MB-104 AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating One Hundred and Ninety Three and 70/100 Dollars (\$193.70) for the purchase of five targets from San Antonio Arsenal for use of Municipal Rifle Range.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of One Hundred and Ninety three Dollars and seventy cents, (\$193.70) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the general fund for the purpose of paying the Commanding Officer of the San Antonio Arsenal for five sliding targets, 6 x 6 feet complete, for use on Municipal Rifle Range.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned until Tuesday, September 5th, A.D.1916. 4 P.M.
