

AN ORDINANCE **29193**

CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING RESULTS
OF A BOND ELECTION HELD ON JANUARY 10,
1961.

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WHEREAS, heretofore, on December 15, 1960, the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, passed an ordinance calling an election to be held in said city on January 10, 1961, on the following propositions:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$5,600,000.00, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring the right-of-way and necessary approaches for U.S. Highway No. 90 West to be constructed from the western city limits east to Interstate Highway 35, including a connecting highway from said U.S. Highway 90 West to Kelly Air Force Base, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of San Antonio?"

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$3,500,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said city sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring the right-of-way and necessary approaches for a North Expressway to be constructed from the east leg of the Expressway west of Broadway to U.S. Highway No. 281 north of Loop 13, as authorized by the constitution and laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of San Antonio?"

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$500,000.00 maturing serially in such

installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said city sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of acquiring property for and extending, improving and constructing Parks and Recreational facilities in said city as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of San Antonio?"

PROPOSITION NO. 4

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$900,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said city sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing a railroad grade separation on Guadalupe Street between Alazan Creek and Medina Street, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of San Antonio?"

WHEREAS, said election was duly held at the time and place specified after due notice as required by law had been given by posting and publication; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on the 10th day of January, 1961, in conformity with the election ordinance heretofore passed by the City Council and the result of said election has been certified and returned to this Council by the proper judges and clerks thereof; and

WHEREAS, there were cast at said election the following votes:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,600,000.00 HIGHWAY 90 WEST (INCLUDING KELLY FIELD ACCESS ROAD) BONDS" 55308 Votes.

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,600,000.00 HIGHWAY 90 WEST (INCLUDING KELLY FIELD ACCESS ROAD) BONDS?" 10979 Votes.

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,500,000.00 NORTH EXPRESSWAY BONDS" 40199 Votes.

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,500,000.00 NORTH EXPRESSWAY BONDS" 23175 Votes.

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$500,000.00 PARK BONDS" 45252 Votes.

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$500,000.00 PARK BONDS" 19170 Votes.

PROPOSITION NO. 4

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$900,000.00 GUADALUPE STREET GRADE SEPARATION BONDS." 52313 Votes.

"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$900,000.00 GUADALUPE STREET GRADE SEPARATION BONDS." 13505 Votes.

as is reflected in the election returns heretofore filed with the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, only qualified taxpaying voters owning taxable property in said City and who had duly rendered their property for taxation were allowed to vote;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That said election was duly called; that notice was given in accordance with law and in accordance with the ordinance calling the election; that the election was held in accordance with law; that the return of said election has been made by the proper officers.

2. That the propositions for the issuance of \$5,600,000.00 Highway 90 West (Including Kelly Field Access Road) Bonds; for the issuance of \$3,500,000.00 North Expressway Bonds; for the issuance of \$500,000.00 Park Bonds; and for the issuance of \$900,000.00 Guadalupe Street Grade Separation Bonds were sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with said propositions.

3. That the City Council be and it is hereby in all things authorized, ordered and directed to issue said bonds and to do any and all things necessary or convenient in connection therewith.

4. An emergency exists for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, welfare, and safety, requiring that this ordinance become effective immediately; therefore, upon passage, this ordinance by an affirmative vote of six (6) members of the City Council, shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.
