#### RESOLUTION

San Antonio:-

We the undersigned citizens and taxpayers of the City of San Antonio, being vitally interested in the welfare of the City, for the reasons hereinafter stated, respectfully request you to extend the time for the payment of taxes without being penalized by the additional penalty and interest, through the 8th day of July, 1933. We make the following reasons:

It is evident that a considerable number of our citizens have been laboring under some misapprehension relative to the payment of their taxes, and this Committee, which is actively interested in assisting these taxpayers to understand the true situation, and to impress upon them the urgent necessity for the prompt payment of these obligations in order to extricate the City from its present financial difficulties, believes that the Committee should be given the eleven days' additional time requested, in order that it may acquaint these taxpayers with the true situation, and in order that such taxpayers may have the opportunity, after understanding the situation, of making their payments without being required to pay penalty and interest.
