"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio enter into a cooperation agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas, as authorized by Art. 12691, V.A.T.S., for the purpose of aiding and cooperating in the planning, undertaking, construction and operation of 1,500 low-rent housing units by said Housing Authority within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas?"

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on the 30th day of May, 1959, in conformity with the election ordinance heretofore passed by the City Council and the result of said election has been certified and returned to this Council by the proper judges and clerks of said election; and

PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE LIMITS OF
THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE ANNEXATION OF
CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TERRITORY ADJACENT TO THE
PRESENT NORTHEAST CITY LIMITS OF SAN ANTONIO

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. The boundary and limits of the City of San Antonio are hereby changed and extended so as to include the following described territory which lies adjacent to the present city limits of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas:

BEGINNING at the most Northeastern corner of the present City limits of San Antonio, being more particularly described as the intersection of lines being 500 feet North of the Northwest line of U. S. Highway 81 and 500 feet East of the West right-of-way line of the Missouri-Kansas & Texas Railroad.

THENCE N 77° 08' 52" E, a distance of 562.97 feet to a point on the Northeast line of an access road.

THENCE S 75° 19' 30" E, a distance of 148.48 feet to a point on the East line of Sherri Ann Drive.

THENCE S 41° 56' E, a distance of 326.90 feet to a point on the East line of Randolph Boulevard.

THENCE S 48° 14' W, along the East line of Randolph Boulevard, a distance of 102.18 feet to a point.

THENCE S 65° 27' E, a distance of 119.30 feet to a Texas Highway Department R.O.W. marker set next to a fence corner for a point.

COUNTY OF BEXAR

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas, has heretofore created the Bexar County Child Welfare Board, and has named seven resident citizens of Bexar County, Texas, as members thereof; and

WHEREAS, said Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas, has appropriated the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) to said Board for the protection and care of dependent and neglected children in said County to be disbursed monthly upon certain specified conditions and stipulations; and

WHEREAS, the Child Welfare Division of the State Department of Public Welfare has agreed at its own cost and expense to furnish the services of four (4) qualified case workers to work under the direction of the Administrator herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, which include the County of Bexar, Texas, hereinafter referred to as County; the Bexar County Child Welfare Board, hereinafter referred to as Board, and the City of San Antonio, Texas, hereinafter referred to as City, agree and contract as follows:

1. The City agrees to administer the Dependent and Neglected Children Program in Bexar County through the Division of Public Welfare of the City Public Health Department. The Administrator of said Division of Public Welfare shall act as Administrator of Child Welfare Services who shall be responsible for investigating the status of alleged dependent and neglected children, and the keeping of all records, employment of qualified personnel and administration of direct aid and relief to such children.

2. The City further agrees to furnish office space and utilities and such office furnishings as may be available to house such Administrator and personnel. In this connection, in addition to the services of such Administrator, City will employ one (1) Child Welfare Supervisor (pay range, \$485.00 - \$635.00 per month) and two (2) Clerk-Typists II (pay range, \$220.00 - \$280.00 per month) who shall devote their full time to the administration of such program. The County will reimburse City, as hereinafter provided, the full amount of the salary paid to said Child Welfare Supervisor and Clerk-Typists II, including City's share of social security and retirement costs (Texas Municipal Retirement System) and payments made by City on behalf of such employees under the Federal Social Security program. County will also reimburse City for car allowances, (\$50.00) per month per employee, paid by City to case workers assigned by the Child Welfare Division of the State Department of Public Welfare.

Any additional office furnishings required will be purchased by the Administrator at the expense of Bexar County, but the cost of such furniture shall in no event exceed the sum of Thirty Two Hundred Dollars (\$3,200.00). Title to all such furniture so purchased shall remain in Bexar County, Texas, and should this contract be terminated at any time for any reason as hereinafter provided, or should the Commissioners Court of said County not renew this contract as hereinafter provided, or should said Court make no further appropriation for the Dependent and Neglected Children's Program, then in any such event said furniture so purchased will be delivered to the agents of Bexar County designated by the Commissioners Court to receive it.

3. It is agreed by the parties hereto that the said Administrator shall furnish monthly reports to the Commissioners Court on or before the 5th day of each month showing substantially the following:

- (1) The amount spent during the period for direct relief.
- (2) Administrative Expenses during the period.
- (3) Investigative Expenses during the period.
- (4) All other services performed for said Dependent and Neglected Children during the period.

Upon receipt of such reports the Commissioners Court within five (5) days thereafter shall authorize the immediate expenditure of the amounts shown by such report, provided that the total amount to be expended for all purposes shall not be in excess of the total of \$30,000.00 appropriated, nor shall the total of items for administrative expenses and payment of personnel be in excess of \$15,000.00 as hereinafter provided.

4. It is further agreed by the parties hereto that the services to be furnished and the relief to be granted shall be restricted to dependent and neglected children living within the geographical confines of Bexar County, Texas, but shall not be restricted to dependent and neglected children living within the geographical confines of the City of San Antonio, Texas.

5. It is agreed and understood by the parties hereto that not more than the Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) of the total amount appropriated shall be used for administration expenses, employment of personnel, psychiatric, medical and nursing services and any other expenses and services necessary and proper for the care and relief of such dependent and neglected children, which include but are not limited to the services herein set out, without the express permission of the Commissioners Court.

6. It is further agreed and understood by the parties hereto that the remainder of said appropriation of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) less the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) set aside for administrative expenses and the payment of personnel, and the sum of Thirty Two Hundred Dollars (\$3,200.00) to be paid for furniture, may if necessary, at the discretion of the Administrator and upon the advice and consent of said Bexar County Child Welfare Board, be expended for direct assistance to dependent and neglected children.

7. It is further agreed and understood by the parties hereto that all applications for assistance shall be on forms substantially as are required by the Texas Department of Public Welfare and as required by Section 22 of Article 695c, R.C.S., and that the investigation and record of cases requiring assistance shall be substantially as required by the Texas State Department of Public Welfare and by Section 23 of Article 695c, R.C.S

8. This contract shall be for a term ending on December 31, 1959.

9. This contract may be extended upon the mutual consent of the parties. Representatives of the parties concerned shall confer on or before November 1, 1959, to decide whether any extension is desirable and, if so, any modification or adjustments necessary.

10. This contract may be terminated by either party upon written notice given sixty (60) days in advance by one party to the other. Notice shall state the exact date of the termination of the services, and the City shall be bound to furnish all services to which it is obligated under this agreement through such date, and the County shall be obligated to pay the agreed compensation or reimbursement for such services through such date.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING PERMISSION TO MILTON A. RYAN AND WIFE TO USE THE CITY SANITARY SEWERS BY A CONNECTION OUTSIDE OF THE CITY LIMITS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the petition of Milton A. Ryan and wife, for a license to use the sanitary sewerage system of the City of San Antonio, is granted hereby, subject to the following precedent conditions;

2. That the permit hereby granted is temporary, and the City reserves the right to revoke same at any time, with or without notice.

3. That the house plumbing and the connection with the City sewer shall be made and maintained at the cost and risk of the Licensee, in conformity with the ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

4. That this permit is intended to cover only the sewerage from the property of the Licensee, as same is now situated on said premises at 1004 Eventide, Lot 18, Block 12, Morningside Heights Unit #4, Terrell Hills, and no other person shall be permitted to use the said City Sanitary Sewers through the connection hereby made.

5. That the future owner of the above property shall comply with all the provisions hereof, and the conditions are covenants running with the land.

6. The Chief Building Inspector is hereby directed to refuse any building permit or permits for the erection of any building structure, ~~plant~~ or other thing within the proposed route established by the accompanying route map; and to refuse any building permits for the rebuilding of existing structures which are destroyed by fire or which are partially destroyed where the cost of reconstruction or repairs is in excess of 25% of the value of the structure ~~before~~ the fire, or for the repair of any existing structure where the cost of repairs to be made within any one calendar year is in excess of 25% of the value of the structure before repairs are made.

WHEREAS, Northwest Center, Inc., subdivider, wishes to make agreements for the development of a shopping center on the east side of Fredericksburg Road between Gardina Street and Renner Drive; and

WHEREAS, said shopping center location is within an area designated by the City for sanitary sewer and drainage improvements under proposed bond projects; and

WHEREAS, cooperation between the City and Northwest Center, Inc., subdivider, in the development of the mentioned area is mutually beneficial to the parties; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Renner Drive

1. This ordinance makes and manifests an agreement by and between the City of San Antonio, hereinafter called "City", and Northwest Center, Inc., a corporation existing under the laws of the State of Texas, hereinafter called "Subdivider", in words and figures as follows:

(a) Subdivider agrees to vacate the original subdivision involving ^{New} City Blocks 9528, 9529, 9530 and 9531 and will submit to the Planning Commission of the City of San Antonio a resubdivision plat of its property between Renner Drive and Gardina Street, abutting Fredericksburg Road.

(b) In connection with the vacating outlined in the paragraph next above, Subdivider agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City against any and all claims arising out of the vacating of Renner Drive which constitutes the northern boundary of Subdivider's property. Subdivider will bear the sole obligation for defending any suits or proceedings which might arise from the closing of Renner Drive by the replatting mentioned above. Subdivider shall provide the City with an indemnity bond, in a form to be approved by the City Attorney, in the amount of \$10,000.00 to insure against any claims or actions resulting from or connected with the vacating of Renner Drive.

(c) All vacating and resubdivision plats prepared and submitted to the San Antonio Planning Commission, pursuant to this agreement, shall conform to the San Antonio Planning Area Subdivision regulations.

(d) In addition to the requirements of Paragraph 1. (c) above, Subdivider agrees to acquire and dedicate to the City, in the resubdivision plat provided for herein, the following:

(1) Sufficient property from Lot 1, New City Block 10356, to assure a minimum 50 foot right-of-way access into the shopping center at its northeast corner; and

(2) At the northeast corner of the property a 100 foot by 100 foot area as right-of-way for a cul-de-sac to provide a proper dead-ending of Renner Drive right-of-way from the east.

(e) Subdivider agrees to sell the City the following easements for a total consideration of \$38,276.00.

(1) Drainage easement for Project 72, 72X for \$19,138.00;

(2) A sanitary sewer easement for the Woodlawn Hills Interceptor Sewer Main Project S-14, S-15A & B for \$19,138.00;

Both easements are shown on the plat and field notes attached to this agreement and are incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A" hereof.

(f) The City agrees to purchase from Subdivider the easements outlined in Paragraph 1. (e) above and shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto, for a total consideration of \$38,276.00 when Subdivider has vacated the original subdivision involving New City Blocks 9528, 9529, 9530 and 9531; payment shall be made under such terms and conditions as may be outlined by City in said easement agreements.

(g) Subdivider agrees, at its own expense, to construct a drainage facility in the drainage easement to be purchased by the City as a part of this agreement. The drainage facility shall consist, in part, of an underground concrete box, and, in part, of an open concrete-lined channel in accordance with the plans and specifications developed by R. Marvin Shipman & Co., Inc., engineers. Said plans and specifications shall also be approved by the City.

Subdivider further agrees to commence the construction of this drainage facility within 120 days hereof and time shall be of the essence in this agreement.

(h) Subdivider agrees to allow City's Contractor sufficient working room in and around the sewer easement to be purchased hereunder and shown on Exhibit "A" hereof, in order to construct sewer mains in said easement.

(i) City agrees to furnish, at its own expense, a resident inspector for the period of construction of the drainage facility provided for herein in order to assure compliance with City's plans and specifications.

SUBJECT: 1959-1960 Pay Plan

Attached you will find the Pay Plan for the Fiscal Year 1959-60.

This Pay Plan was presented to and adopted by the City Council on June 25, 1959 and is effective August 1, 1959.

To make the Pay Plan more equitable in accordance with local industry, certain changes were necessary. These changes have been made to make employment with the City of San Antonio more attractive to both presently employed qualified workers and to new applicants to enable the City to retain competent employees and to hire new applicants that are well qualified.

In this Pay Plan nine (9) positions have been abolished, twenty-three (23) new positions have been created, four (4) positions have had title changes, code numbers have been changed for six (6) positions and change in salary ranges have been made in sixty-nine (69) positions.

The changes in this Pay Plan will necessitate changes in the Job Specifications Manual. To maintain uniformity in making these changes, all manual holders will be advised by the Personnel Office when the changes should be made. These changes will also necessitate the reclassification of some employees without salary changes and the reclassification of some employees with salary changes. When employee reclassification is necessary, the appropriate Department Head should submit a Change of Status Form for each affected employee requesting that these changes be made as of August 1, 1959. Where a change in salary occurs in the reclassification process this change should also be included.

You will note in this Pay Plan that a differential in pay has been made for a forty (40) hour work week, a forty-four (44) hour work week and a forty-eight (48) hour work week. This was done to eliminate dissatisfaction among employees who regularly work more than a forty (40) hour work week but receive no extra pay for the extra time worked. For all positions where the employee may be regularly assigned to a work week of more than forty (40) hours a different schedule of pay is shown. Schedule 1 is the pay for forty (40) hour work week, schedule 2 is the pay for a forty-four (44) hour work week and schedule 3 is the pay for a forty-eight (48) hour work week. Schedule 2 always starts at the second step of schedule 1 and schedule 3 always starts at the third step of schedule 1.

If during the 1959-60 fiscal year it becomes necessary for any position not shown in this Pay Plan under schedules 1, 2 or 3 to cause employees to regularly work more than forty (40) hours a week their pay will conform to the appropriate schedule.


Payroll changes will be made in accordance with the following instructions:

1. When the present salary of an employee is below the minimum of the new salary range it should be increased to the new salary range minimum on the effective date of this Pay Plan.
2. An employee who is in any step beyond Step B in the old Pay Plan and whose change of salary range would put him in Step A of the new salary range will be put in Step B of the new salary range.
3. Where a change in class numbers has been made, Departmental Payroll Clerks make the necessary changes.

The only immediate automatic pay raise will be as covered in Paragraph 1. Employees whose rate of pay puts them in Step A of a new salary range will be required to serve six months in that step. After completion of six months satisfactory work an automatic increase to Step B will be given.

All provisions in previous Wage Administration Directives that are in conflict with the provisions of this Directive are hereby cancelled.

1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to attest, on behalf of the City of San Antonio, a contract with the County of Bexar concerning the location of the new Bexar County Jail and the new City police Headquarters Building.
2. The contract is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF BEXAR

THIS CONTRACT AND AGREEMENT entered into this ^{29th} day of June, 1959, by and between the City of San Antonio, Texas, acting herein by and through its City Manager and attested by its City Clerk, and the COUNTY OF BEXAR, TEXAS, acting herein by and through its County Judge and attested by its County Clerk.

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, by an ordinance passed on May 19, 1958, the City Council of the City of San Antonio called an election to be held in said City on June 10, 1958, for the purpose of submitting to the resident, qualified electors of said city who owned taxable property in said city and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, the following proposition:

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,150,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building in said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

and

WHEREAS, at the same meeting of the City Council, held on May 19, 1958, the Council adopted a resolution which provided that in the event the issuance of \$2,150,000.00 in General Obligation Bonds of the City of San Antonio for the purpose of construction of a new Police Headquarters Building was authorized at the aforesaid election to be held on June 10, 1958, none of said Bonds would be issued or sold until Bexar County shall have voted bonds or otherwise acquired funds for the purpose of constructing a new County Jail in said County; and

WHEREAS, said Resolution further provided that none of said \$2,150,000.00 in General Obligation Bonds would be issued or sold until the City of San Antonio and Bexar County "entered into a written agreement under the terms of which they shall have jointly determined the selection of the respective sites for the new Police Headquarters Building of the City of San Antonio and the new County Jail Building of Bexar County"; and

WHEREAS, by an order passed on May 19, 1958, the Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas, called an election to be held in said County on June 10, 1958, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified resident property taxpaying voters of Bexar County, Texas, who owned taxable property in said county, and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, for their action thereon, the following proposition:

PROPOSITION

"Shall the Commissioners' Court of Bexar County, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of Bexar County, Texas, in the principal amount of Three Million Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$3,850,000.00) Dollars, to mature serially or otherwise, as may be determined by the Commissioners' Court, but not exceeding twenty (20) years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed five (5%) per cent per annum, interest payable annually or semi-annually, for the purpose of paying for the construction and equipment of a County Jail Building, including the purchase and improvement of the site therefor, and to levy an annual ad valorem tax on all taxable property in said County sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and to create a sinking fund to pay the principal thereof as the same matures, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including, and particularly under and pursuant to, Chapter 476, as passed by the 55th Legislature of the State of Texas, Regular Session, 1957 (House Bill No. 762)?"

and

WHEREAS, at the same meeting of the Commissioners' Court, held on May 19, 1958, the Commissioners Court passed and adopted an Order which provided that in the event the bonds of Bexar County, Texas, in the amount of \$3,850,000.00 for the aforesaid purposes were voted at said election to be held on June 10, 1958, none of said bonds would be issued or sold until the City of San Antonio shall have voted or acquired funds for the purpose of constructing a new Police Headquarters Building for the City of San Antonio, and that none of said \$3,850,000.00 of bonds, if voted at said election to be held on June 10, 1958, would be issued or sold until the City of San Antonio and Bexar County entered into a written agreement under the terms of which they shall have jointly determined the selection of the respective sites for the new Police Headquarters Building of the City of San Antonio and the new County Jail Building of Bexar County; and

WHEREAS, at such election duly held in Bexar County on June 10, 1958, the issuance of \$3,850,000.00 of bonds of Bexar County, Texas, for the purpose of paying for the construction and equipment of a County Jail Building, including the purchase and improvement of the site therefor, as set forth in the above proposition, was authorized, sustained, and approved by a majority of the qualified resident property taxpaying voters of Bexar County, Texas, who owned taxable property in said county and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, voting in said election, there being 10,813 votes cast for the issuance of such bonds and 10,778 votes cast against the issuance of such bonds; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of General Obligation Bonds of the City of San Antonio, Texas, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building was authorized at an election duly held in said City on June 10, 1958; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to negotiations between the City of San Antonio and Bexar County, it is now the desire of the City of San Antonio, acting through its City Manager and attested by its City Clerk, and Bexar County, acting through its County Judge and attested by its County Clerk, to enter into a contract jointly determining the selection of the respective sites for the proposed new County Jail Building of Bexar County and the proposed new Police Headquarters Building of the City of San Antonio;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED:

I.

That the site for the new Bexar County Jail Building shall be upon certain tracts of land situated in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, contained within (but not necessarily all) of the area bounded as follows, to-wit: On the East bounded by the San Pedro Creek; on the North bounded by the South property line of Lot 1, New City Block 292; on the West bounded by South Laredo Street; and on the South bounded by Nueva Street.

II.

That the site of the new Police Headquarters Building shall be upon certain tracts of land situated in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, contained within (but not necessarily all) of the area bounded as follows, to-wit: On the East bounded by the San Pedro Creek; on the North bounded by Nueva Street; on the West bounded by South Laredo Street; and on the South bounded by Straus Street.

III.

That the City of San Antonio, as a part of the consideration of the agreement of Bexar County herein to construct its new County Jail on the above described site hereby selected for it, does hereby agree to acquire, at its expense, the hereinafter described portion of the above bounded site for said Bexar County Jail and to convey or cause same to be conveyed to Bexar County, such conveyance to vest good and indefeasible title in Bexar County, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances of any nature whatsoever. If there are any existing and valid zoning ordinances of the City of San Antonio in effect, prohibiting the use of such land to be conveyed by the City of San Antonio to Bexar County, or prohibiting the use of any of the land contained within the area defined in Paragraph designated I. hereinabove, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating a jail and its related facilities thereon, then, and in that event, the City of San Antonio agrees that it will rezone all of such property that is to comprise such jail site so as to permit the County to construct, maintain and operate said jail and its related facilities thereon.

The description of the property to be conveyed, or caused to be conveyed, by the City of San Antonio to Bexar County, is described as follows:

All that certain real property and improvements situated thereon lying and being situated in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, being all of Lots 2 and 3, New City Block 292, fronting approximately 193 feet on South Laredo Street and extending Eastwardly to the San Pedro Creek, with an average depth of approximately 317 feet.

That at the time the City of San Antonio shall convey, or cause to be conveyed, to Bexar County the property and the improvements thereon immediately hereinabove described, the City of San Antonio agrees to furnish, at its cost and expense, a certificate of title guaranty, in the face amount of the fair market value of the property being conveyed, issued by some reliable title company authorized to do business in the State of Texas, acceptable to Bexar County, guaranteeing to Bexar County that it has good and indefeasible title to the above described lands, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances; which certificate shall contain only such exceptions as may be satisfactory to the Commissioners' Court of Bexar County. Current taxes, rents, insurance, water charges, etc., shall be prorated to date of closing.

IV.

Bexar County agrees that it will, at its expense, acquire such additional land within the area described in Paragraph I. hereof, as it in its judgment may require for the purpose of constructing said jail and its related facilities.

V.

The City of San Antonio agrees that it will, as its expense, acquire such tracts of land within the area described in Paragraph II. hereof as it in its judgment may require for the purpose of construction said Police Headquarters and its related facilities.

VI.

Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the acquisition by either party of additional land, adjacent to or in the immediate vicinity of the land described in Paragraphs I. and II. hereof, for the purpose of providing space for the parking of motor vehicles.
