A RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO COOPERATE WITH THE HOUSING AUTHORITY TO FURNISH CERTAIN MUNICIPAL AID FOR THE PROJECT AND TO ELIMINATE UNSAFE AND INSANITARY DWELLING UNITS.

1. WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio proposes to develop and administer a low rent housing Project in the City, which will consist of dwelling units described in the Project which includes the elimination of approximately the equal number of unsafe or insanitary dwelling units; and,
2. WHEREAS, the Project will be financed partly by bonds of the Authority which will be secured partly by the net revenues of the Project but will not confer on the holders of said bonds the right of foreclosure or forfeiture; and,
3. WHEREAS, it is necessary to the public health, safety and welfare of the City that the present low income occupants of unsafe or insanitary dwellings in the City be provided with safe and sanitary dwellings at rentals they can afford to pay; and,
4. WHEREAS, the City will directly benefit from the construction of new, safe and

sanitary dwellings for families of low income and from the elimination of unsafe or insanitary dwellings within the City; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

5. That the property of the Authority is property used for essential public and governmental purposes and the City will not levy, impose nor charge any taxes or special assessments or charges against the Project or the Authority, and the City will supply municipal services and facilities for the Project and the tenants thereof, of the same character as those furnished to other dwellings and their inhabitants in the City, including but not limited to fire, police and health protection and services, fire hydrants, sewer service, collection and disposal of garbage, playground facilities, street lighting on the public streets within the Project and on the boundaries thereof, and the City will maintain in good repair and working order the Municipal utilities and facilities provided by it for the use and benefit of the Project and the tenants thereof, and the City will maintain the streets, roads and alleys which are adjacent to or leading to or within the Project in good repair.

6. In order to protect the residential character of the Project and the neighborhood, the City agrees that it will zone or rezone for residential purposes the area within the boundaries of the Project.

7. The City agrees to vacate, in accordance with law, all public streets, alleys and roadways within the boundaries of the Project except such streets as the City Planning Commission of the City of San Antonio may determine to be necessary for arterial traffic.

8. The Authority agrees to dedicate and the City agrees to accept for municipal purposes land to be acquired by the Authority and used for streets and alleys within the boundaries of the Project for the purpose of providing ingress thereto and egress therefrom. The cost of laying out, grading, paving, and maintaining such streets and alleys shall be financed by the City without cost to the Authority.

9. The City agrees to waive building and inspection fees which would be charged if the Project were constructed by private individuals.

10. The City consents to the assignment of this agreement for the protection of the holders of any bonds issued to aid in financing the development of the Projects, but the City accepts no responsibility for the payment of interest or principal of said bonds.

11. The City will eliminate unsafe or insanitary dwelling units of a number equal at least to the number of new dwelling units provided in the Project, less the number of such units eliminated from the site of the Project by the Authority.
