

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 16TH, A.D.1922, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS----

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police:
Mrs M. Stevens Shafer, for refund of taxes.
J.C. Arnold, for cancellation of taxes.
Rosendo Hernandez, for use of Cassiano Park., was referred to Commissioner of Parks, etc.

Petition for street light was read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police:
Jones Ave. & E. Ashby Place.

Petition for the paving of Quitman Street was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets, etc.

Bids for paving E. Huisache Ave. and Zarzamora Street were read and referred to the City Engineer for tabulation.

Bid for Market House Restaurant (one) was read and held over.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$200.00 to pay Greeven Bros.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$200.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of 1921 General Fund to pay Greeven Bros. for hauling and removing dead animals during the month of January, 1922, as per statement attached.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$2000.00 to pay Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$2000.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund to pay Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company for preparing base on Mistletoe Avenue, from Main Avenue to McCullough Avenue, as per estimate of City Engineer.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating the sum of One Thousand Dollars to pay Gus Huebner for lots 9, 10 and 11 in New City Block 3288 in Block 20 Highland Park Addition for use of gravel pit.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:
That the sum of One Thousand (\$1000) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund to pay Gus Huebner for lots 9, 10 and 11 in New City Block 3288 in Block 20 Highland Park, said lots to be used in gravel pits for use of street department. That said warrant be delivered to said Huebner on the delivery of a deed to said property to the City in accordance with the requirements of the City Attorney.

AN ORDINANCE

Accepting the bid of the Seagraves Company for the sale to the City of San Antonio of one Centrifugal pump to be used by the Fire Department of the City of San Antonio, and appropriating the sum of \$12,970.00 to pay therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:
 SECTION ONE: That the bid of the Seagraves Company for the sale of one Centrifugal pumper to be used by the Fire Department of the City of San Antonio be, and the same is hereby accepted and the Mayor of the City of San Antonio is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with said Seagraves Company, covering the same.
 Section Two: That the sum of \$12,970.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund, and charged to the Fire Department to pay said Seagraves Company for said centrifugal pumper; and the auditor of the City of San Antonio is hereby directed to issue warrant to pay for same.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$37.00 to pay fines ordered remitted by the Mayor.
 BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$37.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund to pay fines ordered remitted by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE

Authorizing and directing the Mayor of the City of San Antonio to enter into a contract with Ralph H. Cameron, architect to prepare plans and specifications and for the general supervision of the erection of an auditorium in the City of San Antonio, and providing for his compensation.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:
 Section One: That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Ralph H. Cameron, architect, employing the said Ralph H. Cameron to prepare plans and specifications covering the erection of an auditorium for the City of San Antonio, and to provide general supervision for the erection of said auditorium.
 Section Two: That the compensation for services of the said Ralph H. Cameron in preparing plans and specifications, and for furnishing general supervision of the erection of said auditorium, shall be three per cent upon the actual cost of the labor and materials going into the construction of said building.
