THURSDAY, JUNE 7th, A.D. 1923, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable John W. Tobin Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners, Bushick, Lambert, Steffler, Wright.

Minutes of the previous meeting were ordered approved.

--- MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

Petition of M. J. Fox, claiming damages for injuries sustained his daughter Mary Fox, was read and referred to Commissioner of Sanitation Parks & ect.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$97.50 for City Plumbers Payrolls.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,
The sum of \$97.50 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1923 General Fund to pay special pay roll ending June, 7th, 1923, Plumbing & Sewer Dept.

Commission Lambert introduced the following resolution which read and adopted.

RESOLUTION

Authorizing the City Clerk to advertise for bids for Incinerator Plants.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,
The City Clerk be hereby authorized to advertise for bids for the construction of one or more twenty ton, two forty ton unit, or one eighty ton unit Incinerator plants for the use of the City of San Antonio, Bidders will be required to submit plans and specifications with bids.

Commissioner Lambert introduced the following resolution which were read and adopted.

RESOLUTION

Authorizing the City Clerk to advertise for bids for the construction of sidewalks in Brackenridge Park.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,
The City Clerk be hereby authorized to advertise for bids for the construction of sidewalks in Brackenridge Park, said walk to extend along the west bank of the San Antonio River, from Lambert Beach to the Koehler Park Pavilion, Plans and specifications are on file in the River Engineer's office. Bids will be received until 4 P.M. June 14th, and must be accompanied by a certified check to the amount of 10% of bid.
The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Commissioner Wright introduced the following resolution was read and adopted.

RESOLUTION

To issue permit to S. Casseb to build at the corner of South Alamo and E. Nueva Street.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,
The City Building Inspector be and is hereby directed to issue to Mr. S. Casseb a permit for a building to be constructed on his property on the southwest corner of East Nueva St. and South Alamo Streets with the provisions that such building may be erected on the old property line on the south side of Nueva Street in line of the new property line as proposed for the widening project.

Commissioner Wright made the following recommendations, which were adopted.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating the sum of \$12070.00 to pay the Central Trust Co.
BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,
SECTION 1. That the sum of \$12070.00 be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1923 General fund, for the purpose of paying the principal, and interest on a certain note now owned by the Central Trust Co, originally excuted by Nat Lewis on May, 13th, 1920 in favor of Francisco Flores, payment of which was assured by the City of San Antonio, as part consideration of the purchase price of a certain track of land at the Southwest corner of Market Street and South Alamo Street, said note being for the principal sum of \$12000.00 with interest thereon from May, 13th, 1923 to June 13th, 1923 at 7% per annum, said interest amounting to \$70.00.
SECTION 2. That the City Auditor be and is hereby directed to prepare a warrant to cover the said principal and interest in the sum of \$12070.00 payable to Central Trust Company, the present holder of the note.

RESOLUTION

NOTICE TO BANK AND TRUST COMPANIES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS of the City of San Antonio, that;
WHEREAS, The City of San Antonio desires to select sepositories for City funds for THE ENSUING PERIOD OF ONE YEAR.
Now Therefore, said City hereby invites proposals from each bank, banker or Trust Company in the City of San Antonio, desiring to be selected as such depository of City funds, such proposals duly signed and inclosed under seal, to be delivered to the City Clerk, on or before the 21st, day of June, A.D. 1923, at 4 o'clock p.m. at which time (subject to postponement of one week on order of the Commissioners) the same will be opened at a meeting of said board of Commisssioners who will thereupon make selection and designation of such depository or depositories of City funds, and there-after receive and consider the depository bonds tendered by such bidders, all as provided by law and charter and ordinances of said City, subject to the right of the City, however, to reject any or all bids.
Each such proposal shall state interest, not to be less than three per cent on daily balances, payable monthly, which the bidder offers to pay the City.
And each such proposal which contemplates a deposit with the bidder of less than the whole funds of the City, shall state whether the bidder desires to become a general depository or a special depository and shall designate the character and

amount or proportion of such deposit desired.

And each such bidder proposing to become a general depository will be expected to include or combine in such proposal, or to file in a separate proposal, at the same time, and in the same manner in additional proposal in writing, stating the terms and conditions, upon which such bidder proposes to loan the City of San Antonio, from time to time as needed, such sum or sums as said Board of Commissioners may desire to borrow for the use of the City for cashing City warrants in anticipation of the receipts of taxes and current revenues of the City for current fiscal year, which will be pledged as security for such loans; all as provided by the Charter and ordinances of said City, references being especially made hereby on what is known as "Finance Ordinances."

And the City Clerk is hereby directed to cause notice of the foregoing resolution to be published not less than one week before the date above fixed for opening said bids, and preserve proof of such publication.

Commissioner Steffler introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call to-wit; Ayes Tobin, Bushick, Lambert, Steffler, Wright.

AN ORDINANCE

Repealing the two certain ordinances therein named.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that; An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE". to provide for adding an additional width to Houston Street of approximately twelve feet, (from Nacagdoches to Santa Rosa Avenue) such widening being intended to furnish sidewalks fifteen feet in width on each side of a uniform curb line approximately as now located, and to be accomplished as conditions will permit and prescribing certain laws to that end;" passed and approved on February, 1st, A.D. 1923;

And an ordinance entitled AN ORDINANCE.

To provide for the widening of Houston Street to ___ feet from Nacagdoches Street to Santa Rosa Avenue to be accomplished gradually, as conditions will permit and prescribing certain laws to that end; passed and approved February, 1st, A.D. 1923. Be and the same are hereby repealed.

Accepting bid of Elder Bros. for wooden bridge over river at Martin Street.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, The Mayor be and hereby instructed to sign Construction Contract for a building of a temporary wooden bridge over the San Antonio River on Martin Street, and that the sum of eighteen hundred and twenty dollars (\$1820.00 be and is hereby appropriated in favor of the Elder Construction Company, for the erection of said bridge.

And that all lumber and necessary material be furnished by the City free of charge to the Contractors.
