AN ORDINANCE *- 839*

Declaring the public necessity for the extension and straightening of Avenue "A" from the north line of Fourth Street to the South line of an alley in New City Block No. 1761; directing the City Engineer to prepare plans, profiles, plats, specifications and property owners' roll, and report with regard thereto; declaring the intention of the City to assess part of the cost of

said Improvement against the abutting property and the owners thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That a public necessity exists for the improvement of AVENUE "A", in the City of San Antonio, by extending and straightening the same between its intersection with the north line of Fourth Street and the south line of an alley in New City Block No. 1761, and that special assessments and taxes shall be made and levied, as provided by law and ordinance, on account of the cost of such improvement,

2. That the improvement shall in general consist of the extension and straightening of said street between the points aforementioned, by setting back the street and sidewalk lines, removing such buildings, structures and other improvements as may conflict with the new lines of the street; and the acquiring of such property as may be necessary so that said street, when completed, shall have a width of approximately fifty (50') feet between property lines, with sidewalks approximately seven feet in width on each side thereof, and a roadway approximately thirty-six (36') feet.

3. That the City Engineer is hereby directed to prepare plans, profiles, plats and specifications covering the proposed improvements, in accordance with this Ordinance, and to report same to the Commissioners forthwith, together with a statement of the cost of such improvements, the names of the property owners abutting thereon, the description of the property which will abut upon said street, as widened, and the amount, if any, to be assessed against said owners and said property as their, or its, cost of making such improvement.

4 That the cost of said improvements shall be discharged as follows:

(a) An amount, not exceeding three-fourths (3/4) of the whole cost thereof, shall be paid by the owners of the property abutting on said street, as extended and straightened, and shall be assessed against them and their property as provided for by law and ordinance, provided, however, that no assessment shall be made against any property or owner thereof, until after legal hearing notice shall have been given to said property owners and legal hearing had; nor shall any assessment be made against any property or owner thereof in excess of the actual benefit to such owner in the enhanced value of his property by means of such improvement as ascertained at such hearing.

(b) The remainder of the cost of said improvement shall be paid for by the City of San Antonio.

AN ORDINANCE *MI-841*

PERMITTING THE GALVESTON, HARRISBURG AND SAN ANTONIO RAILWAY, OPERATED BY THE TEXAS AND NEW ORLEANS RAILROAD COMPANY, TO SHIFT THE STEVES SPUR ON EAST COMMERCE STREET.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That permission be and the same is hereby granted to the Galveston, Harrisburg and San Antonio Railway Company, to construct and maintain the following described railroad track, and to operate engines and cars thereupon, on and across the streets hereinafter described, to-wit:-

2. To shift the track known as the Steves & Sons Spur, now crossing East Commerce Street 1900 feet East of the East line of Walnut Street to a new location 165 feet East of the East line of Walnut Street, indicated approximately by the red line on the attached map; the present location shown by the yellow line.

3. The place from which the old track is moved shall be reconstructed with material, in a good and substantial manner, to correspond with the present roadway and base.

4. The new track shall be constructed with at least twelve inches of concrete beneath the cross-ties and concrete between the rails and two feet on the outside of the rails, and paved with the identical material with which the street is now constructed.

5. The crossing at the tracks of the San Antonio Public Service Company shall be constructed in a good and substantial manner so that the passage of cars thereover shall be quiet and without vibration; otherwise no frog nor switch nor any appurtenance thereof shall be placed on said street.

6. The new track shall conform with the crown, of the present pavement in order that the gutter shall not be obstructed and so that there will be free and complete drainage at this point.

7. In consideration of the granting of this permit, the said Railroad Company agrees to have constructed and to maintain said track across said streets in the manner and form ordered and directed by the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements and in accordance with the lines, grades and system of drainage approved by the City Engineer, and to have constructed such culverts, and make such additional provisions for drainage from time to time as may be deemed necessary by the City; and, further binds and obligates itself, its successors and assigns, to hold said City of San Antonio free and harmless from all damages to persons or property that may result by reason of the granting of this permit or the exercise of any right thereunder; and provided further, that said Railroad Company will have constructed and will maintain proper and suitable crossings under the supervision of said City Engineer and Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements, so that vehicles can cross over readily.

8. That the license and privilege granted hereby is subject to revocation at the will of the Commissioners or other governing body of the City of San Antonio, and said Railroad Company agrees to remove, or have removed, its said track from said streets on demand, upon the revocation of the license hereby granted.

9. The acceptance and exercise of any privilege under this Ordinance shall be an acceptance of all its terms and conditions by said Railway Company, its successors and assigns.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the sum of \$3,711.70, or as much thereof as is necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Street Opening and Widening Fund of 1928, to pay Sarah E. Eagar, s feme sole, for land between the North Line of East Nueva Street and the North line of Lavaca

Street for the widening of South Alamo Street, according to the stipulations of an Ordinance levying Special Assessments on account of the improvements of South Alamo Street, passed and approved on the 3rd day of December, A. D. 1928;

2. Upon the delivery of the deed, approved by the City Attorney, the Auditor is directed to deliver a City Warrant in the above amount, and to accept payment for the Street Widening Benefit Assessment and issue a release therefor, as provided in the Procedure Ordinance.
