MONDAY, JUNE 9, A.D.1919, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Sam C. Bell, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Coy, Heuermann, Lambert, Wright.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS----

Petition for use of Cassiano Park was read and referred to Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property.

Petition to have certain lots in Southolme Addition cleared of weeds and brush was read and referred to Health Department.

No. 13 **MC-939** AN ORDINANCE
Appropriating \$2,113.81 to pay Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company for work on Agarita Ave.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$2,113.81 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to pay Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company for work done on Agarita Ave, between Blanco Road and S.A. & A.P.R.R. as per estimate of City Engineer on file with the City Auditor. This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 14 **-940** AN ORDINANCE
Appropriating \$1000.00 to pay Wm Reilly for construction of curbing along cemeteries on South New Braunfels Ave., as per estimate of City Engineer on file in the office of the City Auditor.
This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 15 MC-941 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$1416.25 out of 1918 General Fund to pay Paul Hansen for Street grading work.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Fourteen Hundred, sixteen and 25/100 Dollars (\$1416.25) or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is, hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to pay Paul Hansen for grading the following streets.

No. 16 -942 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$33,538.70 to pay Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company for street paving.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$33,538.70 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to pay Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company for paving the following streets:

1. \$12,191.89 for paving E. Commerce Street, from Chestnut Street to Alamo Street (North side)
2. \$21,346.81 for paving North New Braunfels Ave, from E. Commerce Street to Van Ness Street

All in accordance with estimate of the City Engineer on file in the office of the City Engineer.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 17 -943 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$659.36 to pay McGill Construction Co.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$659.36 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to pay McGill Construction Company for repair work on 21 different streets, as per estimate on file in the office of the City Auditor.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 18 -944 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$97.00 to be paid to Riverside Baptist Church as allowance for sewers built.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Ninety Seven (\$97.00) dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to be paid to the Riverside Baptist Church as allowance for sanitary sewers in Clifford Court by said church, and to which the sanitary sewer extension recently constructed in Clifford Court has been connected.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom and the same shall take effect at once.

Commissioner Coy recommended that petition of Louis Haas for reduction of assessment be refused. Adopted.

No. 19 *MC-945* AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$375.00 acct maintenance Military Police, and rent of premises U.S. Employment Bureau.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Three Hundred and Seventy Five (\$375.00) dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1919 General Fund for the following purposes:

1st. For maintenance of Military Police for threemonths beginning June 1, 1919, at \$75.00 per month.

2nd. To pay one-half of the rental of premises occupied by the U.S. Employment Bureau for three months beginning June 1, 1919 at \$50.00 per month.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 20 *-946* AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$500.00 out of the 1919 General Fund for postage stamps for official use in various departments.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is, hereby appropriated out of the 1919 General Fund to purchase postage stamps for official use various departments for the fiscal year.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 21 *-947* AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$1750,73 to pay Special Weekly Pay Rolls.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$1750.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the following ~~XXXX~~ funds to pay Special Weekly Pay Rolls for week ending June 7, 1919, to-wit:

No. 22 *-948* AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$1,589,483.30 to pay certain notes of the City, and interest.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$1,589,483.30 be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to pay off twenty six notes heretofore issued by the City of San Antonio in favor of the State National Bank and the Alamo National Bank, payable June 5, 1919 in the sum

Commissioner Lambert recommended that all proposals to rent space in the City Market House, excepting restaurant room, be rejected, and that the restaurant room be leased for one year beginning June 1, 1919 to Ng Ah Shene, in accordance with his proposal. Carried.

No. 23 **MC-947** AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating Two Hundred and Thirty Four Dollars to defray expenses for two band concerts in Brackenridge Park and Koehler Park.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Two Hundred and thirty four (\$234.00) Dollars, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Zoo Fund for the purpose of defraying expenses for two band concerts. One given in Brackenridge Park on June 5, 1919 and the other in Koehler Park on June 8, 1919.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

The following ordinance was introduced and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Bell, Coy, Lambert, Heuermann, Wright.

No. 24 **-950** AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$300.00 out of the General Fund of 1919, to pay John Ledbetter in settlement of claims in suit No. B-10298. John Ledbetter vs City of San Antonio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:


That the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund 1919, in full payment of damages to John Ledbetter and family and property arising from break in outfall sewer and consequent overflow of his premises; and that warrant be drawn in favor of said John Ledbetter, to be delivered upon his executing proper release.
