## AN ORDINANCE

Designating certain polling places for the Special Election to be held in the City of San Antonio on September 9, 1922.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, by ordinance passed and approved on the 24th day of July, 1922, designated certain polling places for a special election to be held September 9, 1922 for the purpose of submitting a proposition to issue \$300,000.00 additional Auditorium bonds, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners now find it necessary to change the location of the polling places in three certain precincts of the City, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the polling places for Precincts No's 21, 24 and 32 in the City of San Antonio, for the election to be held on the 9th day of September, 1922, be and the same <sup>are</sup> ~~is~~ hereby designated as follows:

Precinct No. 21, Nash Pharmacy, 531 San Pedro Avenue.

Precinct No. 24, Trinity Methodist Church, corner Huisache and Grant Avenues.

Precinct No. 32, Columbia Battery Station, Avenue D and 3rd street.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish a copy of this ordinance in the San Antonio Evening News, which shall serve as proper notice of the change of said polling places.
