AN ORDINANCE 08-202

TO PREVENT THE ABUSE OF CHARITY IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit or to obtain alms or gifts, directly or indirectly, by the misrepresentation of names, occupation, financial condition, physical condition, social condition or residence.
2. It shall be unlawful to solicit or to accept alms, or gifts, for any person, any charitable organization, any patriotic organization, or any philanthropic organization; to promote or participate in any entertainment, fair or bazaar in the name of charity, patriotism or philanthropy; or to solicit or accept gifts of any property for any ethical, evangelistic, religious or missionary purpose, except by such organizations on their own premises; without first obtaining a permit recommended by the Vigilance Committee, and approved by the Mayor, as herein stipulated. (S.A.)
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold a rummage sale, sell or offer for sale, any property which has been given for sale for charity, philanthropy or patriotism, without first obtaining a permit as herein provided.
4. No person shall do any of the things prescribed herein, without having signed, sworn to and filed with the Vigilance Committee a statement which shall contain substantially the following information:- (a) Name; (b) Address; (c) Age; (d) Sex; (e) Marital status; (f) Family relations, if any; (g) Dependents; (h) Income; (i) Occupation; (j) Nationality; (k) Purpose for which alms or gifts are to be used; (l) Commission, or compensation paid to solicitor.
5. A Vigilance Committee to serve without compensation is hereby created of eleven members,

to be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Commissioners, to investigate each application for the permit required by this Ordinance, which Committee shall advise and recommend to the Mayor the granting or refusal of a permit.

6. The Committee shall keep each application on file, and a record of its action thereon in a well bound book, subject to inspection by any person at any reasonable time.

7. Upon recommendation of the Vigilance Committee to grant the permit, the Mayor may, if he concurs in the conclusion of the Vililance Committee, grant a permit to the applicant to do the things permitted.

8. Said permit shall be dated and signed by the Mayor and shall be valid during the term specified, not to exceed one year after the date of the issuance.

9. The permit herein described shall be inscribed upon a card, which shall be endorsed in red letters: "NOT TRANSFERABLE" and "NOT GOOD ON A STREET OR IN A PUBLIC PLACE".

10. Upon the expiration of the permit, application may be made for another permit, which may be granted upon the fulfillment by the applicant of the conditions herein specified.

11. The permit herein prescribed, shall be non-transferable; and may be revoked at any time by the Mayor, and shall never operate as a grant of a privilege, or mature into a right.

12. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS.

13. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to grant a right to solicit (or beg upon the streets or in public places of the City of San Antonio.

14. This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances of the City of San Antonio relative to the same subject matter, except where there is an irreconcilable conflict between this Ordinance and any Ordinance heretofore passed, then the former Ordinance shall be repealed to the extent of the conflict.

AN ORDINANCE 08-203

REGULATING THE SOLICITATION FOR ADVERTISEMENTS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit advertising, or to sell or offer to sell subscription contracts for any magazine, book or periodical within the City of San Antonio without first securing a permit from the Mayor as herein provided.

2. Any person who shall solicit, sell or offer for sale any subscription, or contract for any advertisement, book or periodical shall make, sign and swear to a statement which shall be filed with the Vigilance Committee, which shall contain substantially the following information:- (a) Date; (b) Name of Solicitor; (c) Address of Solicitor; (d) Name of Principal; (e) Address of Principal.

3. The Committee shall keep each application on file, and a record of its action thereon in a well bound book, subject to inspection by any person at any reasonable time.

4. Upon the recommendation of the Vigilance Committee to grant the permit, the Mayor may, if he concurs in the conclusion of the Vigilance Committee, grant a permit to the applicant to do the things permitted.

5. Said permit shall be dated and signed by the Mayor and shall be valid during the term specified, not to exceed one year after the date of the issuance.

6. The permit herein described shall be inscribed upon a card, which shall be endorsed in red letters; "NOT TRANSFERABLE" and "NOT GOOD ON A STREET OR IN A PUBLIC PLACE."

7. Upon the expiration of the permit, application may be made for another permit, which may be granted upon the fulfillment by the applicant of the conditions herein specified.

8. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to grant a right to solicit or beg upon the streets or in public places of the City of San Antonio.

9. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS.

10. This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other Ordinances of the City of San Antonio relative to the same subject matter, except where there is an irreconcilable conflict between this Ordinance and any Ordinances heretofore passed, then the former Ordinance shall be repealed to the extent of the conflict.
