

AN ORDINANCE 2009 - 11 - 19 - 0940

**AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION BY THE SAN ANTONIO METROPOLITAN HEALTH DISTRICT FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$15,000,000.00 OVER 2 YEARS FROM THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT THROUGH THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION'S "COMMUNITIES PUTTING PREVENTION TO WORK INITIATIVE" TO ADDRESS ISSUES OF OBESITY, PHYSICAL INACTIVITY, AND POOR NUTRITION.**

**WHEREAS**, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued the *2009 Communities Putting Prevention to Work Initiative* (the Initiative) which is funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009; and

**WHEREAS**, the Initiative provides \$650 million for evidenced-based clinical and community-based prevention and wellness strategies that support specific, measurable health outcomes to reduce chronic disease rates; and

**WHEREAS**, in the United States today seven of ten deaths, and the vast majority of serious illness, disability, and health care costs, are caused by chronic diseases, such as obesity, diabetes and cardiovascular disease; and

**WHEREAS**, key risk factors such as a lack of physical activity and poor nutrition are major contributors to the nation's leading causes of death; and

**WHEREAS**, the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District's (SAMHD) objective is to create a community-based prevention and wellness strategy that reduces obesity rates through improved nutrition and increased physical activity achieved through community-wide policies as well as systems and environmental changes; and

**WHEREAS**, the SAMHD will use grant funds of up to \$15,000,000.00 to implement community-wide policies, systems, and environmental changes that reach across all levels of the socio-ecological model and include the full engagement of the leadership in city and county government, boards of health, schools, businesses, community and faith-based organizations, community developers, transportation and land use planners, parks and recreation officials, health care purchasers, health plans, health care providers, academic institutions, foundations, other ARRA-funded community activities, and many other community sectors working together to promote health and prevent chronic diseases; **NOW THEREFORE:**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:**

**SECTION 1.** The City Manager or her designee or the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District (SAMHD) or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute the submission of a grant application for an amount up to \$15,000,000.00 over 2 years from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) "Communities Putting Prevention to Work Initiative" to address issues of obesity, physical inactivity, and poor nutrition. A copy of said application is on file with the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District.

**SECTION 2.** The City Manager, or her designee or the Director of the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District or his designee is further authorized to execute any and all necessary documents to effectuate said application and acceptance of funds upon award.


**SECTION 3.** Fund 23022000 entitled "Department of Health & Human Services" is hereby designated for use in the accounting for the fiscal transaction in the acceptance of this grant, and should funding be awarded, the sum of up to \$15,000,000.00 from the CDC will be appropriated in said fund. A formal final budget which will include a department specific fund, an Internal Order number, and General Ledger numbers will be submitted by the department upon award.


**SECTION 4.** The financial allocations in this Ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP Internal Orders, SAP Fund Centers, SAP Cost Centers, SAP Functional Areas, SAP Funds Reservation Document Numbers, and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 5.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage by eight (8) or more affirmative votes of the entire City Council; otherwise, said effective date shall be ten (10) days from the date of passage hereof.
