GRANTING THE COMAL POWER COMPANY PERMISSION TO CROSS THE OLMOS BASIN RESERVATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That permission be and the same is hereby granted to the Comal Power Company to construct and maintain a line for the transmission of electricity across the northwestern part of the Olmos Basin Reservation:

2. The centre of the line to be approximately 165 feet east of McCullough Avenue, and McCullough Avenue Extension, and beginning at a point on the south line of the Olmos Basin Reservation at Station No. 94 plus 57 of the Comal Power Company's survey, and extending in a northerly direction in a straight line to Station No. 52 plus 30 on the north line of the Olmos Basin Reservation, the line consist of the necessary wires, insulators and appurtenances supported on eight (8) towers built of steel suitable designed, not less than 65 feet in height, the entire structure to be suitable, safely and substantially designed.

3. The licensee shall have the right to clear a strip of land fifteen (15) feet on each side of the centre of the line, and enter on and use this strip of land for construction and maintenance purposes, but, excepting for the space occupied by the towers, the use of the land beneath the line by the City shall not be interfered with.

4. The City of San Antonio reserves all rights, and the license hereby granted is subject to the Charter and all the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, and Statutes of the State of Texas, which are not waived or relinquished, nor shall this license ever be used against the City of San Antonio as an estoppel, or otherwise.

5. The licensee shall maintain this line safely and protect against damage to property or persons, and binds and obligates itself, its successors and assigns to reimburse and hold the City of San Antonio free and harmless from all damages to persons or property that may result by reason of the granting of this permit, or the exercise of any rights thereunder by the licensee.

6. The acceptance and exercise of any privilege under this Ordinance, shall be an acceptance of all its terms and conditions by said Power Company, its successors and assigns.

It is agreed, however, that the amounts of said notes or bonds, or notes and bonds, so deposited may be diminished or increased, in such manner, as to be equal at all times to all funds deposited by the Water Works Board of Trustees of the City of San Antonio, Texas, with said City National Bank.

It is further agreed that any notes of the City of San Antonio, or such bonds of the United States Government, at any time so deposited in trust by the said City National Bank under this agreement may be replaced by other notes of said City of San Antonio, or other bonds of the United States Government, provided, however, that the said City National Bank agrees and binds itself that the amount of said notes or bonds, or notes and bonds, shall be at all times equal to all deposits of said Water Works Board of Trustees with said City National Bank.

It is further agreed that the deposit of said above described notes and bonds with said Alamo National Bank shall in no manner impair, affect or diminish the security of said bond, but shall be additional security to said bond; but in the event of default of the principal in said bond, the notes of the City of San Antonio or such bonds so deposited with the Alamo National Bank to also protect the performance of said bond shall be first applied to the performance of same.
