

practicable. Seven and one-half (7½) hours shall constitute a day's work under the per diem term for services rendered.

13. That, subject only to the price, terms and stipulations of this contract, the written estimate and certificate of the City Auditor shall be final and conclusive to fix and determine any or all amounts payable hereunder to the Contractor, by the City, for which amounts such estimates of the Auditor shall be a condition precedent to the right of the Contractor to receive payment; and, also to fix and determine any, and all amounts payable for the Contractor or their sureties chargeable against the Contractor and payable to the City by reason of the performance by the City, or the non-performance by the Contractor, of any work herein undertaken by the Contractor.

14. In consideration of the faithful performance of this contract by the Contractor and and the completion of the work herein stipulated, the City of San Antonio agrees and shall be and is hereby bound and obligated to pay the Contractor for said work at the rate of \$25.00 per day for Senior Accountants and \$15.00 per day for Junior Accountants, the maximum not to exceed \$6,000.00.

15. The Contractor shall render a progress report on the 12th and 28th day of each month during the course of the work showing the nature and extent of the work done, the accounts examined on the work, the rate, the time and the amount for each man, and the total amount due for that period; and, on receipt of it, confirmed by the certificate of the City Auditor, the Contractor shall be paid an amount equal to eighty-five (85%) per cent of the compensation earned during such period, computed on the per diem basis specified.

16. The Contractor shall not be paid any money in excess of the amount paid upon such estimate, unless and until each and all of the stipulations and requirements of this contract shall have been faithfully performed by the Contractor, and the final report delivered to the City, and accepted by the City, in accord with this contract and such completion, delivery and acceptance, evidenced by a resolution of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

17. Thirty days after the date of the acceptance of such work, the final estimate for final settlement upon this contract shall be prepared by the Auditor and the same having been first approved by the signature of the Mayor and the Auditor, the City shall pay to the Contractor the amount of the final estimate; taking into consideration all amounts previously retained from the estimates remaining payable to the Contractor, and deducting from the amount of such final estimate and retaining, any and all sums which are to be deducted by the City, or due by Contractor to the City, or claimed for labor furnished by any person, or which should be retained and held by the City for any reason.

18. Should the work or any part thereof, prescribed by this contract, be abandoned by the City, this contract shall terminate to the extent thereof; but the Contractor shall be paid in full for the services performed prior to the abandonment, but not otherwise, and such payments shall amount to full satisfaction and accord for any debt or demand caused thereby.

19. The Contractor shall comply with all laws regulating labor and relating to employers and employees, and all other things being equal the Contractor shall use and employ San Antonio labor and material, and in the event the Contractor shall employ more than five persons in the performance of the work described in this contract, every person employed shall be a qualified voter of the City of San Antonio.

20. Six Thousand Dollars is appropriated out of the 1945 General Fund - Audit Department, to pay the estimates as the same accrue.

MAKING A LEASE WITH L. H. HILL FOR LAND IN THE OLMOS
BASIN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this ordinance makes and manifests a lease between the City of San Antonio, a municipal corporation, of the County of Bexar and State of Texas, hereinafter styled Lessor, and L. H. Hill, of the County of Bexar and State of Texas, hereinafter styled Lessee,

WITNESSETH:-

2. That the Lessor leases to the Lessee and the Lessee takes from the Lessor for a term commencing on the 1st day of October, 1945, and ending on the 30th of September, 1947, the following tracts or parcels of land situated in the County of Bexar and State of Texas, more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows, to-wit:

3. 1st Tract: 40 acres - bounded on the North Olmos Creek (East),
Devine Road (West, Contour Drive (South by Creek
and row of trees.

2nd Tract: 35 acres bounded North by Olmos Creek (West),
Devine Road. East by Olmos Creek and Alamo Heights
Contour (South) Creek and Golf Driving Range.

4. The rental to be paid by the Lessee to the Lessor shall be at the rate of \$4.00 per acre per year. The rental shall be paid annually in advance by the Lessee at the office of the License and Dues Collector of the City of San Antonio, in the City Hall, Bexar County, Texas. This lease is not subject to renewal by holdover by the Lessee, voluntarily or involuntarily, and this lease will terminate upon the 30th day of September, 1947. Any occupancy of this land after the termination date shall create a tenancy from month to month at a rental triple the rental specified herein subject to all other conditions imposed in this contract upon the Lessee.

5. The land demised herein shall be used solely for grazing and agricultural purposes. The Lessee shall enclose the demised land by a substantial stock-proof fence which shall be constructed so that it will not float, and the construction shall be subject to approval by the City Engineer and a condition precedent to this lease. The Lessee will not permit any waste upon this land, cut timber or remove earth. The Tenant may remove the fences forthwith upon the termination of the lease, and if left in place more than 60 days, the fencing shall automatically become the property of the City of San Antonio.

6. The Lessee acknowledges that he has examined the premises and that the same are suitable and sufficient for the purpose for which they are to be used and the Lessee takes the property as it is.

7. The Lessee acknowledges that this land is the bottom of the Olmos Detention Basin, that it is subject to overflow and as a part of the consideration for this lease, the Lessee releases the Lessor from all claims for damages to persons or to property caused by floods or inundation, and the Lessee will put outlets from the land hereindemised onto high ground and will remove all livestock from this area in the event of a flood or threat of flood. The Lessee will not put anything in this area except the fences herein permitted.

8. The Lessee acknowledges that this is property that the City of San Antonio bought

for public purposes and that its use for a public purpose is a right paramount to the rights of the Lessee under this lease and in the event the City of San Antonio elects to use the land herein conveyed, or any part thereof, for any public purpose or for any quasi-public purpose, then the City of San Antonio may terminate this lease as fully as if it had expired by its own terms, upon giving the Lessee 30 days notice of the intention to terminate.

9. The Lessee further covenants and agrees that he will not assign this lease, nor sublet the whole or any part thereof, nor make or allow to be made any unlawful, improper or offensive use thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Lessor at any reasonable time to enter into and upon the real estate above described to examine the condition thereof, and that the Lessee herein will, at the expiration of the term of this lease, peaceably yield up unto Lessor all and singular the real estate herein leased in a reasonably good and clean condition.

10. It is further covenanted and agreed that should the Lessee herein in any manner fail or refuse to abide by the terms, conditions and provisions of this lease contract, that such failure shall, at the option of the Lessor, immediately cancel this lease and all rights thereunder as fully and completely as though the entire term of said lease had expired, and Lessor herein shall thereupon be entitled to immediate possession of the real estate herein leased without any further notice.

11. AN ORDINANCE (2590).

PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN
ANTONIO AND THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TERRITORY
ADJACENT TO THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY (#4 - WEST)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the following described land and territory lying adjacent to the City of San
Antonio and now comprising the area known as UNIT NUMBER FOUR (#4) be and the same is hereby
added and annexed to the City of San Antonio: and that said territory hereinafter described
shall hereafter be included in the boundary limits of the City of San Antonio: and that the
present boundary limits of said City are hereby changed, fixed and amended, so as to include
said annexed area within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio: and which annexed
area and territory now and hereby annexed to and included within the enlarged City Limits of
the City of San Antonio, is more particularly described and included by metes and bounds as
follows, to-wit:

2. BEGINNING at the intersection of the south line of Culebra Road and the west city
limits line for the northeast corner of this unit, also being the southeast corner of Unit #5.

THENCE south and west along the present city limits line to a point in the north line of
U. S. Highway #90 and the east line of the Acme Road for the southwest corner of this unit.

THENCE northward along said east line of said Acme Road and its extension to an inter-
section with the south line of the Culebra Road for the northwest corner of this unit.

THENCE eastward along the south, southeast and south line of said Culebra Road to place

of beginning.

3. That the above boundaries and the above described additional area and territory are hereby annexed to and shall be included within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio as enlarged and expanded hereby: and that the City of San Antonio shall have jurisdiction over all said area and said enlarged City Limits as herein annexed and expanded.

4. That the above described additional territory and area hereby annexed, shall be a part of the City of San Antonio and included within its enlarged boundaries; that the property so added therein to the existing City Limits shall bear its pro rata part of the taxes levied by the City of San Antonio; that the inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of all of the other citizens of the City of San Antonio; and that they shall be bound by all of the acts, ordinances, regulations and resolutions of the City of San Antonio.

5. That the City Engineer be and he is hereby ordered to change the records of his office to conform to the new bounds, boundaries and limits of the City of San Antonio, as annexed, changed and fixed by this ordinance.

6. That the City Tax Assessor be and he is hereby ordered to change the records of his office to conform to the new bounds, boundaries and limits, and shall proceed to assess taxes and collect taxes on the property included in the new bounds, limits and boundaries for the next fiscal year, as now provided by the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

7. All ordinances of the City of San Antonio shall apply to and shall govern all persons and property included within said annexed area hereby annexed to the City of San Antonio as hereinabove specified.

8. After the introduction of this Ordinance, and after it has been amended, as desired by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, for final passage, it shall be published in the COMMERCIAL RECORDER in the City of San Antonio, one time; and shall not be passed finally thereafter, until at least thirty days have elapsed after said publication.

AN ORDINANCE (2591).

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, MAINTENANCE, REPAIR AND REMOVAL OF BUILDINGS WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF", PASSED AND APPROVED THE 13TH DAY OF JANUARY, A. D. 1913, BY AMENDING SECTION 110 THEREOF; PRESCRIBING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE FIRE DISTRICTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section 110 of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, MAINTENANCE, REPAIR AND REMOVAL OF BUILDINGS WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF", passed and approved the 13th day of January, A. D. 1913, is amended hereby so as to read as follows hereafter:-

FIRE DISTRICTS.

110. The City of San Antonio is divided into Fire Districts as follows:

District "A" known as the "Fireproof District";
District "B" known as the "Inner Fire District";
District "C" known as the "Outer Fire District";

and each of the above described Districts shall be bounded as follows:

Boundary Lines of District "A", known as the "Fireproof District";

110-A BEGINNING at the center of the intersection of North San Saba & West Martin streets;

THENCE west along the center of West Martin street to its intersection with North Comal Street;

THENCE south along the center of North and South Comal street to its intersection with Monterey street;

THENCE east along the center of Monterey street to its intersection with South Concho street;

THENCE south along the center of South Concho street to its intersection with South Laredo, El Paso and West Arsenal streets;

THENCE east along the center of West Arsenal street to a point 300 feet west of the center of South Flores street;

THENCE south along a line parallel with and 300 feet west of the center of Roosevelt avenue to a point in the center of East Mitchell st.;

THENCE east along the center of East Mitchell street to a point 300 feet east of the center of Roosevelt Avenue;

THENCE north along a line parallel with and 300 feet east of the center of Roosevelt avenue to a point in the center of Bryant street;

THENCE east along the center of Bryant street to a point 300 feet west of the center of South Presa street;

THENCE south along a line parallel with and 300 feet west of the center of South Presa street to a point in the center of East Mitchell st.;

THENCE east along the center of East Mitchell street and Arlington Court to a point 300 feet east of the center of South Presa street;

THENCE north along a line parallel to and 300 feet east of the center of South Presa street to a point 300 feet east of the center of its intersection with South Alamo street;

THENCE north along a line parallel to and 300 feet east of the center of South Alamo street to a point in the center of Water street;

THENCE west along the center of West Romana street to the San Pedro Creek;

THENCE diagonally across the San Pedro Creek to a point in the center of the intersection of North Laredo and North San Saba streets;

THENCE south along the center of North San Saba street to place of beginning. Boundary Lines of District "B", known as the "Inner Fire District";

110-B. BEGINNING in the center of North Pine street 300 feet north of the center of East Commerce street;

THENCE north along the center of North Pine street to a point 300 feet south of the center of East Houston street;

THENCE east along a line parallel to and 300 feet south of the center of East Houston street to the M. K. & T. Railroad tracks;

THENCE north along the center of the M. K. & T. Railroad tracks to a point 300 feet north of the center of East Houston street;

110-D Any building constructed in such a manner as to be partly in any two districts, shall conform to the ordinance applying to the more restricted district of the two. "

3. An ordinance amending "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, MAINTENANCE, REPAIR AND REMOVAL OF BUILDINGS WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND PRESCRIBED PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF", known as the "Building Code", passed and approved on the 12th day of April, 1926, recorded in Vol. G, page 312-313 and 314, and all other ordinances of the City of San Antonio fixing the boundaries of Fire Districts or Fire Limits are repealed hereby.

The Contractor shall supply construction bond in an amount equal to 50 per cent of the contract price as provided by paragraph 39 of the contract. The Contractor shall guarantee maintenance for 90 days as provided by paragraphs 45, 46 and 27 of said contract. The Contractor shall supply maintenance bond in an amount of 50 per cent of the contract price as provided by paragraph 48 of said contract.

7. In case of ambiguity, duplicity or obscurity in the bids, the City Engineer shall have the exclusive power to construe and apply the meaning thereof.

In accordance with our conversation of September 8th, past, we are proceeding with plans for the pavement of the Rittiman Road, from the W. W. White Road to the end of the present pavement on the Rittiman Road, at Eldon Road, which distance includes 6578 feet inside the present City Limits of the City of San Antonio, and for which you agreed to pay one-third the cost of that portion lying inside the City Limits. This cost to include the preparation of the base ready for pavement.

I don't believe I specifically mentioned the preparation of the base in our conversation, however, that would be a necessary cost before pavement could be completed. Therefore, it is understood that your participation to the extent of one-third will include all necessary costs.

Also, the property owners are contemplating constructing curbs on that section between the Fey Road and the Harry Warzbach Highway, 37' back to back, which would increase the width of the pavement for 3466 feet, an additional 16' from the proposed 20' wide pavement.

The County will do all the necessary work, and furnish all necessary materials incident to preparing the base, keeping an accurate record of the cost on that part inside the City Limits, will enter into a contract for the placing of the pavement for the entire length of the project, and will submit you with a statement showing the total cost of that portion inside the City Limits, along with your one-third participation cost.

The contemplated project involves widening the present gravel, which is now approximately 20½ feet wide, to 24' wide, 36' width through the curbed section, reshaping the present gravel, adding any necessary gravel, preparing the entire width of gravel for pavement, and placing thereon a Double Asphalt Surface Treatment type of pavement, using Rock Asphalt cover material at the following rates of application:

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF THE PORTION OF STATE HIGHWAY NO. 346 IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, COUNTY OF BEXAR, TEXAS, HEREBY REFERRED TO AS MUNICIPAL MAINTENANCE PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY, OR OTHER AUTHORIZED CITY OFFICIAL, TO EXECUTE AND AFFIX THE CORPORATE SEAL AND ATTEST SAME, A CERTAIN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY AND THE STATE OF TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND USE OF THE SAID MAINTENANCE PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHOULD BE EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE.

WHEREAS, the Public convenience, safety and necessity of the city, and the people of the City require that the portion of State Hwy. 346 from Jct. with U.S. 81 in South San Antonio to the South City Limit of San Antonio be adequately maintained. Since the existing street constitutes a danger and serious inconvenience to the public which is urgently required to be remedied; and

WHEREAS, the City has requested that the State of Texas, enter upon and contribute financially to the maintenance of said project; and

WHEREAS, the State of Texas has made it known to the City that it will, with its own forces and equipment and at its sole cost and expense, enter upon and maintain said project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED By the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio,

SECTION 1. That since the public convenience, safety and necessity of the City and the people of the City require said project be adequately maintained.

SECTION 2. That the State of Texas be and is hereby authorized to enter upon and maintain said maintenance project.

SECTION 3. That the Mayor, or proper City official, of the City, be and is hereby authorized to execute for and on behalf of the City an agreement with the State of Texas, in accordance with and for the purpose of carrying out the terms and provisions of this order, in the form attached hereto and marked "MUNICIPAL MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT." The City Clerk is hereby directed to attest the agreement and to affix the proper seal of the City hereto.

SECTION 4. The Mayor of the City, having requested in writing that this ordinance take
