SAN ANTONIO RANCH NEW TOWN PROJECT

Mr. Garza moved that the City Council go on record for the "removal of the "no-go" position which this City Council placed on the San Antonio Ranch New Town Project at a meeting held on October 21, 1971.

This action is intended to allow a reasonable time for the developers and City Staff to provide a common set of facts and assumptions requested by this City Council on previous occasions. Further, this time is to be utilized by the developer in preparing and presenting appropriate legal assurances regarding the project for City Council final review and decision.

It should also be noted that time is of the essence and the City Staff is hereby instructed to initiate immediate cooperative effort towards these ends with the developers of San Antonio Ranch.

~~It is also requested that designation of Mayor John Gatti, Councilwoman Carol Haberman and Councilman Charles Becker, as a City Council subcommittee, work with City Staff and the San Antonio Ranch Developers in preparing said legal assurances to the City in each of the following areas:~~

- A. Annexation of said project, either entirely or in stages, and feasibility thereof.
- B. The protection of the Edwards Underground Aquifer.
- C. Assurance that all City-type Federal Grants and programs are channeled through the City of San Antonio, with the City of San Antonio having the right to block those that may prove undesirable or competitive with other programs.
- D. Assistance from the San Antonio Ranch developers with the planning, analysis, and feasibility studies, for application and review process for a New Town in Town in San Antonio in whatever form is desired by the City after appropriate investigation of a New Town in Town and of such assistance.
- E. Provision of utility service to the San Antonio Ranch New Town and feasibility thereof.
- F. That guidelines for Federal agencies under the National Environmental Policy Act issued by the Council on Environmental Quality on April 23, 1971, be complied with, particularly Section 2, entitled, "Policy," and only if such assurances have been structured to the City Council's satisfaction will the final approval for San Antonio Ranch New Project be considered."

The motion was seconded by Mr. Becker.

After discussion of the motion, Mr. Naylor suggested that that part of the motion referring to a subcommittee be deleted as he felt that the Council could appoint a committee whenever it felt the need. This amendment to the motion was accepted by Mr. Garza and Mr. Becker.

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In answer to a question, City Attorney Howard Walker stated that adoption of this motion would not bind the City to anything.

After consideration, the motion made by Mr. Garza prevailed by the following vote: AYES: Haberman, Hill, Becker, Mendoza, Garza, Naylor; NAYS: Hilliard, Trevino, Gatti; ABSENT: None.

Mrs. W. S. Hamlin, President of the San Antonio Conservation Society, read a prepared statement in opposition to the San Antonio Ranch New Town Project. (A copy of her statement is included with the papers of this meeting.)

Mrs. David Root, President of the League of Women Voters, read a prepared statement opposing San Antonio Ranch New Town Project because of its location above the Edwards Aquifer. (A copy of her statement is included with the papers of this meeting.)

Mr. Robert Sohn, President of Citizens for a Better Environment, spoke in opposition to the San Antonio Ranch Project. He expressed the feeling that, as a citizen, he is not given an opportunity to have an input into the considerations. He stated that his reaction to the Council's action today is that it was brought about by substantial pressure.

Mr. Becker took exception to some of Mr. Sohn's remarks and assured him that all of the votes in this matter were made in good faith in a sincere manifestation to do what each thought was in the best interests of the City.

Mr. Phil Le Messurier, Chairman of the Sierra Club, South Texas Group, spoke to the Council and urged it to create a committee to study all facets of the New Town Project. He suggested that the committee include citizen groups, such as the Sierra Club and Citizens for a Better Environment.

Mr. Bob Honts, a member of Christian, Miller and Honts, stated that his firm is pleased to have the opportunity to continue its efforts. He reviewed some of the history of the San Antonio Ranch Project and made reference to various hearings and also gave assurance of in depth studies to assure that pollution of the Edwards Aquifer does not occur. He offered to continue complete cooperation with all representatives of the City as well as all other interested groups.

Mr. Herb Parks, 7134 Blanco Road, spoke in favor of the New Town Project and expressed confidence in the project and in the developers.

Mr. Calvin Thorp, Kelly Air Force Base, spoke in favor of the New Town Project.

CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

Mr. Raul Rodriguez, 719 Delgado, read a petition requesting the City to cease cooperating with the United Fund and to notify City employees that they are not obligated to donate to the United Fund. He objected to tactics used by the United Fund toward the House of Neighborly Service. (A copy of this petition is filed with the papers of this meeting.)

Mr. John Hildebrand, 402 Wharton, presented to the Council a copy of a book on the subject of property taxes and asked that each Councilman find time to read it.

Mr. J. Arnold Uzzell, 514 Golden Crown, spoke to the Council regarding property he owns adjoining the bridge recently built on Sulphur Springs Road. While building the bridge, the City had used his property to store materials and equipment. He asked that the City pay him for the use of his property on the same basis that the City charges with its parking meters.

Mayor Gatti advised Mr. Uzzell that the City Manager would give him a report on the matter at which time he would be contacted further.

Mr. Clayton Russell, 1430 San Rafael, spoke to the Council about the annexation of Villa Coronado.
