

AN ORDINANCE

REVISING AND ESTABLISHING ELECTION PRECINCTS FOR
THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

* * * *

WHEREAS, as more fully appears by reference to the minutes of the County Commissioners of Bexar County, Texas, on the 14th day of August, 1946, the 14th day of August, 1947, the 12th day of August, 1948, the 10th day of August, 1949, the 19th day of August, 1950, the 18th day of August, 1951, the 18th day of August, 1952, the 14th day of August, 1953, the 9th day of August, 1954, the 11th day of August, 1955, the 17th day of August, 1956, the 14th day of August, 1957, the 15th day of August, 1958, the 14th day of August, 1959, the 12th day of August, 1960, the 16th day of August and the 18th day of August, 1961, the 17th day of August, 1962, the 14th day of August, 1964, the 13th day of August, 1965, and the 12th day of August, 1966, the Commissioners, acting by the authority vested in them by Article 2934, Chapter 2, Title 50 and Article 2997a, Sec. 5, Chapter 6, Title 50, Revised Civil Statutes of 1925, revised, established and corrected voting precincts within the City of San Antonio; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the following voting precincts within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio shall be after January 31, 1967, identical precincts as revised established and corrected by the orders of the Commissioners Court of the County of Bexar, State of Texas, as promulgated by the order of the 14th day of August, 1946, the 14th day of August, 1947, the 12th day of August, 1948, the 10th day of August, 1949, the 19th day of August, 1950, the 19th day of August, 1951, the 18th day of August, 1952, the 14th day of August, 1953, the 9th day of August, 1954, the 11th day of August, 1955, the 17th day of August, 1956, the 14th day of August, 1957, the 15th day of August, 1958, the 15th day of August, 1959, the 12th day of August, 1960, the 16th and the 18th day of August, 1961, the 17th day of August, 1962, the 14th day of August, 1964, the 13th day of August, 1965, and the 12th day of August, 1966, which orders are included herein by reference as fully and to all intents and purposes as if

they were copied herein, the said voting precincts being numbered as follows: 1 through 70 inclusive, 72, 75, 78, 79, 90, 91, 95, 100, 102, 103, 107, 113, 114, 118 through 124 inclusive, 126, 128, 129, 130, 132, 135 through 138 inclusive, 140 through 145 inclusive, 148 through 170 inclusive, 172 through 194 inclusive, and 196 through 205 inclusive.

2. Those portions of Bexar County Voting Precincts Nos. 77, 92, 104, 131 and 146 within the City Limits of the City of San Antonio are hereby combined with adjacent City Precincts as follows:

A. City Voting Precinct No. 175 is hereby enlarged to include that part of Bexar County Election Precinct No. 77, located within the city limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas;

B. City Voting Precinct No. 91 is hereby enlarged to include that part of Bexar County Election Precinct No. 92, located within the city limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas;

C. City Voting Precinct No. 135 is hereby enlarged to include that part of Bexar County Election Precinct No. 104, located within the city limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas;

D. City Voting Precinct No. 203 is hereby enlarged to include that part of Bexar County Election Precinct No. 131, located within the city limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas;

E. City Voting Precinct No. 156 is hereby enlarged to include that part of Bexar County Election Precinct No. 146, located within the city limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas;

3. There is filed herewith a map and plat reflecting and describing all of the hereinabove described precincts, which map and the designations shown thereon are hereby adopted and made a part of this ordinance.

4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

5. Whereas an emergency exists for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, welfare, and safety, requiring that this ordinance become effective immediately; therefore, upon passage, of this ordinance by an affirmative vote of six (6) members of the City Council, shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE NO. 10, PROVIDING FOR
PRECINCT REVISIONS FOR THE SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE
HELD ON DECEMBER 5, 1967, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN
ANTONIO:

SECTION 1, Section 1 of Ordinance No. 10, is amended by changing
the polling places for certain precincts:

PRECINCT 8: From Residence of Mrs. Keats to Willis Barber-
shop 868 Keats at Commercial.

PRECINCT 131: That part of voting Precinct No. 131 now
within the City Limits of San Antonio consolidated with
Precinct No. 203, Theodore Roosevelt High School, 5001 Walzem.

PRECINCT 134: That part of voting Precinct 134 now within
the City Limits of San Antonio consolidated with Precinct
No. 102, MacArthur High School, 2923 Beters Road.

SECTION 2. Whereas, an emergency is apparent for the immediate
preservation of order, good government and public safety which requires
that this ordinance become effective at once; therefore, upon the passage
of this ordinance by a vote of at least six members of the Council, it
shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as provided for
by Charter.

PROCLAMATION AND NOTICE OF RUN-OFF ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 18TH DAY OF APRIL, A. D., 1967

WHEREAS, at the regular municipal election held in the City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 4th day of April, 1967, no candidates for the office of Councilmen, Place Number 3, Place Number 7 and Place Number 9, received a majority of the votes cast by the qualified voters in said election; and

WHEREAS, Section 25 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio provides that in the event no candidate for any place for the office of Member of Council fails to receive a majority of all votes cast for such place of any regular or special municipal election, the Mayor shall, on the first day following the completion of the official count of ballots cast at such election issue a call for a second election to be held on the second Tuesday following the issuance of such call, at which second election the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for any place in the first election shall again be voted for; NOW, THEREFORE:

I, W. W. McAllister, Mayor of the City of San Antonio, Texas, do hereby proclaim and give notice as follows:

1. That a second or run-off election be, and is, hereby ordered to be held on Tuesday, the 18th day of April, 1967; in accordance with the provisions of said Section 25 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, for the election of the following municipal officers, to-wit:

Three (3) Members of the Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, being for Place Number 3, Place Number 7 and Place Number 9, for a term of two years beginning on the first day of May, 1967.

2. Said election shall be held as prescribed by law, in the City of San Antonio at the following polling or voting places in the several precincts of the City of San Antonio between the hours of 7:00 O'clock A. M. and 7:00 P. M. Central Standard Time.

Voting at said election shall be done by the use of voting machines; and, the City Council of the City of San Antonio does determine hereby that voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes at this election, and a voting machine shall be placed in the office of the City Clerk, in the City Hall of San Antonio, Texas; and the City Clerk, or any Assistant City Clerk, is authorized and charged to perform the functions provided by law in the casting of absentee ballots and shall hold such election, and ballots shall be cast at any time starting Monday at 8:00 o'clock A. M., April 10, 1967, and ending at 5:00 o'clock P. M., Friday, April 14, 1967, all in the method, manner and time made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on this subject.
