-258 AN ORDINANCE

TO ABOLISH PART OF SAN FERNANDO STREET ADJACENT TO THE SAN ANTONIO BELT AND TERMINAL RAILWAY COMPANY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the part of San Fernando Street shown on the Plats of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, in New City Block 137, more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows:

"That portion of San Fernando Street in New City Block 137 in San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, averaging 20 feet in width and 120 feet, more or less in length, lying and being on the Westerly side of the San Antonio Belt and Terminal Railway Company Station Grounds Property opposite Railroad Company's Mile Post 1038.57, and between the Southerly line of Lot 19, Tract 2, and the Northerly line of Lots 11 to 14, inclusive, of City Block 137, beginning at the Southeast line of Lot 15 extended Northeasterly across said street and extending Southeasterly 120 feet, more or less, to a line drawn parallel with and 301 feet West of the centre line of the Old Location of San Pedro Creek, the portion of San Fernando Street lying East of said line having already been vacated and closed by City Ordinance dated May 13th, 1915";

be and the same is hereby abolished by the City of San Antonio as a public street; as stipulated, in Section 90 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

2. This Ordinance is passed and approved as a matter of public necessity and convenience, said portion of said street not being used by the public nor is being maintained as a public Street of the City of San Antonio, and it is to the best interest of the City to close it as described.
