

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HELD IN
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON
WEDNESDAY, APRIL 2, 1975.

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The meeting was called to order at 1:45 P. M. by Mayor Pro-Tem Jose San Martin, in the temporary absence of Mayor Charles L. Becker, with the following members present: COCKRELL, SAN MARTIN, BECKER, BLACK, O'CONNELL, NIELSEN, TENIENTE; Absent: LACY, MORTON.

75-17 Mayor Pro-Tem San Martin stated that the purpose of the meeting was to canvass the vote of the Regular City Election held on April 1, 1975.

Mayor Becker entered the meeting and presided.

Members of the Council then proceeded to canvass the returns of the Election.

After the canvass, the Mayor advised that several minor corrections were made in the totals, none of which changed the results of the unofficial tabulation, which was made the night of April 1, 1975.

The Clerk read the following Ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE **45103**

DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE CANVASS OF
THE MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD THE FIRST
DAY OF APRIL, 1975, IN THE CITY OF SAN
ANTONIO, AND ORDERING A RUN-OFF ELECTION
TO BE HELD THE 15TH DAY OF APRIL, 1975.

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WHEREAS, the regular municipal election was held on the 1st day of April, 1975, to determine the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of San Antonio under its Charter for the ensuing term of office of two years; and

WHEREAS, the names of the candidates were submitted, the election was held and conducted and the returns thereof were made, all as required by the City Charter, the laws of the State of Texas, the proclamation of the Mayor and the law for such cases made and decided; and

WHEREAS, the City Council met on April 2, 1975, in the Council Chamber at City Hall to canvass the returns of said election; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Council having convened April 2, 1975, to canvass the returns of the regular City election held April 1, 1975, after canvassing the returns of said election, the City Council does hereby find and declare the result of the election to be as follows:

SECTION 2. It is further declared that as a result of said election, the following persons were elected Councilmen for a two-year term commencing May 1, 1975:

Henry G. Cisneros, Member of Council, Place No. 3

Claude Black, Member of Council, Place No. 4

and each of them was elected by receiving a majority of all the votes cast for the office for which each was a candidate cast by the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio voting at said election, and they and each of them are hereby declared to be the lawful and duly elected Councilmen of the City for the places specified.

SECTION 3. It is further declared that as a result of said election, no candidate for Place No. 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 received a majority of all the votes for the office for which he was a candidate cast by the qualified voters of the City voting in said election, and therefore, no candidate was elected at said election for the office of Mayor or Member of Council for Place No. 1, 2, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9, but that a second or run-off election will be necessary in order that the candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall have received a majority of all the votes cast for the office for which he was a candidate, and said run-off election is hereby ordered to be held on Tuesday, April 15, 1975. The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for any such place in the election shall again be voted for at the second or run-off election.


SECTION 4. Payment of all expenses incurred in connection with the holding of said election and run-off election is hereby authorized to be made out of the General Fund.

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After consideration, on motion of Dr. San Martin, seconded by Mrs. Cockrell, the Ordinance was passed and approved by the following vote: AYES: Cockrell, San Martin, Becker, Black, O'Connell, Nielsen, Teniente; NAYS: None; ABSENT: Lacy, Morton.

75-17 Dr. San Martin moved that City Clerk Jake Inselmann and his staff be commended on the smooth and orderly election. The motion was seconded by Dr. Nielsen, and on the following roll call vote was passed and approved: AYES: Cockrell, San Martin, Becker, Black, O'Connell, Nielsen, Teniente; NAYS: None; ABSENT: Lacy, Morton.

ABSENTEE VOTING PLACES

Dr. Nielsen and Mr. Teniente asked if it were possible to provide absentee voting facilities in several locations in the outlying areas of the City, as a convenience to citizens.

City Clerk Jake Inselmann said that it would be possible and, if the Council desired, he would make arrangements.

After discussion, Mr. Teniente made a motion that absentee voting places be provided in several locations for the Run-Off Election this year. The motion was seconded by Dr. Nielsen and was passed and approved on the following roll call vote: AYES: Cockrell, San Martin, Becker, Black, O'Connell, Nielsen, Teniente; NAYS: None; ABSENT: Lacy, Morton.

Mr. Inselmann said that he would make the arrangements and have an emergency ordinance ready for Council consideration Thursday, April 3, 1975.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting adjourned at 3:15 P. M.
