ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE SECURITIES PLEDGED BY THE FROST NATIONAL BANK OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, TO SECURE THE CITY FUNDS DEPOSITED AND TO BE DEPOSITED IN SAID BANK BY THE CITY DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1938, AND DIRECTING THE DEPOSITING OF SAID SECURITIES FOR SAFE-KEEPING AND RELEASING THE SURETIES ON ALL BONDS HERETOFORE GIVEN BY SAID BANK AS CITY DEPOSITORY

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the securities pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio by the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, Texas as City Depository, to secure the Funds of said City, deposited and to be deposited, in said Bank during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, be and the same are hereby accepted and approved, and that receipt signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, and attested by the City Clerk, be given said Bank for securities pledged by it, which said securities are described as follows:

1 - (a) Securities pledged by the Frost National Bank are described in the attached Exhibit "A", which is made a part of the ordinance by reference as fully as if it were specified herein.

2. The receipt given to said Bank for the securities pledged by it shall recite, in substance, that the said securities have been duly pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio, by the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, as a depository of said City, for the purpose of securing the Funds of said City, deposited and to be deposited, in said Bank during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938, upon the terms and conditions prescribed and provided by law.

3. It is directed that said securities be deposited by the Mayor, for safe-keeping, in safe deposit box in the vaults of the Frost National Bank rented by the City from the said Bank.

4. That all securities on all bonds heretofore given to said City, by the said Frost National Bank as City Depository, be and are hereby released from further liability as sureties on such bonds.

LEVYING SPECIAL TAXES FOR THE PAYMENT OF INTEREST ON AND TO CREATE A SINKING FUND FOR THE ULTIMATE PAYMENT OF CERTAIN ISSUES OF BONDS, ISSUED ON THE CREDITS OF IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS NO. 2, 4, 7, 8, 12, 14, 15, IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JUNE 1, 1938 AND ENDING MAY 31, 1939
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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

SECTION 1: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$30,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 2, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 12th day of October 1903 in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of one cent (1) on the one hundred dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 2, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the

City Council of said City.

SECTION 2: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$76,000.00, dated October 1, 1937, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 4, as authorized by an ordinance passed and approved on August 27, 1937 in accordance with Sections 54 and 55 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of twelve cents (12) on the one hundred dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 4, in the City of San Antonio, as same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 3: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$45,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 7, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 15th day of July, 1908, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of four cents (4) on the one hundred dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 7, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 4: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 8, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 14th day of March, 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of three cents (3) on the one hundred dollar valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 8, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 5: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$5,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 12, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 17th day of September 1909, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of four cents (4) on the one hundred dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 12, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

SECTION 6: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$17,500.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 14, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 21st day of June 1919, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of Seven Cents (7) on the one hundred dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 14, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of said City.

SECTION 7: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 15, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 25th day of October 1938, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of two cents (2) on the one hundred dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 15, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of said City.

SECTION 8: EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, to-wit: to preserve the financial and borrowing credit of the City, to secure funds for maintaining the necessary functions of government, and pay the debts of the City, that requires this Ordinance to become effective at once; therefore upon the passage of this Ordinance a vote of four-fifths (4/5) of the Board of Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas.

AN ORDINANCE

LEVYING AN ADVALOREM AND OCCUPATION TAX FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND LEVYING A TAX TO PAY THE INTEREST ON THE BONDED DEBT OF SAID CITY, AND TO CREATE A SINKING FUND THEREFOR, AND A SPECIAL TAX FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CARNEGIE LIBRARY IN SAID CITY, ALL SAID TAXES BEING LEVIED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JUNE 1, 1938 AND ENDING MAY 31, 1939.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

SECTION 1: That there is hereby levied for general purposes for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, on all property, real, personal, and mixed, within the limits of the City of San Antonio, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and the Ordinances of this City, an Advalorem Tax of and at the rate of \$1.17 on every one hundred dollars valuation.

SECTION 2: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$1,500,000.00 for Paving Public Streets and Public Places, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they may severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.033506 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 3: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$800,000.00 for Constructing Sanitary Sewers, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.017639 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 4: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$25,000.00 for Constructing Sidewalks and Curbing, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.000494 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 5: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$175,000.00 for Constructing Police and Fire Stations, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.003621 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 6: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$375,000.00 for Opening and Widening Streets, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.008044 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 7: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Constructing Concrete Bridges, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied

for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.002531 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 8: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$300,000.00 for Constructing storm sewers and Drains, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.006925 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 9: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$125,000.00 for Constructing a City Hospital, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.002697 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 10: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for Constructing Garbage Incinerators, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.000907 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 11: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$900,000.00 for Street Paving, Storm Sewers and Drains, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.023841 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 12: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$500,000.00 for Construction of Sanitary Sewers, Mains and Laterals, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.012648 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 13: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for Construction of Sidewalks and Curbing, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.001701 on every one hundreddollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 14: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$150,000.00 for Fire & Police Station Building, and to create a Sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.004031 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 15: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Garbage Incinerator Extensions, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.002244 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 16: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$950,000.00 for Opening and Widening and Straightening Public Streets, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.024221 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in

Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 17: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for Constructing Permanent Bridges and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.005171 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 18: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$500,000.00 for Building Public Auditorium, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.013097 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 19: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for Public Parks Improvement, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.005170 on every One Hundred Dollars Valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 20: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for San Antonio River Improvements, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.005185 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 21: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$200,000.00 for the Market House Annex, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.005185 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 22: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Public Park Improvements, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.002898 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 23: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$450,000.00 for Street Paving and Street Markers, and to create a Sinking Fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.013506 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 24: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated January 1, 1924, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for Sanitary Sewers, Mains and Laterals, and to create a Sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.002864 on every one Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 71: That to provide for the support and maintenance of the Carnegie Library in said City, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.03 on every One Hundred Dollars Valuation on all

property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 72: That to provide funds to pay current expenses in the matter of the Firemen, policemen and fire alarm operators pension fund, Authorized under the provision of an Ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on August 26, 1929, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.02 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 73: That to provide for the advertising of the City of San Antonio, to increase the growth of the City, for the improvement thereof and for the benefit of the inhabitants there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, a special tax of \$.03 on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 74: That there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938 and ending May 31, 1939, upon every persons, firm or corporation or association of persons pursuing any occupation half of the State Tax Imposed upon each such occupation, subject to such restrictions and limitations may be imposed by the Laws of the State of Texas and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION 75: EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, to-wit: to preserve the financial and borrowing credit of the City, to secure funds for maintaining the necessary functions of government, and pay the debts of the City, that requires this Ordinance to become effective at once; therefore upon the passage of this Ordinance by a vote of four-fifths (4/5) of the Board of Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas.

ADOPTING A FINAL BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1938

- - -

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. Came on this day the public hearing on the budget filed with the City Clerk as required by law, for the expenditures of the City of San Antonio during the current fiscal year, at the time and place and after due notice as provided by law; and, after hearing and considering the said budget, at the conclusion of such hearing, the budget as prepared by the Mayor is acted upon, adopted and approved finally by the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, which budget is hereto attached and made a part hereof, and which is prepared to show as definitely as possible each of the various projects for which appropriations are set up, the estimated amount of money carried for each of said projects, the financial statement of the City, the funds received from all sources during the previous year, the estimated revenue available for the budget and the rate of tax which is required.

2. Said final budget of the expenditures of the City of San Antonio during the current fiscal year 1938, beginning the 1st of June 1938 and ending the 31st of May 1939, and containing the various amounts to be appropriated for all purposes, is in words and figures as follows:

For the Department of Public Affairs in General, the sum of	\$ 564,800.00

3. ORDERING J. E. TATE, ET AL. TO REMOVE THE OBSTRUCTIONS FROM THE BANKS OF THE SAN ANTONIO RIVER

- - -

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the Board of Commissioners declare the obstructions to the necessary flow of the San Antonio River at high water on the banks of the San Antonio on and adjacent to Lots 1, 2, 3 and A-12, New City Block 1037, at 111 Jones Avenue, on the property of J. E. Tate and Essie O. Tate, consisting of fillings, pilings, dams, fences, rocks, posts and wall, shall be removed by the person or persons owning the property to which such obstructions are attached, within 30 days after official notice is given of this action.

2. If the person or persons owning said property fail to remove the obstructions within 30 days, the City of San Antonio, acting by and through the Commissioner of Parks, Sanitation & Public Property, may remove, or cause to be removed, any and all said obstructions attach to the property, the City shall assess all costs and expense of such removal to the charge of the same, with 8 per cent per annum interest from the time or times of expenditures, until collection is made, which cost, expense and interest shall be a lien upon said property, and collected as other taxes on real estate are collected; all as made and provided by the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

3. It shall be the duty of the City Clerk to send a certified copy of this ordinance to Essie O. Tate and J. E. Tate by registered mail, return receipt requested, and the date of the receipt of said mail shall be the date of the official notice.

4. The City Clerk shall file this ordinance with the real estate records of the County Clerk of the County of Bexar for further notice to the person or persons owning the property to which such obstructions are attached.

PERMITTING THE PLAZA COMPANY TO BREAK THE SIDEWALK ON SOUTH ST. MARY'S STREET

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the Plaza Company and The Plaza Hotel Company are given permission to break the sidewalk at the intersection of South St. Mary's Street and Villita Street, on that part of New City Block 986, Lot 5, between the hotel building and the property of the City of San Antonio held in fee, and obstruct the sidewalk and street at the specified place and adjacent thereto.

2. The permittee shall conform strictly to Section 5, Section 6-B, Section 7-C, Section 9-E, Section 10-F, and Section 11-G of the ordinance to regulate the construction, alteration, maintenance and repair and removal of buildings within the City of San Antonio.

3. The permittee shall reconstruct the sidewalk in full compliance with all city ordinances with reference thereto and make all arrangements with all public service corporations using said streets in such manner as to relieve the City of San Antonio from liability.

4. All of the utilities of the City of San Antonio shall be re-built by the permittee in such a manner as will not interfere with the use thereof.

5. The permittee shall hold the City harmless and reimburse it, on account of all claims or demands for damages which may result from this permit, shall insure against public liability for injury to person or property for not less than \$5,000.00, and shall file with the City Clerk the certificate of such insurance.

6. This contract shall be construed strictly against the permittee, and it shall never be used against the City as a waiver or estoppel.

7. This document and included instruments is the entire contract and recites the full consideration between the parties, there being no other written nor parole agreement, it being understood that the Charter of the City requires all of its contracts to be written and made by ordinance.

8. The exercise of any privilege under this permit by the permittee, shall operate as the acceptance of all the terms thereof by all of the parties affected thereby, without further formality.

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SAFEGUARDING OF LIFE AND PROPERTY BY REGULATING AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, PROVIDING THE MANNER AND WAY IN WHICH ELECTRICAL WORK SHALL BE DONE, THE KIND AND CLASS OF MATERIAL TO BE USED IN SUCH WORK, THE INSPECTION OF ELECTRICAL WORK, SCALE OF FEES FOR SUCH INSPECTION, CREATING THE OFFICE OF ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR, CREATING AN EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD, PROVIDING FOR THE GRANTING OF LICENSES TO INSTALL, MAINTAIN AND SELL ELECTRIC WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, TO PREVENT INCOMPETENT PERSONS, FIRMS OR CORPORATIONS FROM INSTALLING, MAINTAINING AND SELLING ELECTRIC WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, DEFINING TERMS USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT AND PERSONS ENGAGED IN SUCH WORK, FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF A BOND AND THE COLLECTION OF PENALTIES UNDER SAID BOND FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ALL FORMER ORDINANCES RELATING THERETO AND IN CONFLICT WITH SAID ORDINANCES".

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Article 86, of an ordinance passed and approved on the 5 day of November A. D. 1936, entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SAFE GUARDING OF LIFE AND PROPERTY BY REGULATING AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, PROVIDING THE MANNER AND WAY IN WHICH ELECTRICAL WORK SHALL BE DONE, THE KIND AND CLASS OF MATERIAL TO BE USED IN SUCH WORK, THE INSPECTION OF ELECTRICAL WORK, SCALE OF FEES FOR SUCH INSPECTION, CREATING THE OFFICE OF ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR, CREATING AN EXAMINING AND SUPERVISING BOARD, PROVIDING FOR THE GRANTING OF LICENSES TO INSTALL, MAINTAIN AND SELL ELECTRIC WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, TO PREVENT INCOMPETENT PERSONS, FIRMS OR CORPORATIONS FROM INSTALLING, MAINTAINING AND SELLING ELECTRIC WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT, DEFINING

TERMS USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, DEVICES AND EQUIPMENT AND PERSONS ENGAGED IN SUCH WORK, FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF A BOND AND THE COLLECTION OF PENALTIES UNDER SAID BOND FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ALL FORMER ORDINANCES RELATING THERETO AND IN CONFLICT WITH SAID ORDINANCE", be amended to read as follows:

2. "86. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell, offer for sale or display for sale, any electrical materials, wiring devices, electrical appliances or apparatus designed or intended for use on, or attachment to any system of electric wiring or to any electrical circuit for the purpose of light, heat or power to use thirty-two volts or more, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas, unless such materials wiring devices, appliances or apparatus conform to the recognized approved methods of construction and manufacture for the safety of life and property. Said electrical materials, devices or appliances shall conform to the standards approved by Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc., as shown by the lists of inspected and approved electrical appliances published by it, or with the standards approved by the American Engineering Standards Committee or the United States Bureau of Standards. the Maker's name, trademark or other identification symbol shall be on all electrical materials, devices or appliances sold, set or used under this ordinance, together with such other markings giving voltage, current, cycles, wattage, or other appropriate ratings prescribed in the National Electrical Code."

3. That Article 88 of the aforesaid ordinance, passed and approved on the 5 day of November, A. D. 1936, be and the same is hereby repealed.

4. That Article 96 of the aforesaid ordinance, passed and approved on the 5 day of November, A. D. 1936, be amended to read as follows:

5. "96. No certificate of approval shall be issued unless the installation is in strict conformity with the provisions of this ordinance, the statutes of the State of Texas, and unless it is in conformity with approved methods of construction for safety to life and property. The regulations as laid down in the National Electrical Code, as approved by the American Standards Association, and in the National Electrical Safety Code, as approved by the American Standards Association, and other installation and safety regulations approved by the American Standards Association shall be the accepted code for the Electrical Inspector in his construction of this ordinance."

6. That Article 98 of the aforesaid ordinance, passed and approved on the 5 day of November, A. D. 1936, be amended to read as follows:

7. "98. In all buildings within the City Limits of San Antonio, Texas, on all new wiring and additions thereto, or alterations of old wiring, and attached to all exterior walls, and inside of all buildings and structures, of whatever kind, placed within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas, as same now exists, or may hereafter be extended from time to time, the approved types of wiring systems are as follows and are the only types which are approved under the conditions stated. In the given case, in order to meet with approval, a type of wiring must be approved for use under all the existing conditions. (Only such conduits and ducts will be approved in any case as will permit the conductors to be easily and readily inserted and removed after said conduit or duct is in place."

8. That Article 99 of the aforesaid ordinance, passed and approved on the 5 day of November, A. D. 1936, be amended to read as follows:

9. "99. WITHIN BUILDINGS, dry places; Rigid metal threaded pipe size conduit, Flexible metal conduit, surface metal moulding of base and cap type, Underfloor ducts, Auxillary gutters."

10. That Article 100 of the aforesaid ordinance, passed and approved on the 5 day

of November, A. D. 1936, be amended to read as follows:

11. "100. WITHIN BUILDINGS, wet or damp places; Rigid metal threaded pipe size conduit."

12. That Article 101 of the aforesaid ordinance, passed and approved on the 5 day of November, A. D. 1936, be amended to read as follows:

13. "101. WITHIN BUILDINGS, in unfinished basements or other unfinished spaces having floors below the ground level; for exposed work, Rigid metal threaded pipe size conduit.

14. That Article 102 of the aforesaid ordinance, passed and approved on the 5 day of November, A. D. 1936, be amended to read as follows:

15. "102. EXTERIOR OF BUILDINGS, or otherwise exposed to the weather; Rigid metal threaded pipe size conduit, made weatherproof."

16. That Article 103 of the aforesaid ordinance, passed and approved on the 5 day of November, A. D. 1936, be amended to read as follows:

17. "103. UNDERGROUND, Rigid metal threaded galvanized iron pipe size conduit with lead covered conductors, Flexible metal conduit with lead covered conductors only where accessible."

18. WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of order, good government and public safety that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore upon the passage of this ordinance by a vote of 4/5 of the Commissioners it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas.

AN ORDINANCE

OI-224

MAKING A CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR THE ELIMINATION OF UNFIT DWELLINGS, FOR THE FURNISHING OF CERTAIN CITY SERVICES, ETC.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. This ordinance creates and manifests the contract entered into between the City of San Antonio and the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, whose name is subscribed hereto in acceptance and ratification hereof and made a part hereof for all purposes that is to say:

2. WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio (herein called the "Authority") proposes to develop and administer four low-rent housing projects of approximately 200 to 800 dwelling units each (herein called the "Project") within the territorial limits of the City of San Antonio (herein called the "City") including a total of approximately 1200 to 1500 dwelling units: and

3. WHEREAS, in connection with the development of the project, the Authority desires to eliminate unsafe or insanitary dwelling units situated within the territorial limits of the City substantially equal in number to the number of newly constructed dwelling units to be provided by the Project: and

4. WHEREAS, the Authority has requested the City to cooperate with it and assist it in the elimination of such unsafe and insanitary dwelling units: and

5. WHEREAS, there exist in the City unsafe or insanitary dwelling units to a greater number than the number of new dwelling units to be included in the Project, and it is necessary and desirable that the City should eliminate such unsafe or insanitary dwelling units to protect the health, safety and morals of the inhabitants of this City: and

6. WHEREAS, it is necessary that the present low-income occupants of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units be provided with new dwelling units at rentals they can afford to pay; and

7. WHEREAS, it is necessary to the public health, safety and welfare of the City that the present low-income occupants of unsafe or insanitary dwellings in the City be provided with safe and sanitary dwellings at rentals they can afford to pay: and

8. WHEREAS, the City will directly benefit from the construction of new dwelling units for families of low income and from the elimination of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units within the City: and

9. WHEREAS, the Housing Authority Law of the State of Texas provides that "the property of an authority is declared to be public property used for essential and governmental purposes and such property and authority shall be exempt from all taxes and special assessments of the City, County, the State or any political subdivision thereof", and by virtue of said provision all the property of the Authority is exempt from all taxation by the City and all other political subdivisions of the State of Texas: and

10. WHEREAS, the City desires to cooperate with the Authority in respect to the development and operation of the Project by furnishing customary municipal services and facilities to the Project and the tenants thereof without cost or charge to them and to cooperate in other ways with the Authority.

11. NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and further in consideration of the mutual promises and undertakings hereinafter set forth, the City and Authority agree as follows:

12. The City agrees to eliminate unsafe or insanitary dwelling units of a number at least equal to the number of new dwelling units to be provided in the low-rent housing project (herein called the "Project") to be developed by the Authority (less the number of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units to be eliminated from the site of the Project by the Authority during the development of the Project), but in no event to exceed 1500 unsafe or insanitary dwelling units.

13. The City agrees to eliminate such unsafe or insanitary dwelling units within the territorial limits of the City.

14. The City agrees to eliminate such unsafe or insanitary dwelling units in one or the other of the following ways, or partly in one of these ways and partly in another:

15. By demolishing such dwelling units which are on land acquired by the City by purchase or otherwise, including demolition of such dwelling units on land purchased for any public uses: or

16. By causing the compulsory demolition, effective closing, repair or improvement of such unsafe and insanitary dwelling units: or

17. By inducing private owners voluntarily to eliminate such dwelling units:

18. In computing the number of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units eliminated under the terms of this Agreement, there shall be included all unsafe or insanitary dwelling units eliminated under this Agreement from the date hereof; provided, however, that all unsafe or insanitary dwelling units eliminated by the City prior to the date of this Agreement but after September 1, 1937, will be counted as elimination under this Agreement if the Authority is satisfied that such elimination was undertaken in anticipation of the execution of this Agreement.

19. In computing the number of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units eliminated under the terms of this Agreement, the remedying of violations of local building codes or ordinances by compulsory action of the City, insofar as it results in the elimination of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units, shall be considered as elimination. The voluntary remedying of such violations shall not be considered as elimination.

20. For the purpose of this Agreement a dwelling unit shall be considered unsafe or insanitary whenever by reason of dilapidation, faulty arrangement or design, lack of ventilation, light or sanitation facilities, or any combination of these factors, it is detrimental to safety, health or morals.

21. The Authority agrees:

22. To advise the officers in charge of appropriate departments of the City of the existence of any unsafe or insanitary dwelling units in the City which the Authority finds as a result of its surveys or studies;

23. To make reports to the City, from time to time, regarding such matters; and

24. To cooperate with the City in securing the elimination of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units required hereunder.

25. The City agrees to cause its officers in charge of appropriate departments to make reports to the Authority from time to time regarding:

26. The Action taken by the City in the elimination or repair of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units hereunder;

27. The dates of such action:

28. The location of such dwelling units: and

29. The condition of such dwelling units which made them unsafe or insanitary.

30. The Authority and the City agree that the elimination undertaken and required hereunder shall be considered as a part of the Project:

31. The City agrees to complete the elimination required hereunder within one year from the date of physical completion of the Project.

32. The City agrees that, during the period commencing with the date of the acquisition of any part of the site or sites for any Project and continuing throughout the useful life of such Project, it will furnish, without cost or charge to the Authority or the tenants thereof, municipal services and facilities for such Project and the tenants thereof, of the same character as those furnished without cost or charge for other dwellings and inhabitants in the City, including but not limited to: fire, police and health protection and services, street maintenance, garbage, trash and ash collection and disposal, street lighting on public streets within any Project and the boundaries thereof, and sewer services; that it will maintain in good repair and working order any and all municipal utilities and facilities, provided by it for the use and benefit of any Project or Projects and the tenants thereof; and that it will maintain in good repair streets, roads and alleys which are within, adjacent or leading to the boundaries of any Project or Projects. The term "useful life of such Project" as used in the foregoing, shall mean the period of physical usefulness of the Project for the purpose of providing dwelling accommodations, but in no event less than the number of years during which any of the bonds issued to aid in financing the development of the Project shall remain outstanding.

33. The City agrees to plan or replan, zone or rezone to an appropriate residential classification, any area in the City within which a Project or Projects shall be located, and that it will vacate, furnish, dedicate, close, pave, install, grade or regrade, plan or replan any streets, roads, roadways, alleys, sidewalks or other places, which the Authority finds are necessary in the development of the Projects, in the area of a Project or Projects or adjacent

thereto.

34. The City agrees to waive such building and inspection fees as might be payable by the Authority if it is or becomes subject to the payment of such fees, and agrees to make such exceptions from building regulations and ordinances as are found by the Authority to be necessary in the development of the Projects.

35. The Authority agrees to dedicate, and the City agrees to accept for municipal purposes, land which may be owned or acquired by the Authority and which the Authority determines to use for streets and alleys within the boundaries of the Project or for the purpose of providing ingress thereto and egress therefrom. The cost of the laying out, grading and paving of such streets and alleys shall be financed in such manner as may be agreed upon by the City and the Authority.

36. The Authority agrees that it will use its best efforts to develop the Project as rapidly as possible and to operate and maintain such Project for families of low income. The Authority agrees to keep the City fully informed as to the status of the Project.

37. The contract made by this ordinance for the four separate Projects herein described is in addition to the Project specified in the contract created by the ordinance passed and approved by the City of San Antonio on the 10 day of June, A. D. 1938.

38. The City consents to the assignment of this Agreement for the protection of the holders of any bonds issued to aid in financing the development of the Project, but the City accepts no responsibility for the payment of interest or principal of said bonds.

GRANTING BEXAR COUNTY AN EASEMENT TO EXTEND MCCULLOUGH AVENUE ACROSS THE
OLMOS BASIN FROM BASSE ROAD TO UJAZEY ROAD

- - -

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the City of San Antonio in consideration of the construction and maintenance of a road and the necessary appurtenances thereof, by the County of Bexar, on the property herein described:-

2. Does grant and convey unto the County of Bexar, its successors and assigns, to have and to hold, a free and continuous easement to use the following described land as a highway and for purposes incidental thereto, the same being 1.01 acres in O. C. L. 38, Range 3, District 3, and 2.04 acres in the Camarillo Survey 3, now a part of the Olmos Flood Basin, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:-

3. Beginning at the intersection of the N. line of the Basse Road and the E. line of the old Herff-Dittmar Road, said point being 1395.9' S. 89°-50' E. from a monument, marking the intersection of the N. line of the Basse Road and the W. line of the City of San Antonio tract; Thence North, at 1476.14' the line between O. C. L. 38, Range 3, Dist. 3, and the Pedro Camarillo Survey No. 3, a total distance for this course of 1510.2' to a point on the N. E. line of the old Herff-Dittmar Road; Thence N. 53°-07' W., 37.24' with said N. E. line to a point on the W. line of the McCullough Avenue extension; Thence North 1451.98' with said W. line to a point on the N. line of the City of San Antonio tract, said point being 10.54' from a City of San Antonio monument; Thence S. 75°-E. 62.12' with said N. line to a point on the E. line of the McCullough Avenue extension, said point being 95.34' N. 75°-00' W. from a City of San Antonio monument; Thence with the E. line of the McCullough Avenue extension, South at 1514.08' the line between the Pedro Camarillo Survey No. 3 and O. C. L. 38, Range 3, District 3, and continuing 60' from and parallel to the W. line of O. C. L. 38, Range 3, District 3, a total distance for this course of 2968.16' to a point on the N. line of the Basse Road; thence N. 89°-50' W., 30.0' with said N. line to place of beginning.

4. This easement is permissive and subject to the right of the City to use this property as a part of the flood protection system of San Antonio essential to the public safety of the City; and, if at any time public necessity requires the alteration or revocation of this privilege, the City shall not be held liable to the County of Bexar, its assigns or successors, for any demand for damages or payment of money for the termination hereof.

5. The exercise of any right under this permit by the permittee shall operate as an acceptance of all of the conditions hereof without further formality.

6. This instrument and the conditions thereof shall be covenants running with the land.

7. This instrument constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, there being no other written or parole agreement with any officer or employee of the City, it being understood that the Charter of the City of San Antonio requires all contracts to be in writing and approved by ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE

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ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE SECURITIES PLEDGED BY THE FROST NATIONAL BANK OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE ALAMO NATIONAL BANK OF SAN ANTONIO TO SECURE THE CITY FUNDS DEPOSITED AND TO BE DEPOSITED IN SAID BANKS BY THE CITY DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1938, AND DIRECTING THE DEPOSITING OF SAID SECURITIES FOR SAFE-KEEPING AND RELEASING THE SURETIES ON ALL BONDS HERETOFORE GIVEN BY SAID BANKS AS CITY DEPOSITORY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the securities pledged with the governing body of the City of San Antonio by the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, as City depositories, to secure the funds of said City deposited and to be deposited in said banks, respectively, during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938, and ending May 31, 1939, be and the same are hereby accepted and approved, and that receipt signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, and attested by the City Clerk, be given to each of said banks for the securities pledged by it, which said securities are described as follows:

1. (a) Securities pledged by the Frost National Bank are described in the attached Exhibit "A" which is made a part of this ordinance by reference as fully as if it were specified herein.

1. (b) Securities pledged by the Alamo National Bank are described in the attached Exhibit "B" which is made a part of this ordinance by reference as fully as if it were specified herein.

2. The receipt given to each bank for the securities pledged by it shall recite, in substance, that the said securities have been duly pledged with the governing body of the City of San Antonio, by the bank pledging same, as a depository of said City, for the purpose of securing the funds of said City deposited and to be deposited in said bank during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1938, upon the terms and conditions prescribed and provided by law.

3. It is directed that said securities be deposited by the Mayor, for safe-keeping in safe deposit boxes in the vaults of said banks rented by the City from the banks, those pledged by the said Alamo National Bank in its vaults and those pledged by the Frost National Bank in its vaults.

4. That all securities on all bonds heretofore given to said City, by the said Alamo National Bank as City Depository and by the said Frost National Bank as City Depository be and are hereby released from further liability as sureties on such bonds.
