No. 438 *MC-900* AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$160.50 to reimburse City Clerk for fines refunded on order of the Mayor.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$160.50 be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund, warrant for which shall be made payable to Fred Fries, City Clerk, to reimburse him for fines refunded out of the Incidental Expenditures Fund on orders for such refunds issued by His Honor, the Mayor.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Nine Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Eight 64/100 (\$9768.64) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund, warrant to be made payable to County Judge of Bexar County, Tex, to pay the City's portion for the maintenance of the R.B.Green Memorial Hospital, Live Oak Farm, etc, as follows:

MC-902 AN ORDINANCE

No. 440

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Thirty Five Dollars (\$35.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is, hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund to pay Julius Freimuth, for moving two palms from Avenue D to Brackenridge Park.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.
