

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, JANUARY 23RD, A.D. 1922, 5 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

On motion of Commissioner Rieden, duly seconded and carried, the hearing to the owners of property, and others interested in the improvement of Dallas Street, between Brooklyn Avenue and Jones Avenue; and Lakeview Avenue, between Main Avenue and Soledad Street, set for this date, was continued to Thursday, January 26th, A.D. 1922.

Commissioner Rieden introduced the following resolutions, which were read and adopted:

RESOLUTION

Directing the City Clerk to advertise for bids for constructing sidewalks on Losoya Street. BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City Clerk be and he is hereby directed to advertise for bids for constructing sidewalks on both sides of Losoya Street in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Engineer; each proposal to be accompanied by cashiers check in a sum equal to 10% of the amount bid, the City reserving the right to reject any and all bids. Bids to be received until 4 o'clock p.m. Feb. 6, 1922.

RESOLUTION

Directing the City Clerk to advertise for bids for the grading of Simpson Street. BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City Clerk be and he is hereby directed to advertise for bids for the grading of Simpson Street, from Garden Street to Probandt Street; bids to be received until 4 o'clock p.m. February 6, 1922. Each proposal to be accompanied by check in an amount equal to ten per cent of amount bid. City of San Antonio reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

RESOLUTION

Authorizing receiving bids for paving Losoya Street and E. Crockett Street. BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, bids for the paving of Losoya Street, from Commerce Street to Crockett Street; and of E. Crockett Street, from Alamo Plaza to Losoya Street, previously advertised and received, and rejected on recommendation of the City Engineer, be again received until the 26th day of January, 1922 at 4 o'clock p.m. without readvertisement, as provided for in the "Improvement Ordinance" of the City. Such new bids to be made upon former specifications, plans and profiles, approved by the Commissioners, and subject to all the provisions with reference to the original bids.

RESOLUTION

Authorizing the receiving of bids for the paving of Navarro Street, from Houston Street to Commerce Street. BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, bids for the paving of Navarro Street, from Houston Street to Commerce Street, previously advertised and received and opened January 9, 1922, be again received until 26th day of January, 1922, at 4 o'clock p.m., without readvertisement, as provided for in the "Improvement Ordinance" of the City. Such new bids to be made upon specifications, plans and profiles on file in the office of the City Engineer, and subject to all the provisions with reference to original bids.

RESOLUTION

Ordering street improvements (Navarro St. Commerce to Mill bridge, Poplar Street, Cameron St. to N. Flores, N. Flores to San Pedro Avenue, San Pedro Avenue to Main Ave., Main Ave. to Euclid Ave.) (For full text of this resolution see Street Improvement Records, Vol 9, page 190)

In accordance with the recommendation of the City Purchasing Agent, bids were awarded as follows:

Square Deal Elec Co. to furnish wire cable for Fire Alarm Dept.
Lone Star Printing Co. for printing permit slips.

Chas J. Rossy, for supplying license tags.

On motion of Commissioner Riden, the bid of the Weinrich Motor Co. was accepted for furnishing the City with two motor cars.

Commissioner Wright moved the passage of an ordinance "providing for the registration of bicycles by the owners thereof, and for the prevention of theft of same, and for the detection and identification of lost or stolen bicycles, and providing for a penalty for the violation hereof", which was adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright. Commissioner Wright introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

AN ORDINANCE

Making it unlawful for any person or persons, or the agent or employee of any person, firm or corporation to sell to, give to, or place in the possession of any person under the age of sixteen years, any fire cracker, cannon cracker, any gun, toy gun, pistol, toy pistol, or any toy cannon, etc.etc. (For full text of this ordinance see Ordinance Book F, pages 617 and 618)

Commissioner Wright made the following recommendations, which were adopted:
Petition San Lang Grocery Co. for permit to erect electric sign Commerce and S. Concho. granted.
June Lee, for permit to erect electric sign 918 W.Commerce St. granted.

On motion of Commissioner Wright, duly seconded and carried, the City Purchasing Agent was authorized to arrange for the purchase of overcoats for the Police and Fire Department, and to have same dyed.

On motion of Commissioner Wright, duly seconded and carried, the City Purchasing Agent was directed to advertise for the purchase of a 1000 gal. motor pumping car for the Fire Department.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting sdjourned.
