WE, THE UNDERSIGNED QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS,  
BEING TEN PER CENT (10%) OR MORE OF THE QUALIFIED VOTERS WITHIN THE SAID  
CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, RESPECTFULLY REQUEST THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS TO IMMEDIATELY, BY ORDINANCES AS REQUIRED  
BY ALL OF THE APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 28, CHAPTER 13 OF THE REVISED  
CITY STATUTES OF TEXAS, 1925, INCLUDING ALL AMENDMENTS THERETO, CALL A  
SPECIAL ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF

Whole. The Mayor then stated that since the petition of approximately 13000 voters  
calls for an immediate election he thought only democratic to call the election at once.

Discussion was then held by all the Commissioners and the Mayor and it was  
decided that the Commissioners as a whole would be responsible for checking the adequacy  
of the petition. Each Commissioner and the Mayor agreed to appoint 3 members of the  
checking crew to work under the supervision of the City Clerk. The Clerk asked that  
all helpers meet in his office at 1:30 P.M. this day.

All of above agreed to by unanimous vote of Commissioners.

PORTION OF WEST ASHBY AND CINCINNATI AVENUE AT BANERA RD., PROPOSITION C: PIERCE STREET AND QUITMAN STREET; PROPOSITION D: TO ZONE TERREL HEIGHTS SUBDIVISION UNITS 1 TO 6; PROPOSITION E: DEVINE STREET AT SOUTH PRESA STREET. ANY PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS ORDINANCE OR THE OWNER OF ANY BUILDING OR PREMISES OR PART THEREOF WHERE ANYTHING IN VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE PLACED OR SHALL EXIST, AND ANY ARCHITECT, BUILDER, CONTRACTOR, AGENT, PERSON OR CORPORATION EMPLOYED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, WHO MAY HAVE ASSISTED IN THE COMMISSION OF ANY SUCH VIOLATION SHALL BE GUILTY OF A SEPARATE OFFENSE AND UPON CONVICTION MAY BE FINED NOT MORE THAN \$100.00 AND EACH DAY SUCH VIOLATION EXISTS SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENSE.
