Mr. E. J. Altgelt representing the Losoya Street Widening Committee addressed the Commissioners regarding the completion of this project by making the settlement with the San Antonio Club and Opera House Company so that their building may be removed back to the New Street Line.

Onyx Motion of Commissioner Pfeiffer duly seconded and carried the matter was referred to the City Engineer and the City Attorney to be taken up with W. J. Lytle, President of the Opera House Company and endeavor to settle same.

Bids for supplying the City with lumber submitted by Federal Export Company and Petrich-Saur Lumber Company were opened and referred to City Purchasing Agent.

Bids for the Improvement of West End Lake and Park Drive-way also the paving of Aganier Avenue, Cumberland Road, Martinez Street and N. Presa Street were opened and referred to the City Engineer for tabulation.

A Hearing of property owners interested in the Improvement of E. Huisache Avenue between McCullough Ave and Olympian Way was called.

In regard to the protest of Merchants in the vicinity of the Market House complaining of being interfered with by Carnival Shows during the Fiesta on Motion duly seconded and carried Commissioner Wright was requested to instruct the Chief of Police, Chief of the Fire Department and the City Market Master to see that these shows were so placed so as not to seriously interfere with the conduct of business in that locality or with the traffic of the adjoining streets.
