WHEREAS it is the desire of the Mayor and City Council to keep San Antonio business in San Antonio in all cases where no disadvantage will accrue to the City in cost or service; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that from and after this date all Policies of Insurance and all Bonds, issued directly or indirectly for the protection of the City of San Antonio in connection with any of its public works or improvements or other undertakings of any character whatsoever, shall be placed in reliable stock companies licensed to do business in Texas and shall be signed or countersigned in each and every case by a bona fide agent of the issuing company who is a resident of San Antonio and regularly engaged in the insurance business therein.
