A letter from O. P. Schnabel, Chairman of the Cleanliness Committee of the Chamber of Commerce, making an offer to place trash receptacles on downtown sidewalks was read and discussed. The proposal is to place these receptacles at strategic points for the purpose of receiving papers and trash of passerby. These receptacles are to be donated by individuals and firms and are without expense to the City.
