MONDAY, OCTOBER 1st, A. D. 1923. 4 P. M.

PRESENT: Honorable John W. Tobin, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners, Bushick, Steffler, Wright, Absent, Lambert.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$40,000.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Sinking Fund Improvement District No. 4. payable to the General Sinking Fund, to pay for forty bonds of Improvement District No. 4. now held as an investment in the funds of the General Sinking Fund. These bonds are part of a series of \$221,000.00 issued April 1st, 1913 for the purpose of widening Commerce Street, maturing April 1st, 1953 redeemable at City's option April 1st, 1923.

Appropriating \$5016.65 out of the Sinking Funds of improvement Districts Nos. 8- 10 - 11- to pay W. K. Ewing Co. for bonds with accrued interest to Oct. 1923.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the San Antonio Public Service Company be and is hereby directed to erect and install 250 candle power lamps and fixtures and underground circuits of the same make and pattern as are now in use on Houston Street, Commerce Street and Travis Street, on East Commerce Street from S. Alamo Street to Walnut Street, on West Commerce Street from Santa Rosa Avenue to the I & G. N. Rail Road tracks, on Broadway from Travis Street to 10th Street, on South Flores Street from Military Plaza to the S. A. & A. P. Ry tracks, and on South Alamo Street from E. Commerce Street, to Garden Street. Lamps to be spaced and all work to be done under the
