

JUNE 21, 1945

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER OF THE CITY HALL, AT TEN O'CLOCK, A. M. , ON THURSDAY, JUNE 21, 1945.

PRESENT: Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, Anderson; Mayor Mauermann presiding.

The Clerk read the minutes of the Regular Meeting of June 14, together with those of the Recessed Meetings of June 19 and 20, which minutes were approved as read, on motion of Commissioner Steffler, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, Anderson.

The following petitions were presented and referred:

To Commissioner of Taxation: Petition of Salvation Army asking exemption from taxes of property at 115 Woodlawn Ave.

To Commissioner of Streets: Petition of Mr. U. L. Murphy, et al, asking the opening of Moberly St. between Warner Ave. and the railroad.

To Commissioner of Fire and Police: Petitions (three) of Jack Neal, Inc., for permission to make gasoline installations at 304 Avenue E, 2145 E. Houston St., and 1726 N. St. Mary's St.

To City Engineer: Petition of Mr. Alexander Brenner asking approval of plat of subdivision of Tract No. 234, Harlandale Acre Tracts No. 2 (First Filing).

Before the vote was taken, Mayor Mauermann asked that the lease authorized by the ordinance be amended to provide a cancellation clause.
