AUTHORIZING PAYMENT OF \$6,825.00 TO BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR RENTAL OF 273 VOTING MACHINES USED IN THE APRIL 4, 1967 AND APRIL 18, 1967 CITY ELECTIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. The payment of \$6,825.00 to Bexar County, payable to the order of the Bexar County Treasurer for the rental of 273 voting machines used in the April 4, 1967 general election and April 18, 1967 runoff election, is hereby authorized.

2. Payment of the above amount shall be made out of Elections Account 03-02-01, Code 2-10, of the General Fund.



Gentlemen:

The City of San Antonio will hold an election on Tuesday, April 4, 1967 at which the qualified electors will cast ballots for nine (9) Members of the City Council. A Run-off election will be held on Tuesday, April 18, 1967 if necessary.

The City respectfully requests the use of approximately three hundred (300) Shoup voting machines for the elections under the following conditions:

1. The County will rent the machines to the City of San Antonio for \$25.00 per machine for both elections. The \$25.00 fee is to be based on the maximum number of machines used in the April 4th election. (For example: The City uses 300 machines for the first election, and 200 machines for the run-off election. The cost to the City for use of the machines for both elections would be 300 machines at \$25.00 for a total of \$7,500.00.) This is the same arrangement we have used in the past when there is a possibility of a run-off election. The rental fee includes the cost of preparing and servicing voting machines.
2. The County will provide three (3) mechanics for set-up before the election and service on election day.
3. The County will render a bill to the City of San Antonio immediately after the election, for the rental of the machines.
4. The City will provide all printing that is necessary and all necessary typing, such as envelopes, machine lists, etc.
5. The City will provide transportation of machines to and from polling places.



6. The City will provide transportation for mechanics in radio controlled vehicles on election day.
7. The City will inspect during the set-up period all of the machines before sealing.

If these terms are acceptable, it is requested that the Commissioners Court pass an Order approving such an agreement.

VOTING MACHINES

ORDER APPROVING THE RENTAL OF THREE HUNDRED (300) SHOUP VOTING MACHINES TO THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR ITS CITY ELECTION TO BE HELD ON APRIL 4, 1967, AT A RENTAL FEE OF \$25.00 PER MACHINE, AS PER THE REQUEST OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO DATED FEBRUARY 20, 1967. (RECORD)

A motion was presented by County Commissioner A. J. Ploch, duly seconded by County Commissioner Albert A. Pena, Jr., which motion was voted on as follows: Commissioners Pena, Wurzbach, Helland, Ploch and Judge Reeves voting "Aye:" It is ordered by the Court that the rental of three hundred (300) Shoup Voting Machines to the City of San Antonio for its City Election to be held on April 4, 1967 be and hereby is approved. Said rental shall be at the rate of \$25.00 per machine, said rental fee to include the cost of preparing and servicing said machines prior to the election, as per the request of the City of San Antonio dated February 20, 1967. The City of San Antonio is to further pay for the drayage of said machines from the Bexar County Election Center and the return of said machines to the Bexar County Election Center. The City of San Antonio shall assume all liability for damages to or destruction of said machines directly caused by the negligence of the City of San Antonio, its officers, agents, servants and/or employees while in the actual custody of the said City of San Antonio.
