AN ORDINANCE *OH-38*

Levying an advalorem and Occupation tax for the support of the City Government of the City of San Antonio, and levying a tax to pay the interest on the bonded debt of said City, and to create a sinking fund thereof, and a special tax for the support of the Carnegie Library in said City, all said taxes being levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1: That there is hereby levied for general purposes for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, on all property, real, personal, and mixed, within the limits of the City of San Antonio, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of the State, and Ordinances of this City, an Advalorem Tax of and at the rate of One and 25/100 dollars (\$1.25) upon every One Hundred Dollars valuation.

Section 2: That to provide for the payment of the annual interest on all outstanding bonds of the City, issued prior to the year 1913, other than district improvement Bonds, and to produce a sinking fund with which to pay such bonded indebtedness at maturity, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Three (3) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned or referred to in

Section 1 hereof; and for the fiscal year 1930 all collections on account of said levy made, shall be received and expended as a part of the General Sinking Fund of said Bonds the same as heretofore, notwithstanding any ordinance to the contrary.

Section 3: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$1,500,000.00 for Paving Public Streets and Public Places, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they may severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Three and Twenty Two one-hundredth (3.22) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 4: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$800,000.00 for constructing Sanitary Sewers, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of One and Sixty Three one-hundredth (1.63) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation, on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 5: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$25,000.00 for Constructing Sidewalks & Curbing, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Four one-hundredth (04) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 6: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$175,000.00 for Construction a Police and Fire Station, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930, and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Thirty One one-hundredth (.31) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 7: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$375,000.00 for Opening and Widening Streets, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930, and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Seventy one-hundredth (.70) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 8: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for the construction of Concrete bridges, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Nineteen one-hundredth (.19) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 9: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$300,000.00 for constructing Storm Sewers and Drains, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Fifty Eight one-hundredth (.58) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 10: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$125,000.00 for constructing a City Hospital, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the

fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Twenty Four one-hundredth (.24) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 11: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for Constructing Garbage Incinerators and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Nine one-hundredth (09) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 12: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$900,000.00 for Street Paving, Storm Sewers and Drains and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Two and Six one-hundredth (2.06) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 13: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$500,000.00 for Sanitary Sewers, Mains and Laterals, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of One and Fifteen one-hundredth (1.15) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 14: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for Construction of Sidewalks and Curbing and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special of Nine one-hundredth (.09) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 15: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$150,000.00 for Fire and Police Station Building, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Thirty Four one-hundredth (.34) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 16: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Garbage Incinerator Extensions, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Twenty two one-hundredth (.22) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 17: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$950,000.00 for Opening & Widening and Straightening Streets, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930, and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Two and Sixteen one-hundredth (2.16) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 18: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for Constructing Permanent Bridges and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a specialtax of Forty Six one-hundredth (.46) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 19: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$500,000.00 for Public Auditorium Building, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of One and Fourteen one-hundredth (1.14) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 20: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of Bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for Public Parks Improvements, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Forty Six (.46) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 21: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for San Antonio River Improvements, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Forty Six one-hundredth (.46) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 22: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919 in the sum of \$200,000.00 for the Market House Annex, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931 a special tax of Forty Six one-hundredth (.46) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 23: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924 in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Public Park Improvement, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Twenty Three one-hundredth (.23) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 24: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$450,000.00 for Street Paving and Street Marking, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of One and Thirteen one-hundredth (1.13) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 25: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924 in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Sanitary Sewers, Mains and Laterals, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Twenty Three one-hundredth (.23) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 26: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Fire & Police Department Building, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Twenty ^{Three} one-hundredth (.23) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 27: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$2,800,000.00 for Flood Prevention and to create a sinking fund

for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Seven and Twenty Three one-hundredth (7.23) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 28: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$250,000.00 for Opening & Widening and Straightening of Public Streets and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Sixty one-hundredth (.60) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 29: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Construction Permanent Bridges, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Twenty Three one-hundredth (.23) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 30: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$250,000.00 for Storm Sewers and Drains and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Sixty one-hundredth (.60) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 31: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for Public Auditorium Building and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Fifty two one-hundredth (.52) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 32: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1926, in the sum of \$400,000.00 for Opening and Widening and Straightening of Public Streets and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Sixty Eight one-hundredth (.68) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 33: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1926, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Constructing Permanent Bridges, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Thirty Two one-hundredth (.32) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 34: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1926, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for Public Auditorium Building and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Fifty Three one-hundredth (.53) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 35: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1926, in the sum of \$250,000.00 for Paving Public Streets and Public Places, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Forty one-hundredth (.40) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 36: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1926, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for Sewers and Drains and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Seven one-hundredth (.07) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

X Section 37: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1927, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for City Hospital Building, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they may severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Thirteen one-hundredth (.13) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 38: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1927, in the sum of \$250,000.00 for City Hall building, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Sixty Three one-hundredth (.63) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 39: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1927, in the sum of \$150,000.00 for building Incinerators and Garbage loading stations, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Thirty Seven one-hundredth (.37) cents on every One Hundred dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 40: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1927, in the sum of \$750,000.00 for construction of a permanent system of Sewers and Drains, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of One and Eighty Eight one-hundredth (1.88) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 41: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1927, in the sum of \$300,000.00 for Street Paving and Grading and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Seventy Three one-hundredth (.73) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 57: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated August 1, 1928 in the sum of \$55,000.00 for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring "Spanish Governor's Palace", and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930, and ending May 31, a special tax of Sixteen one-hundredth (.16) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 58: That to provide for the support and maintenance of the Carnegie Library in said City, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931 a special tax of Three (3) cents on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 59: That to provide funds for a special Recreation Fund, authorized under the provision of an Ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on Jan. 16, 1929, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Two (2) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 60: That to provide funds for a special Advertising Fund, authorized under the provision of an Ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on Jan. 16, 1929, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of Five (5) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 61: That to provide funds to pay current expenses in the matter of Firemen, Policemen and Fire Alarm Operators, Pension Fund, authorized under the provision of an Ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on August 26, 1929, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1930 and ending May 31, 1931, a special tax of One (1) cent on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Relating to the licensing of journeymen and apprentice painters, paperhangers or decorators; and providing penalties for the violation hereof.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to work as a journeyman or apprentice painter, paperhanger or decorator in the City of San Antonio, Texas, without first having obtained a license as provided in this ordinance.

Section 2. A journeyman or apprentice painter, paperhanger or decorator within the meaning of this ordinance is a person who works as a painter, paperhanger or decorator for wages, salary, fee, percentage or other compensation other than for a contract price. An apprentice painter, paperhanger or decorator shall be governed by all of the provisions of this act with the exception of the license fee which shall be one-half of that of the journeyman.

Section 3. Every person desiring to work as a journeyman or apprentice painter, paperhanger or decorator in the City of San Antonio, Texas, shall make application to the Building Inspector for a license, such application to be made upon forms prepared by the Building Inspector; said application shall be accompanied by a fee of Six (\$6.00) Dollars in the case of a journeyman and by a fee of Three (\$3.00) Dollars for an apprentice, provided that if said application is filed on or after December 31st of the fiscal year the fee accompanying said application shall be only one-half of the regular annual fee herein provided for. All fees collected hereunder by the Building Inspector are to be turned over to the City Collector monthly with a statement of each collection and from whom collected.

Section 4. Licenses granted under the provisions of this ordinance shall expire on the 31st day of May in each year. Applications for renewal of a current license may be made at anytime during the month of May or any year. All licenses shall report all changes of address within ten days after they occur to the Building Inspector.

Section 5. Any person, firm, association or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, or failing to comply with any of the provisions thereof, or failing to obey any order of the Building Inspector in pursuance hereof shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon

conviction thereof shall be subject to a penalty or a fine of not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars.

Section 6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same are herein repealed.

AN ORDINANCE *OH-42*

AMENDING THE TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, LIMITING PARKING TO TWO HOURS, ON THE EAST SIDE OF MAIN AVENUE BETWEEN THE SOUTH SIDE OF ROMANA PLAZA AND MARTIN STREET, ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF ROMANA PLAZA BETWEEN THE EAST SIDE OF MAIN AVENUE AND THE WEST SIDE OF SOLEDAD STREET, AND ON THE WEST SIDE OF MAIN AVENUE BETWEEN WEST ROMANA STREET AND MARTIN STREET.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That Rule 39 of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance regulating the Government of Traffic on the Streets, Plazas and Public Places of the City of San Antonio", passed and approved on the 8th day of December, 1921, with amendments thereto;
2. Be and the same is hereby amended by adding to said Rule 39, the following paragraph:
3. "Rule 39-b. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle, except vehicles used by doctors in emergency calls, to park for a longer period than two hours between the hours of 8:00 A. M. and 7:00 P. M., on certain streets within the City, as follows:-

On the East side of Main Avenue between the South side of Romana Plaza and Martin Street.

On the South side of Romana Plaza between the East side of Main Avenue and the West side of Soledad Street.

On the West side of Main Avenue between West Romana Street and Martin Street.
4. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent therefrom, and it shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.

AN ORDINANCE *OH-43*

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED THE 24TH OF JANUARY, 1927, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING 'MILK' AND CERTAIN MILK PRODUCTS, 'MILK PRODUCER'; 'PASTEURIZATION', PROHIBITING THE SALE OF ADULTERATED AND MISBRANDED MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS, REQUIRING PERMITS FOR THE SALE OF MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS, REGULATING THE INSPECTION OF DAIRY FARMS AND MILK PLANTS, THE TESTING, GRADING, LABELING, PLACARDING, PASTEURIZATION, REGARDING, DISTRIBUTION, SALE AND DENATURING OF MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS, PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLISHING OF MILK GRADES, THE CONSTRUCTION OF FUTURE DAIRIES AND MILK PLANTS, THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND THE FIXING OF PENALTIES".

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the ordinance passed and approved January 24, 1927, recorded in Book "G", Pages 391 et seq., of the Ordinance Records of the City of San Antonio, entitled "An Ordinance defining milk and certain milk products, milk producer, pasteurization, prohibiting the sale of adulterated and misbranded milk and milk products, regulating the inspection of dairy farms and milk plants, the testing, grading, labeling, placarding, regrading, distribution, sales and denaturing of milk and milk products, providing for the publishing of milk grades, the construction of future dairies and milk plants, the enforcement of this ordinance, and the fixing of penalties" be amended by adding hereto Sections as follows:

2. Section 16-a:- No "adjusted" milk as herein defined containing less than four per cent (4%) of milk fat shall be sold or offered for sale within the City of San Antonio.

3. Section 16-b:- No "recombined" or manufactured milk as herein defined shall be sold or offered for sale within the City of San Antonio in glass or other transparent containers and all such milk offered for sale in other than glass or transparent containers shall bear label or tag not less than five inches long and two inches wide on which shall be printed or stamped in letters not less than one inch in length the words: "This is recombined milk and contains per cent milk fat." (Showing the actual percentage of fat contained).

4. Section 16-c:- No person, firm, or corporation offering milk for sale in the City of San Antonio shall purchase or receive any milk other than Grade "A" or Grade "B" milk as herein defined; nor shall any person, firm or corporation offer for sale to the public any milk other than Grade "A" milk as herein defined.

5. Section 16-a and Section 16-b, as herein set out shall take effect immediately after the passage, approval and publication hereof; and Section 16-c shall take effect ninety (90) days after the passage, approval and publication hereof. Any person violating the provisions of said Section 16-a, 16-b or 16-c, shall be subject to the penalties provided in Section 22 of said
