Authorizing the acceptance by the City of Lot H. New City Block 833, for the purpose of widening Wilmington Avenue, and appropriating the sum of Six Hundred Dollars to pay Mrs Flora K. Adams for same, and authorizing the Commissioner of Taxation to cancel the unpaid taxes thereon.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That the Mayor be authorized to accept for street purposes Lot H, New City Block 833, on Wilmington Avenue, and to receive deed for said lot from the owner Mrs Flora K. Adams.

Section Two: That the sum of Six Hundred (600) Dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1921 General Fund chargeable to the Street Commissioners Department, to pay Mrs Adams for said lot, and that a warrant for said amount be drawn payable to Mrs Adams on delivery of deed approved by the City Attorney.

Section Three: That the Tax Commissioner be authorized to cancel all taxes now unpaid on said lot.

On recommendation of the City Purchasing Agent the bid of G.F. Sigmund Press for one cash book for use of the City was accepted.
