CREATING THE DEPARTMENTAL ORGANIZATION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF  
SAN ANTONIO

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

SECTION 1. That the Department of Public Affairs in General shall be organized as follows:

The Mayor, whose actions shall at all times be subject to the supervision of the City Council as provided in the City Charter shall have direct supervision over the following officers, employees, boards, commissions, and departments:

3. Safety Council

SECTION 11. The Following departments, officers, employees, boards, bureaus, and departments shall be under the immediate supervision of the Executive Assistant who is, in turn responsible to the Mayor:

2. Chief Consulting Engineer
3. Central Consolidated Repair Shop
4. Stenographer's Bureau
5. Slum Clearance Department
6. Parks Concessions Department
7. Airport Department
8. Auditors Department
9. Budget Officer
10. Purchasing Agent Department
11. Little Theatre Department
12. Sunken Garden Department
13. Municipal Auditorium Department
14. Governor's Palace Department
15. Educational Director
16. Recreational Supervisor
17. Training School Department
18. Board of Health, City Health Officers, and Health Dept.
19. Inspection Bureau, including Plumbing Inspection, Electrical Inspection, Building Inspection, and the Department of Weights and Measures

SECTION 111. The Mayor shall have general supervision and oversight of the Parks and Sanitary Department. This Department shall be under the immediate supervision of the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks, and Public Property, and shall consist of the following officers employees, and departments.

2. Park Superintendent who shall have immediate supervision over the following:

  - (b) Recreation Department

  - (b) Sewage Treatment Department
  - (c) Laboratory Department in connection therewith.
5. Building Superintendent who shall have charge of:
  - (a) Public Markets Department
  - (b) Public Buildings Department
  - (c) Pioneer Memorial Department
  - (d) Witte Museum Department
6. Curator of Zoo who shall have charge of:
  - (a) Zoo Superintendent
  - (b) Zoo Keepers

SECTION IV. The Mayor shall have general supervision and oversight over the Department of Fire and Police and Offices and officers who are not members of said Department, but who are under the supervision of said Department which Department and offices under its supervision shall be under the immediate supervision of the Commissioner of Fire and Police, and said Department, and the offices and officers not members of said department but under the supervision of the Commissioner of Fire and Police, shall consist of the following:

1. Office Clerks
2. Police Chief who shall have immediate supervision over:
  - (a) Patrol Division
  - (b) Traffic Division
  - (c) Radio Division
  - (d) Detective Division
  - (e) Signal Lights Division
  - (f) Police Alarms Division
  - (g) City Pound
  - (h) Ambulance Division
  - (i) Police Matrons Division
  - (j) City Jail and Kitchen
  - (k) Parking Meters Division
3. Fire Chief who shall have immediate supervision over:
  - (a) Firemen
  - (b) Fire Stations
  - (c) Fire Marshal
  - (d) Pulmotor Division
  - (e) Fire Protection Work
  - (f) Fire Alarm Division

SECTION V. The Mayor shall have general supervision and oversight of the Department of Streets and Public Improvements, which Department shall be under the immediate supervision of the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements. Said Department shall consist of the following:

1. Office Clerks
2. City Engineer who shall have immediate supervision over the following:
  - (a) Sanitary Sewage Department
  - (b) Storm Sewage Department
  - (c) Street and alleys Department
  - (d) Curbs and Gutters Department
  - (e) Sidewalks Department
  - (f) Bridges Department
  - (g) Street Lighting Department
  - (h) Field Surveys Department
  - (i) Property Lines Department
  - (j) Maps, Records, and Files Department
  - (k) Design and construction department

SECTION VI. The Mayor shall have general supervision and oversight of the Department of Taxation which shall be under the immediate supervision of the Commissioner of Taxation. Said Department shall consist of the following:

1. City Treasurer
2. Chief Deputy and Secretary. The Chief Deputy shall have immediate supervision over the following:
  - (a) Office Clerks
  - (b) Deputy Assessor who shall have charge of:
    - (1) Appraisals Department
    - (2) Equalizations Department
    - (3) Records Department
  - (c) Deputy Collector who shall have supervision of the following:
    - (1) Personal Property Tax Department
    - (2) Real Estate Tax Department
    - (3) Franchise Tax Department
    - (4) Occupation Tax Department
    - (5) License Fees Department
  - (d) Back Tax Collector who shall have charge of the following:
    - (1) Personal Property Tax Department
    - (2) Real Estate Tax Department

SECTION VII. There is attached hereto and hereby expressly made a part of this ordinance a chart showing and depicting the organization and administrative set-up of the government of the City of San Antonio.


SECTION VIII. All Offices, commissions, boards, bureaus, and positions of employment not heretofore created by existing ordinances are hereby created and enacted; and, all ordinances heretofore enacted which are in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION IX. This Ordinance being of urgent importance in that the present organization and the administrative set-up of the government of the City of San Antonio is grossly inadequate, and which imperils the public peace, health, and safety of said City, requiring a complete reorganization of the personnel and administrative set-up of the government of the City of San Antonio, which creates a dire emergency, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after the passage and approval thereof.

All of said employees are hereby declared not to be regular firemen and policemen or members of the Fire and Police Department of the City of San Antonio, and they are hereby declared not to be entitled to participate in the benefits of Art. 1583 of the penal code of Texas, Revision of 1925 as Amended Acts 1935, 44th legislature, P. 377, Ch. 139, Sec. 1; Acts 1937, 45th leg. p. 358k Ch. 173, Sec. 1.

CREATING AND ESTABLISHING A SAN ANTONIO POLICE ACADEMY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

*Amended 9/27/59

SECTION 1. There is hereby established and created the San Antonio Police Academy to function under the supervision and management of the Commissioner of Fire and Police of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION 2. The purpose of said Academy shall be to train those eligible for appointment as members of the Police Department of the City of San Antonio in the fields of criminology criminal law, criminal investigation, criminal identification, scientific crime detection, traffic control and safety, criminal evidence, police procedure, and such other and further subjects as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioner of Fire and Police of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION 3: the training to be given the students in said Police Academy shall consist of both theoretical and practical training which will familiarize said students with the active duties of the members of the Police Department of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of the Commissioner of Fire and Police to provide for a police instructor to act as head of the school under his supervision and control, said police instructor to be of a rank not less than lieutenant in the Police Department of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION 5. The person designated as police instructor in accordance with the previous section shall be responsible for the conduct of said school to the Commissioner of Fire and Police of the City of San Antonio and he shall report to said Commissioner from time to time concerning the progress of the training of the students in said school.

SECTION 6. While said students are in attendance at said school they shall be furnished an allowance by the City of San Antonio sufficient for them to subsist upon.

Such students in the San Antonio Police Academy who are unmarried at time of entering said school shall receive the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per month as an allowance, and such students in the San Antonio Police Academy who are married at time of entering said school shall receive sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) per month as an allowance.

SECTION 7. Any student attending the San Antonio Police Academy may be dismissed from said school by the Commissioner of Fire and Police of the City of San Antonio upon the recommendation of the Police instructor, and such action of the Commissioner of Fire and Police of the City of San Antonio shall be final. the students so dismissed shall be entitled, however, to his allowance up to the date of such dismissal.

SECTION 8. Upon the successful completion of the course provided for in the San Antonio Police Academy the students shall be graded on the basis of a competitive examination and efficiency in active field duty experience, and upon the basis of said grading the Police Commissioner shall choose those to be appointed to membership in the Police Department of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION 9. The first course of instruction of the San Antonio Police Academy shall begin on a date fixed by the Commissioner of Fire and Police and shall be conducted for a period of six (6) months thereafter.

AN ORDINANCE (201)

AUTHORIZING NATIONAL BANK OF COMMERCE TO EXCAVATE UNDER SIDEWALK ON WEST COMMERCE STREET.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:-

1. That permit be and is hereby granted to National Bank of Commerce to excavate under the sidewalk adjacent to Lot Nos. A-11 New City Block No. 909 fronting 36' 3" more or less feet on West Commerce Street, and to use the space under the sidewalk in connection with the building at No. 405 on said Street.

2. Said excavation shall extend from the property line fixed by the City Engineer to the back face of the curb and for the entire width of the property to a depth of approximately 12 feet measured below the average sidewalk grade. The area specified includes wall thicknesses and the depth given is the approximate measurement to the under side of the footings. The sidewalk construction shall be a reinforced concrete arch covered with membrane waterproofing and the sidewalk finished as specified in the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio. There will be no vault lights installed in the sidewalk level. The space will be used as a part of the basement.

3. That the licensee shall make such excavation in accordance with the direction and under the supervision of the City Engineer, and shall construct the sidewalk, curb, and retaining wall out of reinforced concrete, in a safe and substantial manner.

4. It is expressly declared that the permission herein given is a grant of a privilege, revocable by the City; and the Licensee by his acceptance and his acts thereunder shall be bound by the stipulations thereof.

5. The City of San Antonio Expressly reserves the right to place its pipes, drains, cables, and other appliances for public utilities in said excavation; and, the licensee hereby waives all claims for damages that might arise by reason thereof; and agrees that he will at no time make any claim for damages against the City; and will hold the City harmless from all damages arising from the grant herein.
