

AN ORDINANCE 5082

DECLARING THE CANVASSING AND THE RESULT
OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION ON THE 13TH OF MAY,
1947.

* * *

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. Came on this 14th day of May, A.D. 1947, regularly to be canvassed the returns of the regular municipal election held on the 13th day of May, 1947, to determine the elective officers of the City of San Antonio under its Charter for the ensuing term of office of two years;

2. And the Mayor and Commissioners having met to canvass the returns and to declare the result of said election in the manner provided by law, and after considering, determining and canvassing all matters of fact appertaining, we, the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, do hereby find and declare the result of the said election to be as tabulated as follows:-

And it appearing to the Mayor and Commissioners that the names of the candidates were submitted, and that the election was held and conducted, and that the returns thereof were made, all as required by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and the laws of the State of Texas, the proclamation of the Mayor and the law for such cases made and provided, and that at said election there was cast respectively for each of said candidates, the aggregate number of votes "FOR", all as shown by the report.

4. And the Mayor and Commissioners having first canvassed said returns and said reports and having found the same in all things correct, the same was thereupon adopted by unanimous vote of the Mayor and Commissioners.

5. And it is further declared that as the result of said election no candidate for Mayor and no candidate for Commissioner of Taxation and no candidate for Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property and no candidate for Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements and no candidate for Commissioner of Police and Fire received a majority of all the votes cast for the office for which he was a candidate cast by the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio voting at said election, and, therefore, no candidate was elected at said election for the office of Mayor, Commissioner of Taxation, Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks and Public Property, Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements and Commissioner of Police and Fire, but that a second election, or run-off election, will be necessary in order that the candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall receive a majority of all the votes cast for the office for which he was a candidate.
