance shall be published and passed in the manner provided in Section 2, paragraph 2, of the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

WHEREAS, arrangements cannot now be perfected and negotiated before June 1, 1941, for a prolonged term of years for the extension and operation of said franchise granted in such Ordinance by the City of San Antonio;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio that all matters, things, terms and conditions stipulated and provided for in said Ordinance No. 609 heretofore passed by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 14th day of September, 1939, and which became effective on September 19, 1939, be now extended and kept in full force and effect for a period of Sixty days (60) days from June 1, 1941.

AN ORDINANCE (3137)

APPROVING THE ACTION OF THE FIRE AND POLICE CIVIL SERVICE BOARD IN ADDING TO THE CIVIL SERVICE CODE.

WHEREAS, by motion duly made, seconded and carried unanimously by the Fire and Police Civil Service Board of the City of San Antonio, it was determined, in a special meeting properly called and held, that the rules hereinafter quoted be adopted and added to the general specifications and rules and regulations for the Fire and Police Departments now in effect, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the action of the Fire and Police Civil Service Board, in adding the rules

and regulations hereinafter quoted and numbered Sections 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42 and 43, be and the same is hereby in all things approved and said rules and regulations are hereby added to the general specifications and rules and regulations for the Fire and Police Departments now in effect, all in accordance with the action of the Fire and Police Civil Service Board of the City of San Antonio.

2. Said provisions above referred to read as follows:

"PROMOTIONS

"37. Promotions in the Departments under Civil Service shall be made by the Commissioner of Fire and Police from persons selected from the next lower rank in the service, under the conditions specified herein.

"POLICE DEPARTMENT PROMOTIONS

"38. To be eligible for appointment in Grade 4 of the Police Department, the appointee must have served at least two years continuously in Grade 3, next preceding the time of the appointment.

"39. To be eligible for appointment in Grade 3 of the Police Department, appointee must have served at least two years continuously in Grade 2, next preceding the appointment.

"40. To be eligible for appointment in Grade 2 of the Police Department, appointee must have served at least three years continuously in Grade 1, next preceding the appointment.

"PROMOTIONS IN THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

"41. To be eligible for appointment in Grade 4 of the Fire Department, the appointee must have served at least two years continuously in Grade 3, next preceding the time of the appointment.

"42. To be eligible for appointment in Grade 3 of the Fire Department, appointee must have served at least two years continuously in Grade 2, next preceding the appointment.

"43. To be eligible for appointment in Grade 2 of the Fire Department, appointee must have served at least three years continuously in Grade 1, next preceding the appointment."

Nothing herein shall be construed to repeal an ordinance passed and approved on June 13, 1940, entitled "An Ordinance Approving the Action of the Fire and Police Civil Service Board in adding to the Civil Service Code."

 PROVIDING FOR AN AUDIT OF CITY BOOKS AND CONTRACT WITH CARNEIRO,
 CHUMNEY & CO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the ordinance creates and manifests a contract by and between the City of San Antonio and Carneiro, Chumney & Co., as follows:

2. THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into, by and between the City of San Antonio, a municipal corporation under the laws of the State of Texas, situated in the County of Bexar Party of the First Part, hereinafter called "CITY"; and Carneiro, Chumney & Co., a partnership consisting of M. S. Carneiro and W. T. Chumney, of the County of Bexar and State of Texas, Party of the Second Part, hereinafter called "CONTRACTOR", said agreement being made under the authority of the Charter and Ordinances of the City; WITNESSETH:-

3. That the parties to these presents, each in consideration of the agreements on the part of the other, do hereby mutually covenant and agree, the City for itself and its successors, and the Contractor for themselves, their heirs, executors and administrators, as follows, to-wit:

4. The Contractor, at his own cost and expense, shall furnish all labor, material and accessories necessary and proper for the purpose, at his own cost and expense, make a detailed audit of all the Departments of the City, except the Water Works Department, for the fiscal year ending May 31, 1941. It is understood that work will begin within a reasonable time.

5. At the completion of the audit, the Contractor shall deliver to the City four copies of a written report thereon.

6. The Contractor acknowledges that he accepts the above specification of the work to be performed by him, and admits that the same is sufficient for its intended purpose, and that the work can be executed successfully and completed in accord therewith without any additional work other than such as is necessarily implied and included, and to be inferred herefrom, and that any detail that may have been omitted in the description shall be done as if the same were specifically stated, and without additional charge.

7. That, subject only to the prices, terms and stipulations of this contract, the written estimate and certificate of the City Auditor shall be final and conclusive to fix and determine any or all amounts payable hereunder to the Contractor by the City, for which amounts such estimate of the Auditor shall be a condition precedent to the right of the Contractor to receive payment.

8. In consideration of the faithful performance of this contract by the Contractor and the completion of the work herein stipulated, the City of San Antonio agrees and shall be and is hereby bound and obligated to pay the Contractor for such work at the rate of \$25.00 per day for Senior Accountants, and \$15.00 per day for Junior Accountants, but not to exceed a maximum of \$8,000.00.

9. The Contractor shall render a progress report on the 12th and the 28th day of each month during the course of the work showing the nature and extent of the work done, the accounts examined and the departments included, together with the number of men engaged on the work, the rate, the time and the amount for each man, and the total amount due for that period; and, on the receipt of it, confirmed by the certificate of the City Auditor, the Contractor shall be paid an amount equal to eighty-five (85%) per cent of the compensation earned during such period, computed on the per diem basis specified.

10. The Contractor shall not be paid any money in excess of the amount paid upon such estimates, unless and until each and all of the stipulations and requirements of this contract shall have been faithfully performed by the Contractor, and the final reports delivered to the City, and accepted by the City, in accord with this contract, and such completion, delivery and acceptance, evidenced by a Resolution of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

11. Within thirty days after the date of the acceptance of such work, the final estimate for final settlement upon this contract shall be prepared by the Auditor and the same having been first approved by the signature of the Mayor and the Auditor, the City shall pay to the Contractor the amount of the final estimate; taking into consideration all amounts previously retained from the estimates remaining payable to the Contractor, and deducting from the amount of such final estimate and retaining, any and all sums which are to be deducted by the City, or due by the Contractor to the City, or claim for labor furnished by any person, or which should be retained and held by the City for any reason.

12. The Contractor will comply with all laws regulating labor and relating to employers and employees and all other things being equal the Contractor shall use and employ San Antonio labor and material.

13. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, said City of San Antonio, First Party herein, has lawfully caused these presents to be executed by the hand of Maury Maverick, Mayor of said City, and the corporate seal of said City to be hereunto affixed and this instrument to be attested by the City Clerk; and the said Carneiro, Chumney & Co., Contractor, Second Party, acting by the hand of W. T. CHUMNEY - - - - - thereunto duly authorized, does now sign, execute and deliver this instrument as the contract and agreement of said Second Party.
