AT 10:00 O'CLOCK, A. M. ON THURSDAY, DECEMBER 9TH, 1943.

A resolution was offered by Commissioner Anderson, duly seconded and unanimously carried, that a letter be written extending condolences from the City Commissioners to the family of Colonel John N. Reynolds, U. S. Army retired, who died on December 7th, 1943, and that a copy of said letter be spread upon the Minutes of the Proceedings of the City Council.

"RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commissioners have learned of the death within the past twenty-four hours of Col. John N. Reynolds, United States Army, Retired, and

WHEREAS, Colonel Reynolds has throughout his residence in San Antonio been an outstanding citizen and a leader in affairs both military and civic, working always toward the betterment of San Antonio, and

WHEREAS, Colonel Reynolds responded to the call of our City when the present war emergency broke upon us without warning, precipitated by the dastardly sneak attack of the Japanese barbarians upon our peaceful nation, and

WHEREAS, Colonel Reynolds took the leadership in the organization of vitally-needed Civilian Defense functions and directed the operation of Civilian Defense measures in our time of peril and until he was forced by ill health to resign this directorship shortly before his death, and

WHEREAS, Colonel Reynolds, by his leadership and achievements, provided inspiration for all our citizens and helped to make ever stronger the close ties between military and civilian life through which San Antonio has grown and prospered;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commission of the City of San Antonio take due notice of the passing of Colonel John N. Reynolds, extend condolences to his bereaved family, and set aside a page in the Minutes of this meeting of the City Commission in order that a permanent record of this official Resolution may be made -- to direct the attention of all to the inspiring achievements of Colonel Reynolds and to duly record the sorrow of the City of San Antonio upon losing so outstanding a citizen.
