## AN ORDINANCE

Directing the payment of salaries and wages for services rendered by officers and employes of the City for the month of April, 1918, and appropriating money therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated for the payment of officers and employes for the several accounts and departments as specified in the attached schedule as salaries or wages for services rendered to the City during the month of April, 1918 as per pay rolls:
